Towering Lacking height, the Tigers had to rely on their ability to score, and it almost worked. Scoring at a fantastic rate the Tigers clawed their way into second place, which was their final resting place. The difference between Lick and first place was about one foot – the one-foot height differential that made Concordia's Rentner the tallest center in the league and Concordia the champs. Although they couldn't claim the role of champions, the Tigers showed the Bay County League a scoring threat that had not and may not ever be equaled. Rich Inman carried the torch through the first half of the season, and Dave Ottey relit it at the half-way point. Inman and Ottey shattered school and league records as if they were glass. Rich averaged a phenomenal 23 points a game to lead the Tigers'point-making machine. Dave Ottey was runnerup for scoring honors with a 17 point a game average. These statistics do not paint a true picture though. Inman was not only a prolific scorer but a top rebounder and play maker as well. He showed his all-around excellence by singlehandedly demolishing S.R.M.A. with a 50-point performance. Dave Ottey made the backcourt combination complete by being a ball-hawking, phenomenally effective defensive man. He too showed his ability by stealing opponents blind, especially Menlo. He stole everything except uniforms while hitting 40 points in an Acorn massacre. Dave had help, as defense was the other half of the Lick arsenal. John Gustorf, who led the team in rebounds, and Steve Leonard, who blocked countless shots when uninjured, combined with Ottey to make the Tiger press one of the League's most effective game-winning tactics. Four men, however, don't make a winner. Clutch efforts by Captain Walt Curtner, a backcourt whiz; huge Bruce Donoghue, the League's toughest man; George Ogawa, Bill Farber, Tully Simoni, Russ Daily, and others made the Tigers the feared opponents they were. This fantastic high-scoring season was climaxed on an equally phenomenal note. In an unprecedented move the Tigers had both backcourt men chosen for All-Conference honors. Rich Inman's overall average and Dave Ottey's late season splurge (2nd half average-27 points a game) gave rise to their selections. Steve Leonard rounded out Lick honors by copping 3rd team All-Conference laurels.






