**THE JORDAN**

Commanding a magnificent view of San Rafael with Mount Tamalpais in the distance, stands the Jordan House, which favorite place of resort is well known as a refuge from the turmoil and bustle of life in the metropolis. Under the able management of Mrs. J. Jordan, the Jordan House has for a long time ranked as a first-class boarding establishment, its equipments are all that could be desired, the cuisine is of the best, and the table the whole year round is supplied with the choicest delicacies in season. **THE HITCHCOCK SCHOOL FOR YOUNG MEN AND BOYS**

This school is the successor of the Selborne School, popularly known as the Bates' School which was destroyed by fire in 1899. After the fire a new and much larger property was purchased and new buildings were erected. The change of name was brought about by the change of location, as the owner of the old school property was not willing that the name should go with the school.

The buildings are modern and thoroughly up to date, and stand in the midst of eleven acres of playing fields, beautifully shaded by forest trees. The position is an ideal site for a school.

The curriculum is that called for by the Universities of California, varied to suit pupils preparing for West Point, Anapolis or Eastern Universities. The staff of teachers is large and efficient. Special instruction is given in Physical Culture, Music and Drawing.

The school is divided into Upper School, corresponding to the High School; Middle School, corresponding to the 7th, 8th and 9th grades; and Lower School, corresponding to the 4th, 5th and 6th grades. In addition to this there is a preparatory class for less advanced pupils. The object aimed at in the general treatment of the pupils is to cultivate a high sense of honor, and to bring out all that is best and noblest in their character.

Every encouragement is given to outdoor sports, such as baseball, football, tennis and golf; and the school is fortunate indeed in being permitted to use the beautiful grounds of the San Rafael Golf Club.

The uniform is dark blue trimmed with black braid, and there is daily military drill.
