All were under the guidance of Mr. Arthur Samuels, activities co-ordinator.





















Mr. Ebert, the fall 1960 senior advisor, has been at Mission for two years. He's not yet a fixture.


He attended San Francisco State College and the University of Southern California. His first teaching position was in Ukiah, California, after which he spent five years in the navy.

Mr. Eberthad had the job of planning and coordinating the many senior activities, and the pleasure of participating in many of them. His presence and advise were always warmly accepted.









The 30's, having a more successful season than the varsity, ended their season with a six win - one lose record. We can all look to this year's 30's for bigger and better things next season.


