Members of the Mechanics' Institute are entitled to all the privileges of the Mechanics'-Mercantile Library. Members are entitled to take out two books at a time. Extra books can be taken out on payment of five cents each. New fiction can be kept out one week, other books can be kept out two weeks, and can be kept out two weeks longer by giving notice of renewal. The Library now contains 30,000 volumes and this number is being rapidly increased. A large amount of fiction is already on hand, as well as a great many scientific and technical works; books of reference, history and literature are also being added. It is the purpose of the Trustees to restore the Library to its former position as rapidly as possible.
