Fire Patrol.

Established in May, 1875, by the Board of Fire Underwriters. It is conducted on the same principle as the one in successful operation in New York City. The apparatus consists of wagons carrying fire extinguishers, ladders, and other appliances for extinguishing fires, saving life, and protecting property from damage by water. The force consists of twelve men including the Captain, a portion being on duty day and night. Telegraph wires extend from the Patrol House to the office of the American District Telegraph Co., and also to the Palace and Grand Hotels.
