COUNTY COURT—D. S. Payne, Judge. Terms of Court, third Mondays of February, May, August and November.

PROBATE COURT—D. S. Payne, Judge. Sits every Saturday and on the first Monday of each month.

JUSTICES OF THE PEACE—George May and W. M. Williamson, elected for two years. Terms expire December 31, 1877.

Constables—J. R. Hall and H. A. De Lacey, elected for two years. Terms expire December 31, 1877.

County Infirmary—Located three miles from the city, in a southwesterly direction. L. K. Reasoner superintendent, Mrs. L. K. Reasoner matron. The number of admissions to this institution during 1875 was two hundred and forty-one; discharges, one hundred and ninety-seven; died, thirty-seven; remaining January 1st, 1876, seventy-one. A very well-planned and commodious building was erected in 1875.
