### Pi Paradox

The reciprocal of any odd number can be expressed as a repeating decimal. The sum or difference of two repeating decimals is a repeating decimal.

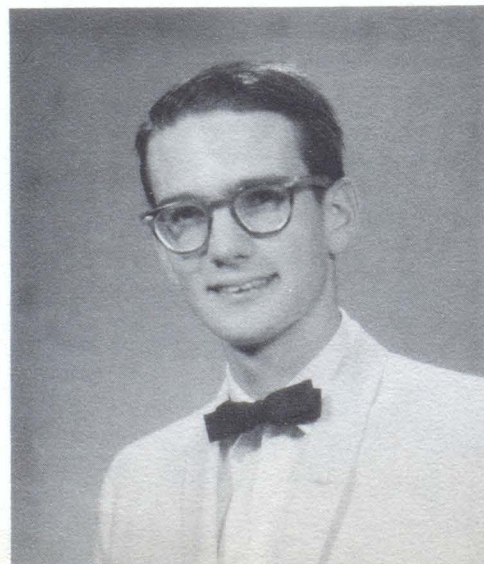
$$\frac{\pi}{4} = 1 - \frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{5} - \frac{1}{7} + \frac{1}{9} - \frac{1}{11} \dots$$

Thus  $\pi$  can be expressed as the sums and differences of a series of reciprocals of odd numbers. Consequently  $\pi$  can be expressed as a repeating decimal. Therefore  $\pi$  is rational.

But  $\pi$  is transcendental.

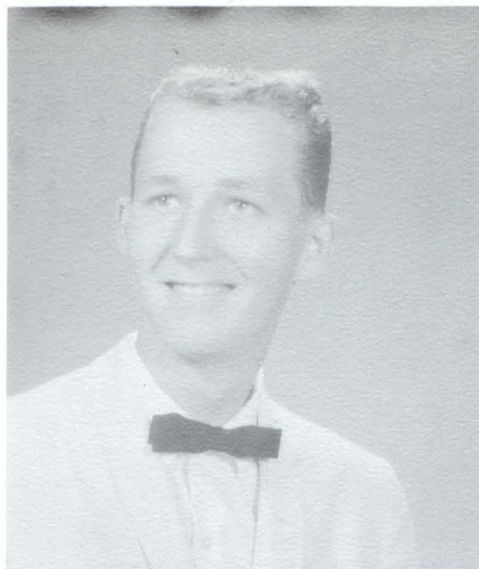

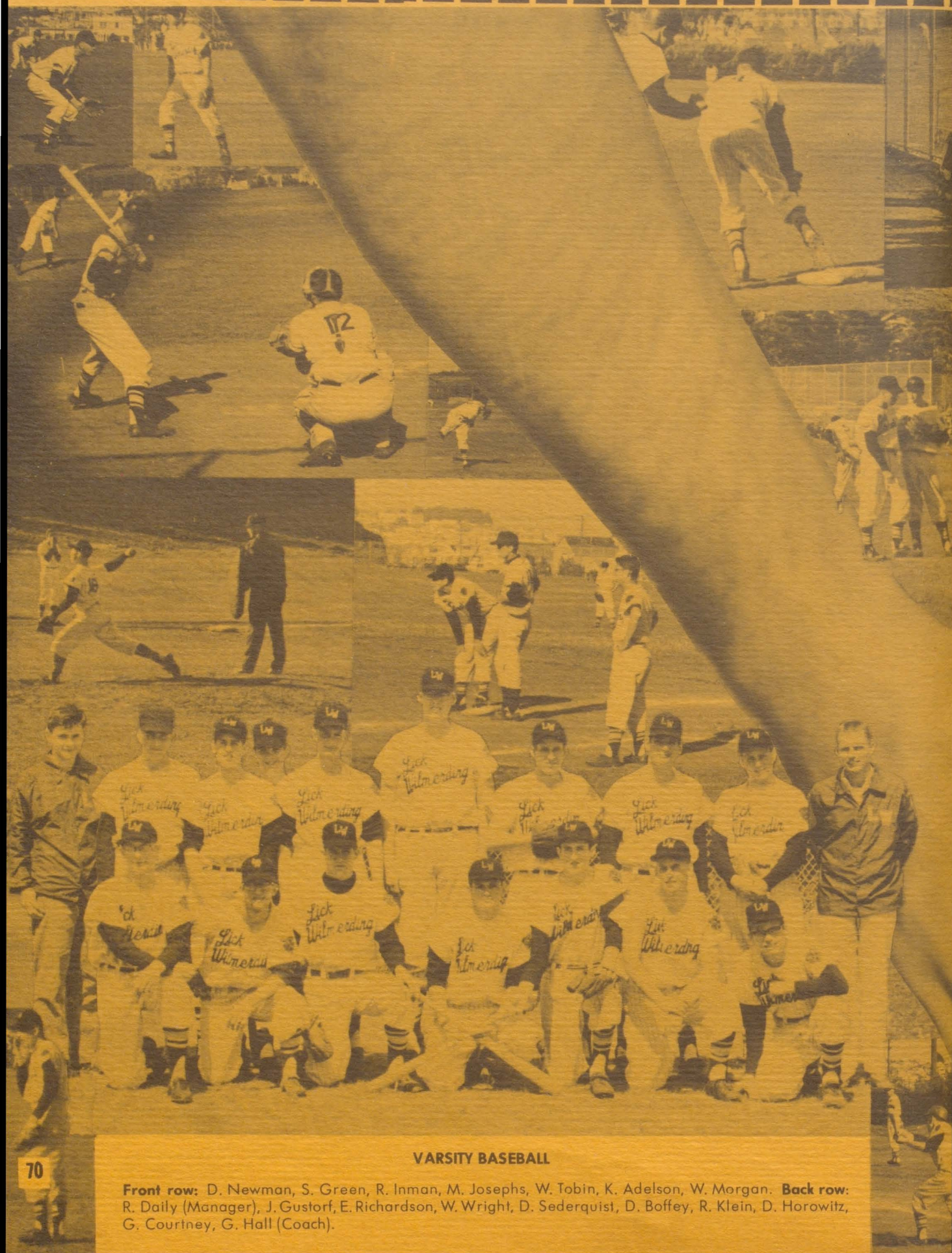

This fantastic high-scoring season was climaxed on an equally phenomenal note. In an unprecedented move the Tigers had both backcourt men chosen for All-Conference honors. Rich Inman's overall average and Dave Ottey's late season splurge (2nd half average—27 points a game) gave rise to their selections. Steve Leonard rounded out Lick honors by copping 3rd team All-Conference laurels.

## Lick Larrupers

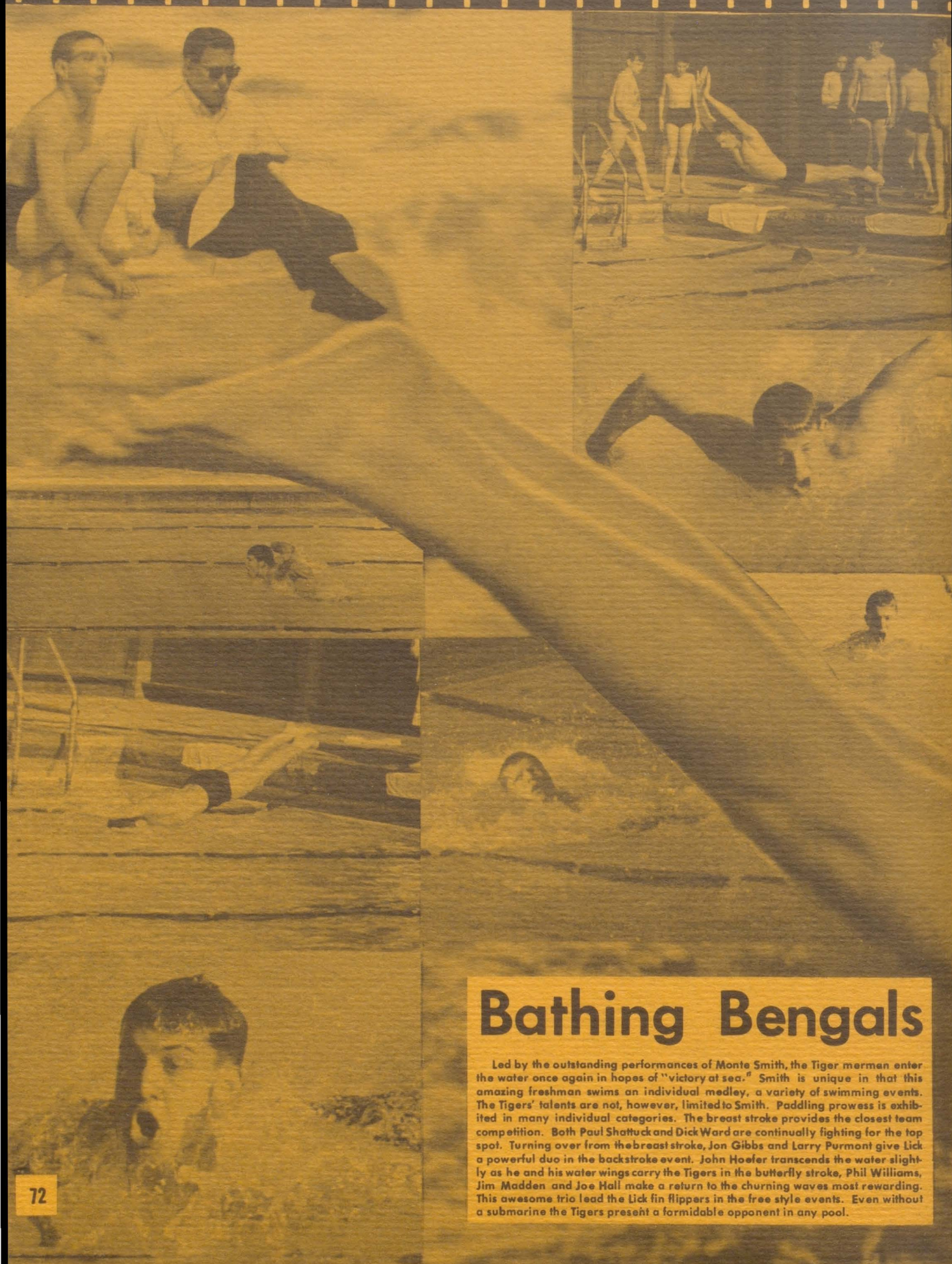
The old baseball saying is that pitching is 75% of the game. The validity of the statement has often been questioned, but the Lick Tigers will agree wholeheartedly.

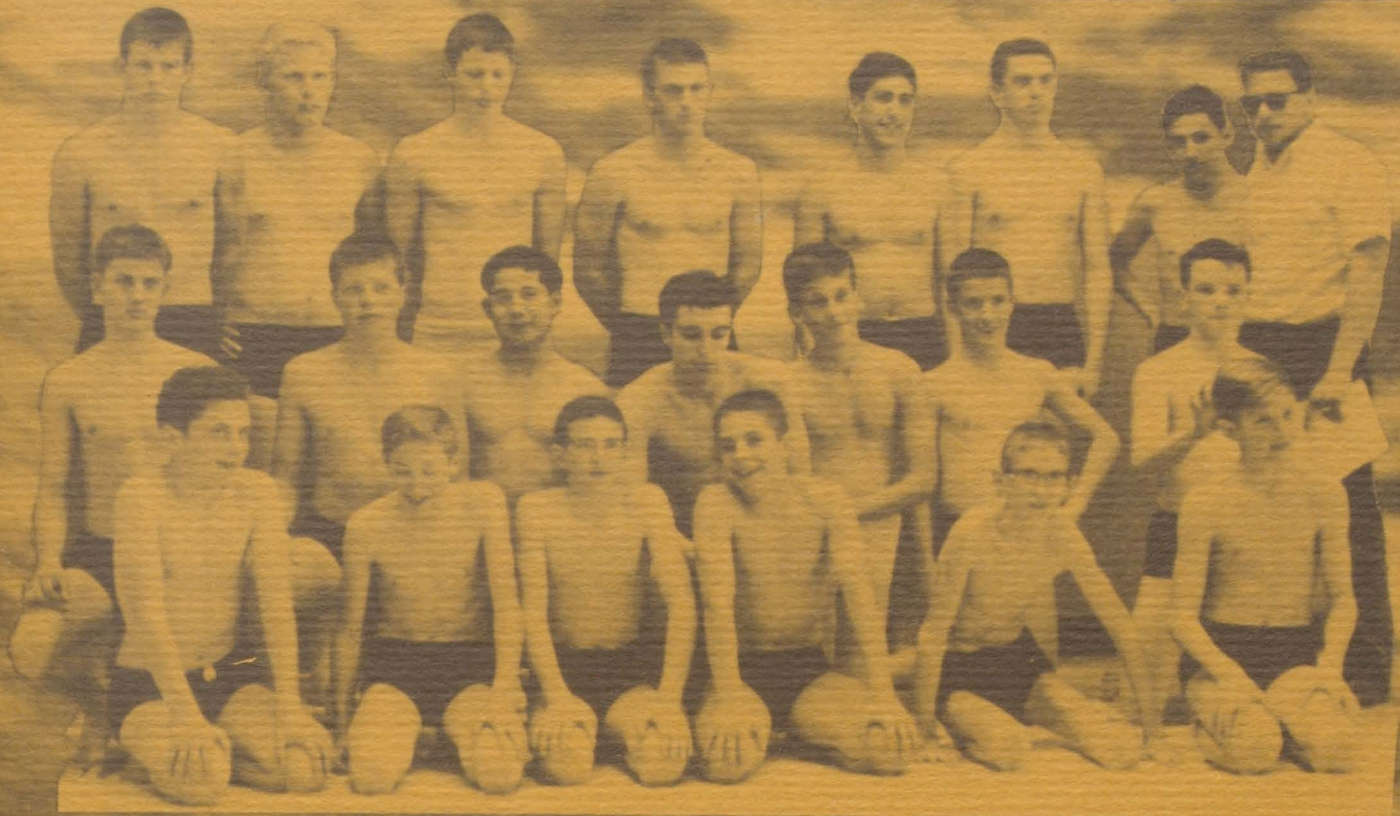


## Bathing Bengals

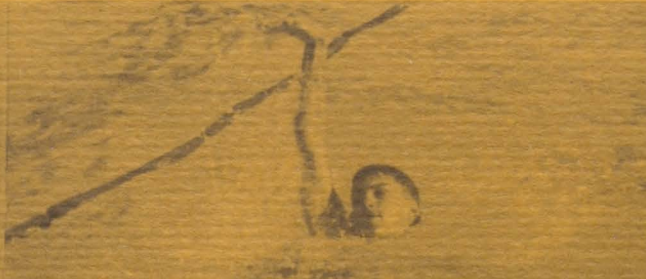

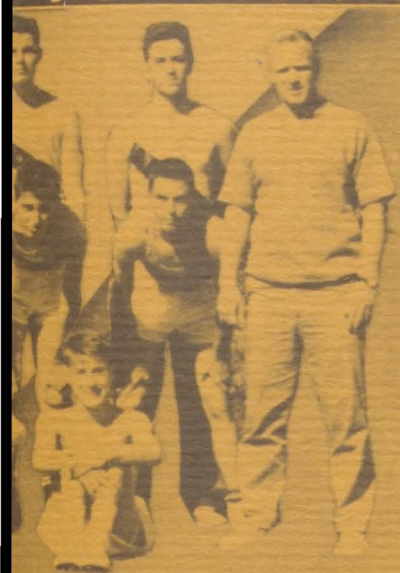
