U. S. POSTAL INFORMATION

DOMESTIC POSTAL RATES

First-Class

LETTERS, Etc.: 6 cents for each ounce or fraction of an ounce up to 13 ounces (over 13 ounces - consult post office).

POSTAL or POST CARDS: 5 cents each within prescribed sizes.

BUSINESS REPLY MAIL: Consult your local post office.

IMPORTANT: All envelopes, cards, and self-mailers LESS than 3x41/4 inches in size are not mailable.

Second-Class

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS (Transient Rate): 5 cents for first 2 ounces and 1 cent for each additional ounce or fraction thereof, or fourth class rate which ever is lower.

Third-Class

LIMIT: Up to but not including

Circulars, miscellaneous printed matter, books, catalogues and merchandise, 6 cents first 2 ounces or fraction plus 2 cents each additional ounce or fraction.

Bulk Rates

Consult your local post office.

Fourth Class—Parcel Post

Fourth class mail embraces mailable matter not included in the first or second class, weighing 16 ounces or more.

Parcels mailed BETWEEN FIRST CLASS POST OFFICES (Except Alaska and Hawaii) carry the following weight and size limits:

SIZE: 72 inches in length and girth combined (All Zones).

WEIGHT: 40 lbs. (Local, 1st and 2nd zones) 25 lbs. (3rd through 8th zones).

Weight and size limits of 100 inches in length and girth combined, and 70 lbs. apply in the case of parcels:

- 1. Mailed at any post office or on any rural or star route for delivery at any second, third, or fourth class post office or for delivery by any rural or star route carrier.
- 2. Containing baby fowl, live plants, trees, shrubs, or agricultural commodities.
- 3. Articles that qualify at the Special Fourth-Class Rate or Library Rate.
- 4. Mailed for delivery at most Army or Fleet Post Offices (consult post office for exceptions), or to

any territory or possession of the United States.

5. Any post office in Alaska or Hawaii.

AIR MAIL

All mailable matter except that liable to damage by changes in temperature or atmospheric pressures may be sent by air mail.

Rate is 10 cents per ounce on Air Mail letters weighing not more than 7 ounces. Post cards within prescribed limits of size - 8 cents.

Zone rates apply to Air Mail weighing over 7 ounces (consult your post office).

Certified Mail coupons are available at any post office. Complete information indicated on receip portion, detach sticker and affix to face of envelope. If proof of mailing is desired, present article prepared as outlined above to clerk for postmarking of your receipt portion; otherwise, it may be deposited as other first class mail.

AIDS TO PROPER MAILING

Do not use "Township" as part of your address.

Write name and address plainly and completely.

Place name and address of sender on all mail.

Prepay postage fully on all letters and parcels.

Insure valuable parcels except those containing small articles of considerable value which should be registered.

Wrap parcel post carefully in heavy paper and tie knots securely.

Morning mailing speeds delivery.

Use ZIP CODE numbers in your TO and FROM addresses.
