




## Mr. Jensen says —

direction of Adele Gwinn and Marolyn Dudley.


Presentation of the weird and very successful junior prom, the "Haunted Hop," was the high light of the high junior semester.


The rush introduced the boys into school activities and in turn the sophomore girls were honored at the traditional tea given by the Girls' League.

## Football

### Summary of Season

They won one out of nine games but held the strong Lodi gridders to a scoreless tie and dropped a close decision to the Brothers College for the first time in twenty years of traditional rivalry. The only win was hung up at the expense of the Placer Union football team. The team was followed continually with hard luck but kept fighting although the odds were against them and at the end of the grid wars the following were awarded block letters:

### Sacramento 0—Brothers College 6

The Dragons opened the 1935 season with the

Brothers College as their opponents, to settle the city championship. Although Sacramento collected ten first downs to the Gaels two, the Irish scored the lone touchdown in the third quarter as a result of long accurate passes. The Dragons played good ball in the line and would have scored were it not for two untimely interceptions by the opposition.

### Sacramento 6—Sequoia 12

In a game which featured outstanding runs and thrills the Cherokees of Redwood City took the measure of the Capital City gridders by virtue of a long ground drive and a quick aerial thrust. An unusual incident occurred when Verdina on a wide run reversed from one side of the field to the other and ran about sixty yards to advance the ball eleven.

The lone Dragon touchdown was scored by Senna on a run through by right tackle and the attempt at extra point by Greer went wide of the uprights and the locals were out in front at the half but succumbed to a two touchdown attack by Roche of the invaders in the last half.

### Sacramento 0—Vallejo 31

The Apaches from Vallejo High led by Johnson, a triple halfback, proved too much for the Dragons by virtue of a last half rally. The locals held the invaders to a couple of touchdowns in the first half but Johnson led his mates to a three touchdown scoring spree in the last half. The Apaches showed a powerful running attack and combined with a good aerial attack they had the contest well in hand at all times. Both coaches gave the game to the reserves late in the fourth quarter.

### Sacramento 14—Chico 18

The contest with Chico was a wide open affair with the Panthers barely nosing out the Dragons. The visitors scored twice in the first half but were unable to make good on their attempted conversions as did the locals.

The Dragons made two points on a blocked punt and collected six more when Senna taking the kickoff ran eighty yards to score. In the third quarter the Panthers scored their third and last touchdown as a result of a fumble. The Dragons again scored on a long pass to Greer which finished the scoring for both squads.

### Sacramento 0—Lodi 0

Displaying marked improvement over any other game played to date the Dragons took out their wrath on the Lodi Flames. The Dragons carried the battle to the Flames and would have scored were it not for a stroke of poor luck by an unfortunate penalty.

### Sacramento 0—Stockton 26

In the traditional big game between the two schools the Tarzans of Stockton gained a one-sided victory over the Capital City gridders by a second half avalanche of touchdowns. The first two quarters saw mainly a punting duel between Lyons of the Dragons and Grillo, with Lyons having the edge. The first score came as a result of a blocked punt and combined with a long pass and a short line jab the Tarzans led at the half by a margin of six digits. The Tarzans went to work and manufactured three touchdowns, one as a result of an interception and the third came after a ground drive from midfield. The fourth quarter an intercepted pass paved the way for Stockton's fourth touchdown. The last few minutes of the ball game were played by the reserves of both teams.

### Sacramento 12—Placer Union 7

The first win of the season was registered by the Dragons at the expense of the Auburn eleven. The contest was held on a sea of mud under the arc lights. It was a dull contest as the slow field held up both squads. The locals scored in the first quarter after Placer got off a poor kick, and combined with a line plunge netted the Dragons six points. The second tally came as a result of a fumble and Senna a few plays went over to score. Both attempts at extra points failed. Auburn scored late in the fourth quarter on a drive from midfield which culminated in a touchdown.

### Sacramento 0—Woodland 13

After a scoreless first half, the Wolves of

The Pacers, led by Larry Burke, took advantage of every opportunity to make a touchdown. The Dragons put up a stubborn battle in the first half and held the Pacers to two touchdowns. In the second half Grant Union scored three more touchdowns with Foster at the controls. The Dragons gained most of their yardage in midfield but were never inside the Grant twenty-yard line. Roof of the Dragons advanced the ball for good yardage. This game brought to a close the season for the Dragons.

## Baseball

This year, according to Coach Combatalade,

A home and home schedule has been arranged with local highs and outstanding frosh teams. With capable veterans returning and many members of the American Legion squad reporting for duty the Dragons will undoubtedly have a very successful season.

## Basketball

THE Dragon basketball schedule called for the Purple and White to meet sixteen opponents. To date the Sacramento squads have played thirteen, winning four and dropping the remainder.

With only two lettermen returning for duty, Coach Brorsen had to build an entire new team. The Dragons lost the opener to a rangy Auburn squad. They next raked the Brothers College over the coals and made it two in a row over by outclassing Sequoia of Redwood City. Grant Union scored an unexpected victory and following this a more experienced Stanford Frosh five scalped the locals. Roseville pulled a sleeper on the Sacramento boys on their home court. The Brorsenmen entered league play and dropped a contest to the Lodi Flames. The Stockton Tarzans took a one-sided affair from the Dragons in the second league game. Woodland barely eked out a win but the Capital City boys took the Pacers of Grant Union down the line to gain revenge for a previous defeat. All sophomore girls must take regular gym, which consists of instruction in the four seasonal sports, volley ball, hockey, basketball and baseball and some marching and dancing. Upper classmen have a choice of tennis and archery, dancing, golf, riding and regular gym.

A skill in sports is not the only, and certainly not the most, important achievement of these three years of physical education. It trains muscles to quick response in time of need, develops a cool head in a tight situation with the ability to think clearly, and starts a girl well on her way to a life of health and beauty.

It has been proven time and time again that the girl who can swim, ride horseback or play a decent game of tennis and enjoys being out-of-

doors has a clearer, more wholesome and happier outlook on life than the one who does not care for these things.

The average school girl needs with her subjects in school some kind of daily recreation and the recreation offered by this department is of the best. The good sportsmanship and willingness to cooperate taught in this course is a treasured quality which will always add to the character of every girl.

Mrs. Dorothy Carey, Miss Mary Ann Boyd, Miss Elva Bowden, Miss Barbara Eubanks, Mrs. Ester Fisk, Miss Evelyn Postle, and Miss Beth Hightower, the head of the department, are the seven teachers who have succeeded well in their duties of instruction.

It is in a successful attempt to impress these things in the mind of every high school girl that physical education has been made a compulsory subject.
