It is maintained by voluntary contributions from the public. Destitute lads, in quest of work, are admitted free to the benefits of its refectory, dormitory, lavatory, and reading-room, until places are procured for them in town or country, without charge to either employers or employees. No discrimination between applicants on account of religious belief. A very large number of boys obtain profitable occupation on farms, in factories, stores, and shops every year through this source. Office open every week day from nine o'clock to eleven o'clock A. M. and from two o'clock to five o'clock P. M.
