














DEDICATION











Seniors '68 are Great

Varsity eleven posts 6-0 season record to win MPL title








Frosh falter after sparkling beginning





Highlight of the season was upsetting Capuchino, 43-42, to break the Mustangs' first place tie with Hillsdale.










San Mateo's C team this year lacked depth but thrived in individual stars, as is the case with every year's C team.












Wrestlers regain title with perfect season




Racquetmen open with strongest team in decades




Returning golfers provide bright outlook
