Footballers Rebuild for 1959

The 1958 season was mainly one of rebuilding for the Washington football team. Not only were four veterans on the disabled list for most of the season, but the Eagle team was composed mainly of inexperienced players.

The first game of the season had the Eagles encountering the Polytechnic Parrots. Although the passing of Andy Salis sparked the Eagle team for four touchdowns, Washington nevertheless was edged.

Powerful St. Ignatius was the Hilltoppers' next opponent. The fabulous running of Ron Tocchini and Mike Doherty ripped the Eagles' defenses to shreds. Tocchini blasted through for three TD's, as St. Ignatius won by a decisive score.

After giving the Lowell Indians a six-point edge in the second quarter, Washington scored four touchdowns in a row; but the end of the game found the Eagles the victor by only five points, as the Indians rallied for two TD's and two PAT's! The outstanding players for the winners were John Murio and Andy Salis, who tossed two touchdown passes.

The bucking Mustangs from Lincoln were met by Washington in the next contest. The first TD of the game was scored for the Eagles by Ed Binetti on an 82-yard romp. But this success was short-lived as the Mustangs rallied for five straight six-pointers to take the event by a decisive score. Don Briemle starred for the winners.

Unable to stifle a Sacred Heart Irish rally, the Eagles lost their fourth game of the season by four points. Washington achieved their lone touchdown when Ron Eckelhoff bucked over from two yards out after an Andy Salis to Rick Benadom 23-yard pass had set it up. But

the Irish came up with two straight TD's, with slick quarterback Dennis O'Keefe leading the way.

With Frank Mangiola tallying two touchdowns, the Balboa Buccaneers downed the Eagles by that same margin. It was the Pirates' day from the start, as they jumped to a 12-0 first quarter lead. Salis scored the only TD for Washington.

The Galileo Lions slaughtered Washington, and, simultaneously, dumped them into the cellar. The victors were led by Chuck Modeste, while Al White and Keith Someya sparked the losers.

Racking up only one touchdown for the fifth straight contest, the Eagles were edged by Mission by a single conversion. The Hilltoppers' Dave Kinzie reached the goal on a one-yarder with 26 seconds left in the second quarter. Ray Brown broke up John Murio's try for a PAT. Joe Batiste scored in the final period for the Bears. Joe Walker converted successfully.

Though finishing with a below-par 1-7 record, the Eagles are looking forward to a fine 1959 season. A partial list of the varsity members for next year includes: Jim Carlsen, Bill Silvia, and Jim King, ends; Ron DeLeon, Claude Shipp, and Keith Someya, halfbacks; Barry Friedman and Al White at fullback; Kymond Gee, tackle; Phi Aissa, Jim Masuda, and John Limneos, guards; and at the quarterback slot, there will be Andy Salis and Jerry Morrell.









November 18 — Washington 4, Balboa 2







The 1959 season for the Washington track teams proved to be a rich one. By the time this copy went to press, the varsity had won four and lost only one, and the 130's and the 120's both had won five and lost none for first places in the leagues.

The Eagles downed Poly in all three divisions in the first track meet for both teams. Steve Gray took a first in the high jump, and Fritz Tietze came through with a 2:07.4 in the 880.

The biggest upset of the season was registered in the AAA league when the Lowell Indians edged Washington in the varsity. The Indians' Bill Carter came through with two clutch leaps to give Lowell this meet. But both of the Eagles' lightweight teams triumphed.

As low sophomores the future seniors were met by Mr. Bruce Hannah, who was to act as their sponsor for two and a half years.




Class History
