Santa Clara College.

This Institution was founded in 1851, and incorporated in 1855. It is entitled to confer degrees, and to exercise the rights and privileges of other literary institutions in the United States. It has a complete philosophical apparatus, a chemical laboratory, telegraphic and photographic instruments, a museum of natural history, and a library of more than ten thousand volumes. The scholastic year commences at the beginning of August, and ends with the beginning of June.
