



Upon a majestic hilltop, overlooking the breathtaking beauty of the city by the Golden Gate, rests a powerful institution of learning.

Built as one of the main projects of the Public Works Commission in 1936, George Washington High School has lived up to the greatness of the man after whom it was named.

Mr. Timothy L. Pfleuger, world-famed architect, was responsible for the structure of the school. The architectural emphasis was aimed at achieving a bold, powerful appearance. The school consists of a main academic unit, shops, the auditorium, boys' and girls' gymnasiums, a football field, tennis and basketball courts, and a running track. Aside from these standard units, there is a frieze located on the south wall of the football field.

Covering the walls of the main lobby are over 1,300 square feet of murals with scenes depicting phases in the life of George Washington. Mr. Victor Arnautoff designed and painted the murals on the wet plaster as it was put on the walls.




To this small but devoted group of educators is given the responsibility of teaching the adults of tomorrow, so that they can become proud and well-prepared citizens of the community and nation.

Students must learn to think for themselves, to experiment with their ideas, and to profit from their mistakes.






The fast pace of society today demands that one learn to be socially adjusted in order that one's full potential is brought to light.


IT WAS A SLOW SEASON

The 1965 defending champion Eagles, despite a back-field considered one of the fastest in AAA history, suffered a season filled with frustration and disappointment.

On September 17, the Lowell Indians handed the Eagles a loss in their season opener, scalping Washington 20-7. Taking their cue from Lowell, the Sacred Heart Irish downed the Scarlet and Grey 20-6. The win-hungry and eager Eagle eleven bounced back the following week by hitting paydirt six times to shut out Poly's Parrots 38-0. Woodrow Wilson shocked Washington by scoring a touchdown with only 23 seconds to play to eke out a 12-7 upset over the Eagle footballers. Heavily favored and previously undefeated St. Ignatius was stunned in the best game of the season, as the speedy Eagles annihilated them 21-0. The Scarlet and Grey, hitting their highest point, made shambles of the best defensive unit in the city and

mowed down the 'Cats in all four quarters. The smashing victory was televised on KGO-TV the following morning. Oscar Williams, a fine all-around player, was named the Examiner Prep of the Week for his exceptional performance in this game. The high-flying Eagles winged their way to easy victories over Galileo and Mission, making good use of Tom Mayfield's razor-sharp passing. Stubborn Balboa, armed with a strong defense, held Washington to a 0-0 tie in a hard-fought and tense battle. The final game of the season saw Lincoln's power-charged Mustangs slosh to a 40-6 victory in a muddy rainstorm to win the 21st Bell Game. Although we were in the Championship race all during the season, our hopes for making the play-offs were dashed by this last game. Our Eagles finally finished in sixth place with a 4-4-1 record.

By the end of the season, several players stood out as








THE JVS AND SOPHS






THE 130'S




















FOR THE VARSITY CAGERS



Third place behind Balboa and Poly was taken by the Eagle lightweights, who were led by R. J. Gopez, Burroughs, Hieda, DeGuz-


