awake, active and energetic body of volunteer firemen are not to be met with anywhere. They are men who take a just pride in a faithful performance of their arduous, self-imposed duties; and to their efficiency may the immunity from fire which San José has enjoyed be attributed. The property of the department at present consists of two steam fire engines, two hand engines, a double hose carriage, four hose carts, 2,500 feet of carbolized and 800 feet of ladder hose, together with the necessary attachments and appliances of the hook and ladder service. The government of the department is vested in a Board of Delegates, a Chief Engineer and two assistants.
