

Methodist Episcopal Church.

West side of Second street, between St. John and Santa Clara. Rev. C. C. Stratton, Pastor. Services at 11 A. M. and 7 P. M. Sunday School at 12½ P. M. Prayer meeting Thursday evenings at 7 o'clock. Residence of Pastor, 144 First street. Study in rear of church. This society has a commodious church building of frame, capable of seating nearly 800 persons. The Sunday School has a large attendance.

Methodist Episcopal Church (South).

Corner of Second and San Fernando streets. Rev. I. L. Hopkins, Pastor. Services at 11 A. M. and 7 P. M. Pastor's residence, rear of church. Sunday School at 12½ P. M. The Sunday School is large and flourishing, numbering about 300 scholars. It has a well-filled library. This society has recently completed one of the finest church edifices in the city, at a cost of probably \$20,000.

Presbyterian Church.

East side of Second street, near St. John. Rev. E. M. Betts, Pastor. Services at 11 A. M. and 7 P. M. Sunday School at 12½ P. M. Young people's meeting at 6 P. M. Prayer meeting on Thursday evenings at 7 o'clock. Pastor's residence, 154 First street. Study, next door north of the church. The Sunday School is large and flourishing, with an extensive library. The church edifice is of brick and very spacious.

St. Joseph's Church.

Corner of Market and San Fernando. Rev. Father F. Cogniato, Pastor. D. Kenny, J. Bixio, B. Piccardo, Assistants. Hours of service on Sunday at 6½, 8, 9, and 10½ A. M. and 7 P. M. Sunday School at 9½ A. M. A full description of the new edifice, now in course of construction, will be in our list of new buildings. This church has an organization dating back more than a century.
