OAKLAND FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY AND READING ROOMS.

Located on the NW corner of Fourteenth and Washington Streets.

The Free Library was first opened to the public on the evening of November 7th, 1878, with about 4,000 volumes on its shelves. It has steadily gained in popular favor, having now 9,000 members on the library roll. July 1st, 1889, it was shown to possess 14,468 volumes.

The library is open (Sundays and holidays excepted) from 9 A. M. until 8 P. M.; Saturdays, from 9 A. M. until 9 P. M.

The central reading room, which is located in the same building, has on file all the principal newspapers published on the Pacific Coast, together with the most prominent journals and magazines of the East, also standard English magazines and periodicals.
