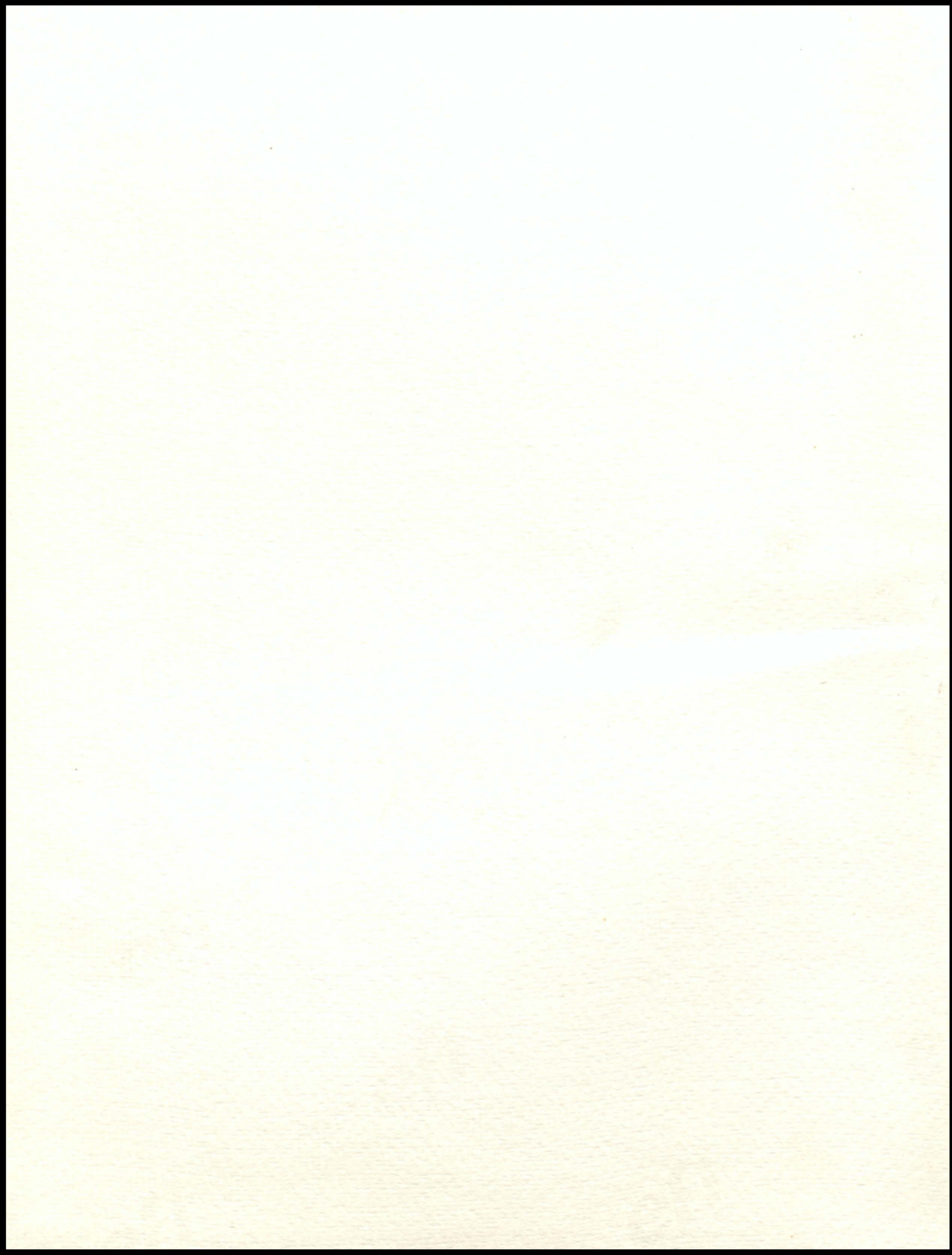

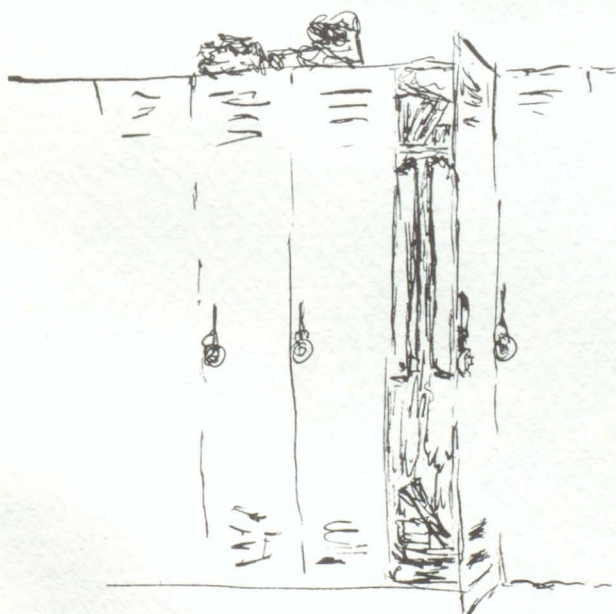

This ends Joseph Perse's eighth year teaching chemistry and algebra in this school.

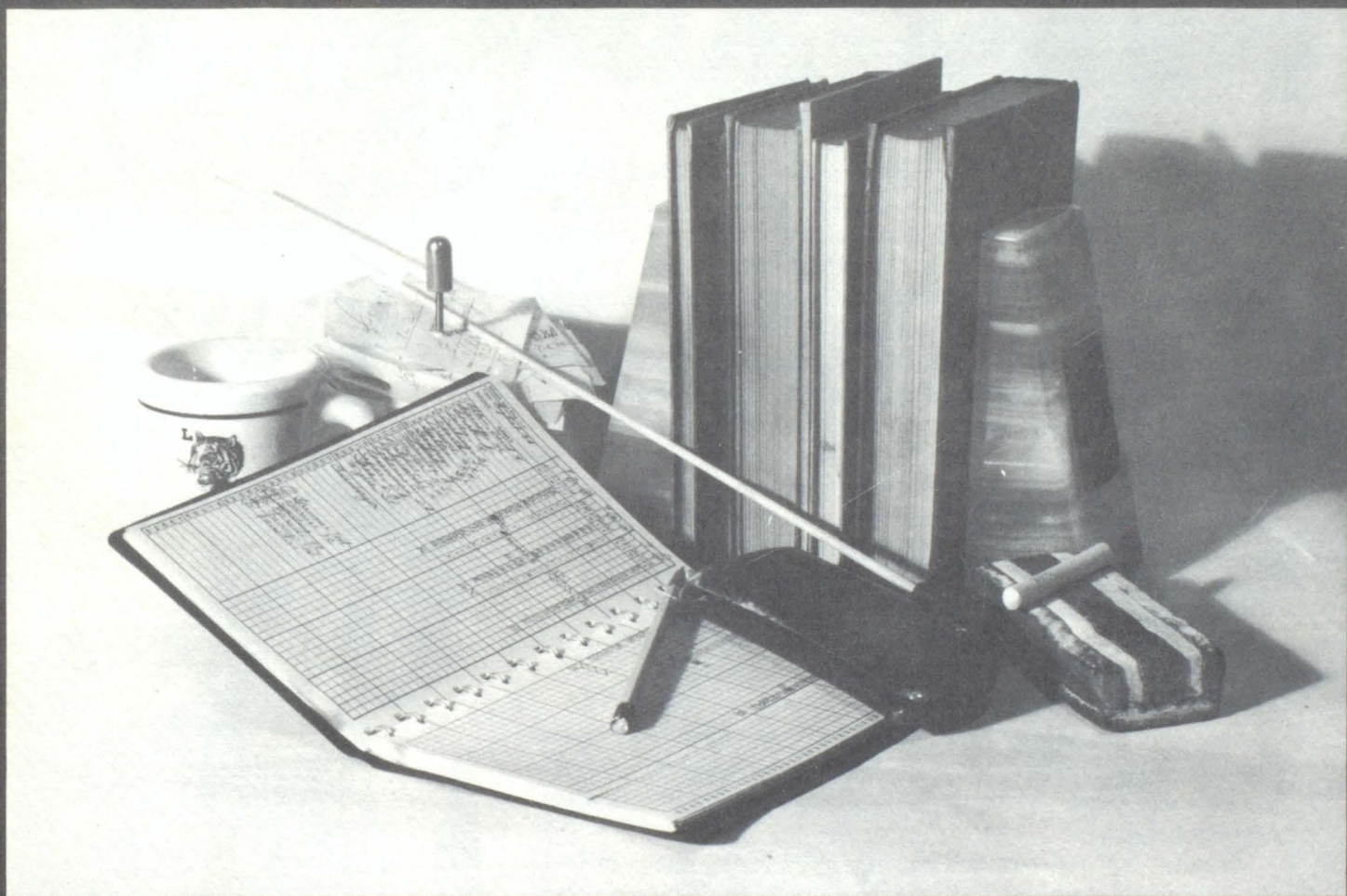

After four years in the service, studying at the University of California, and having worked in various chemical plants, Mr. Perse came back to teach at Lick, sacrificing another job, which paid quite a bit more. It was a thrill for him to be back with his old friend and instructor, Mr. Sidney Tibbetts, then head of our Chemistry Department. Mr. Perse watched him teach and developed his own techniques for math and science instruction. He has since won a fellowship to study chemistry at the University of California over the summer a couple of years ago, and he has been offered several other jobs, too.

During his stay at Lick, people have come to know Mr. Perse as a good-natured, good-hearted guy. Last year, at one of the rallies, a skit was presented in the form of a jury trial. The "offender" was Joseph Perse. The offense -- Persecution of the English language. It was a complete surprise to him, but he played along with the gag just the same. His ability to laugh at himself has made him very close to his students.

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



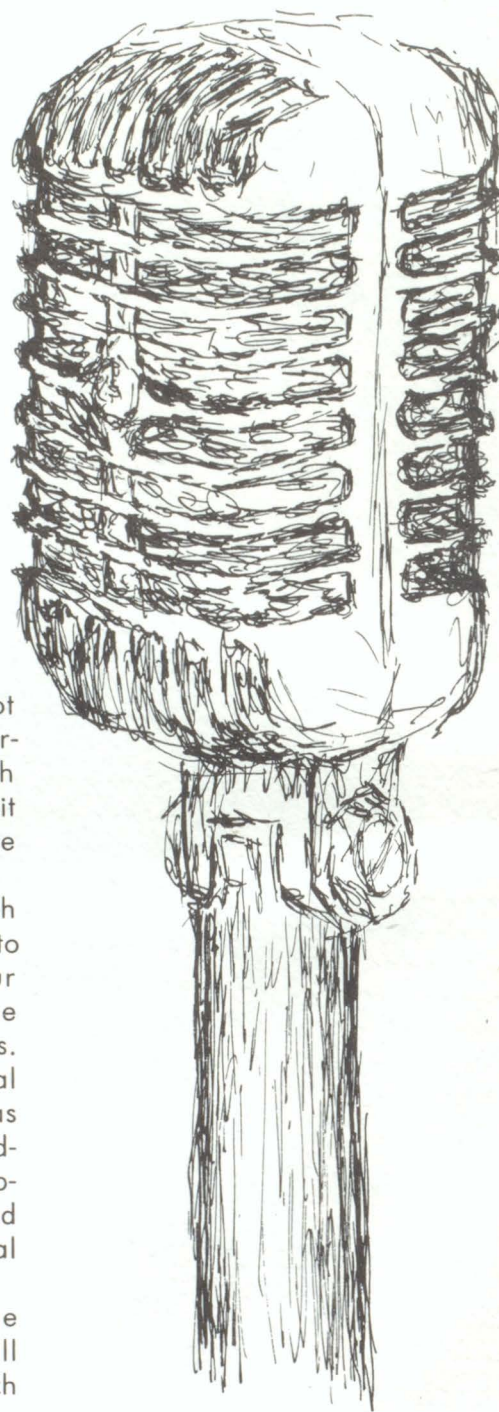

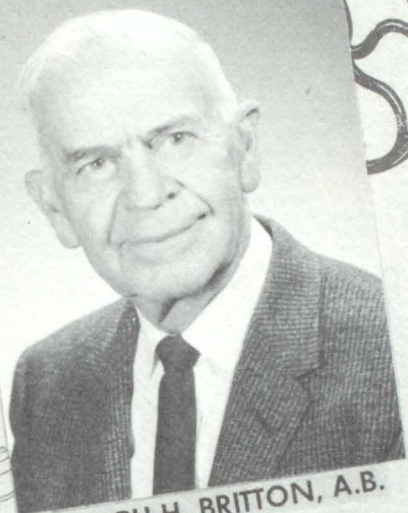
We are proud to have the 1963 Yearbook record the School's achievements, and we feel that every reader will be impressed as he scans the reports of our students which appear herein.

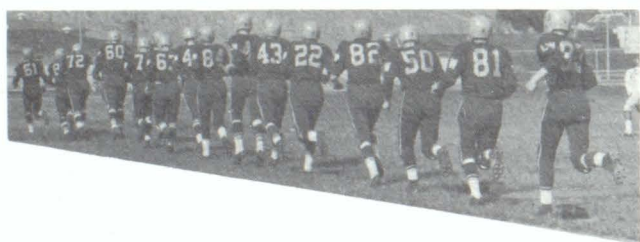
1962 was a football year at Lick. A lightly-regarded team, supposedly "too young" and "too small," suddenly developed into the top team in the Bay Counties League. Under the skillful direction of Head Coach John Drocco, Line Coach Jim Hickey, and Backfield Coach Tony Hobbs, the Bengals missed a league title on a fluke touchdown and had to settle for a first place tie with CSD.

The strongest part of this Tiger team was the defense. In six league games the defense gave up only eight points, and in four of these six held their opponents scoreless! At the end of the year, the league's coaches voted four members of the defensive club to All-Conference honors and one to Honorable Mention. But Since all the members of the team couldn't be honored in this way, some fine defensemen, notably wingback Tom McNeil, middle guard Brian Barbata, and safety Ralph Goodwin were left-out.

This year, under a new system, the single wing, the Lick offense became a potent scoring machine. The men who made it go were tailback Dave Rohlf and Fullback Pete Reynolds. Rohlf, with a tremendous performance in the finale against St. Vincent's (he gained 286 yards and scored 25 points) ended the season with 1040 yards, a 6-7 average, and 73 points. Reynolds played rugged, dependable football all year, and though he missed the final two games with an ankle injury, gained 374 yards in 62 carries and scored 37 points. The same great blocking that ripped open huge holes for the runners protected passer Press Clewe, who threw for 354 yards and two touchdowns. Four Tiger offensive players received post-season recognition, but again some fine players, among them guard Steve Gratch and end Andy Hauer, were left out.

After blasting Oceana in the opener, the Tigers lost a heart-breaker to CSD when Lick fumbled and CSD recovered in our end zone. From then on, the Tigers won 6 out of 7, losing only a 6-0 squeaker to Palma.

There were individual stars, but this was the best Tiger team in years.



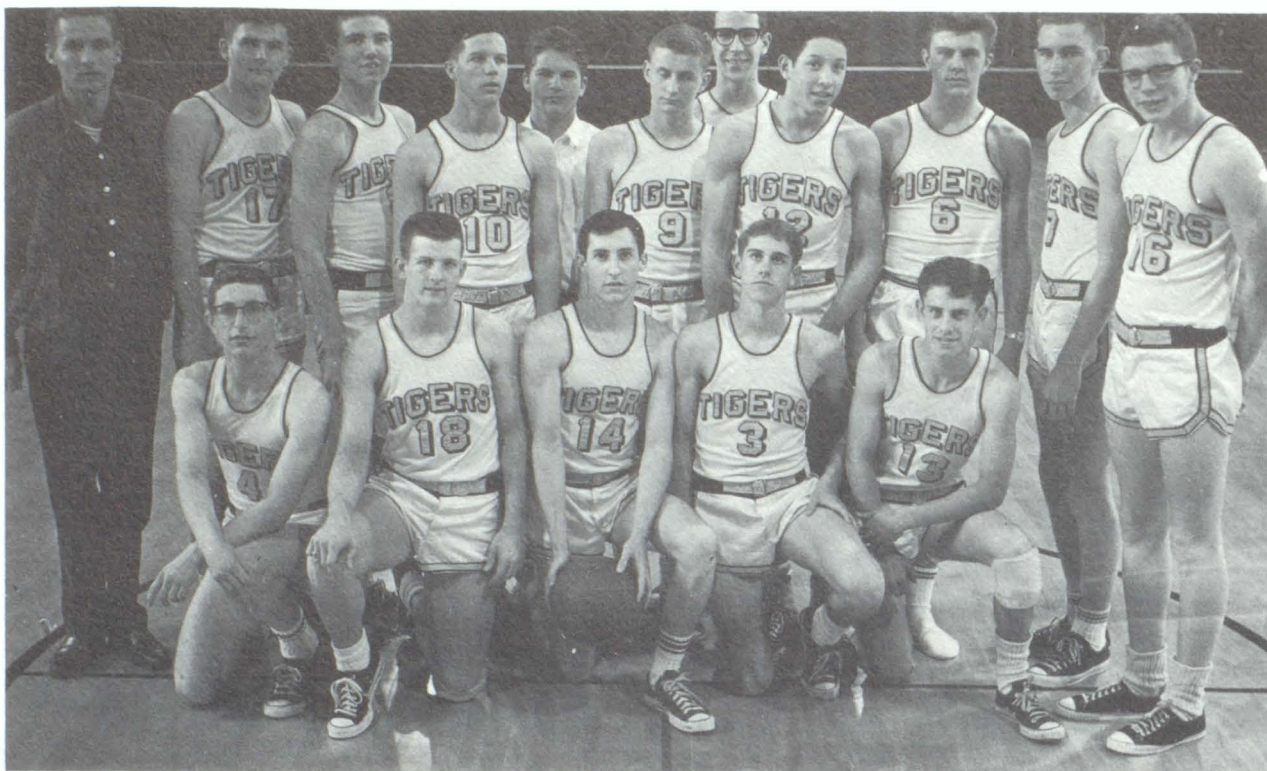
