

THE THEATRES.

FOR the convenience of the amusement going public we herewith present official box-office plans of the principal theatres, with descriptions and fixed prices of admission. As it is impossible in so small a space to give number of each seat in full, the figures have been arranged running from extremes in rows of the different sections. To locate seats first consult ticket coupon for dress circle, orchestra or parquette, then find row—if even numbers, to right of house looking toward stage—if odd, to the left—then seat by counting in couplets, 2, 4, 6, 8, etc., 1, 3, 5, 7, etc., from lowest to highest figures in the row. Consult diagram before going to the theater, and having located seats go direct to the usher of that particular section. This will prevent confusion and disagreeable waits. As these plans are official, seats can be secured from box-office by American District Telegraph or special messengers. To reserve desirable seats and boxes, the matter should be attended to as soon as announcement of the opening of the box-office sheet is made. It is just as cheap to get the best seats as to be obliged to put up with the poorest. Bear this in mind.
