SM 1970 Papers In Contention, Win Award for Quality

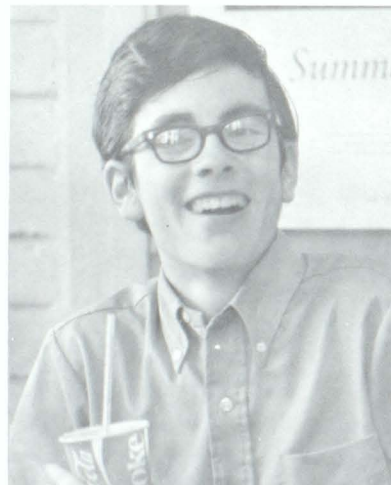
The San Mateo Hi received a first class rating for its second semester newspapers last year as judged by the National Scholastic Press Association at the University of Minnesota.

High schools from all over the country send their newspapers to the NSPA for evaluation. Papers are analyzed and rated against other papers from schools of approximately the same size who use similar printing methods and have the same frequency of publication.

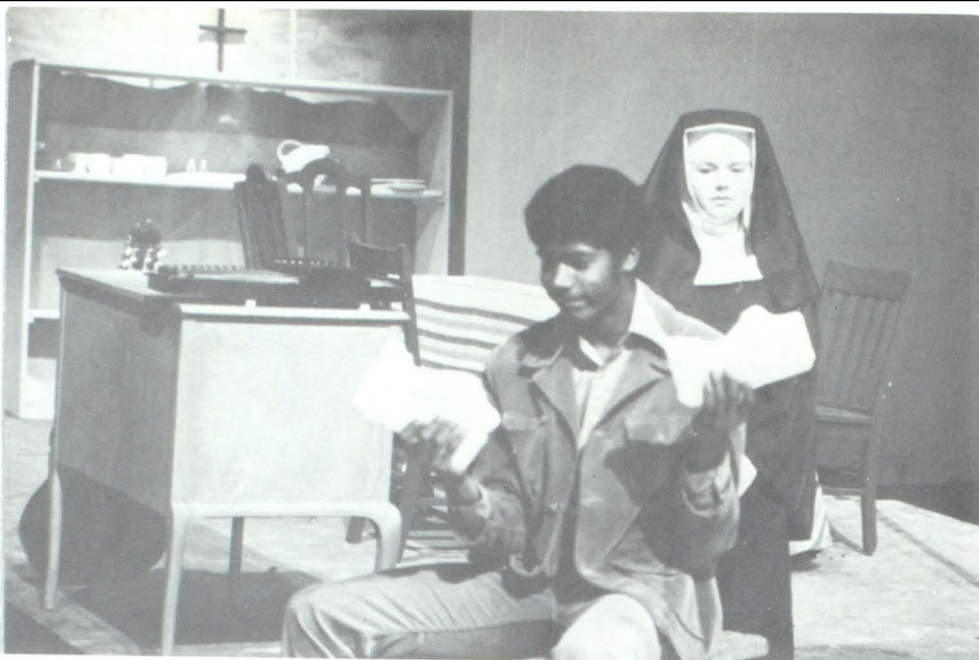

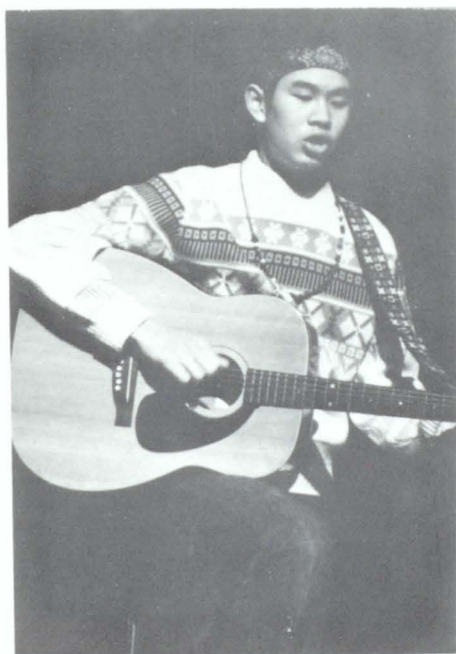

Record And Finish Second In The MPL

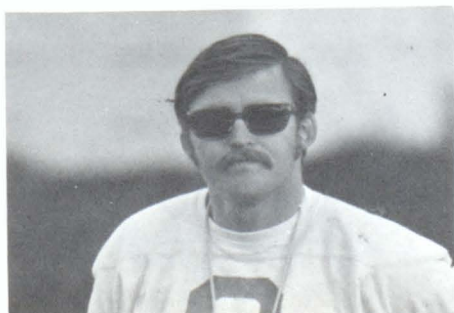

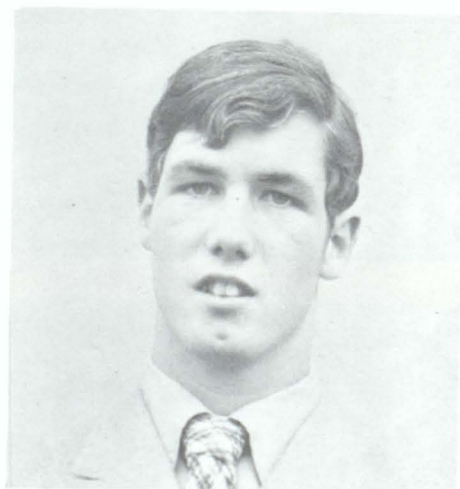

The freshman team took second in the overall standings behind Mills. Great performances throughout the year were shown by Craig Chaney and Bob Seeburger.



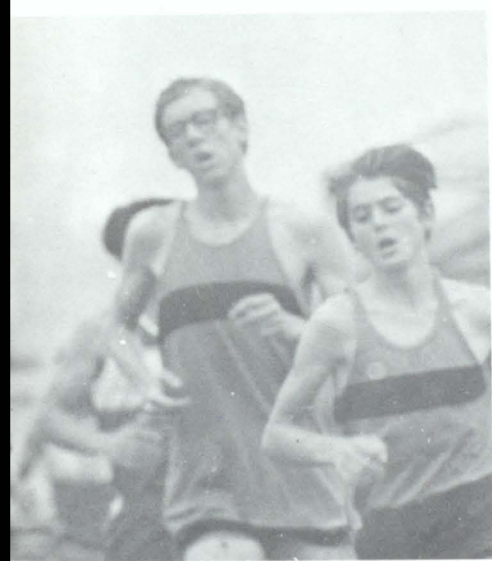

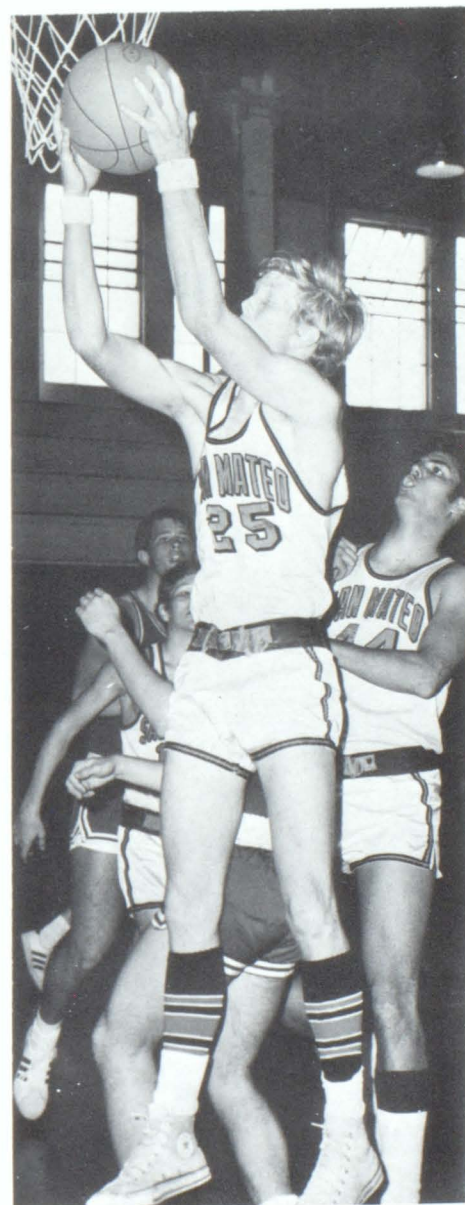

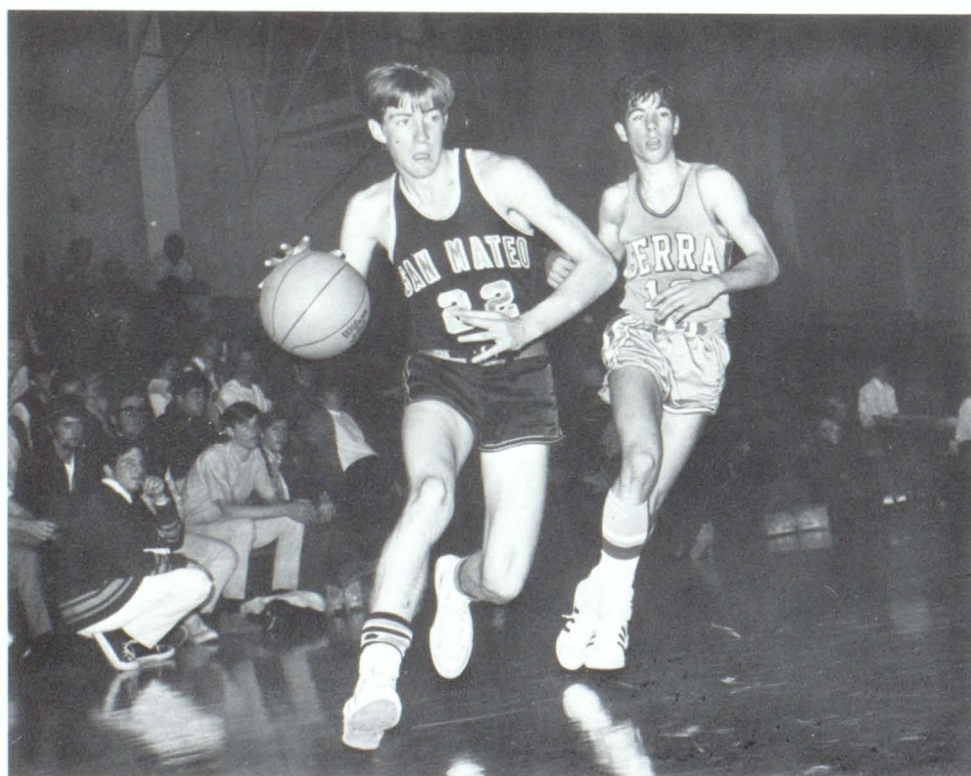

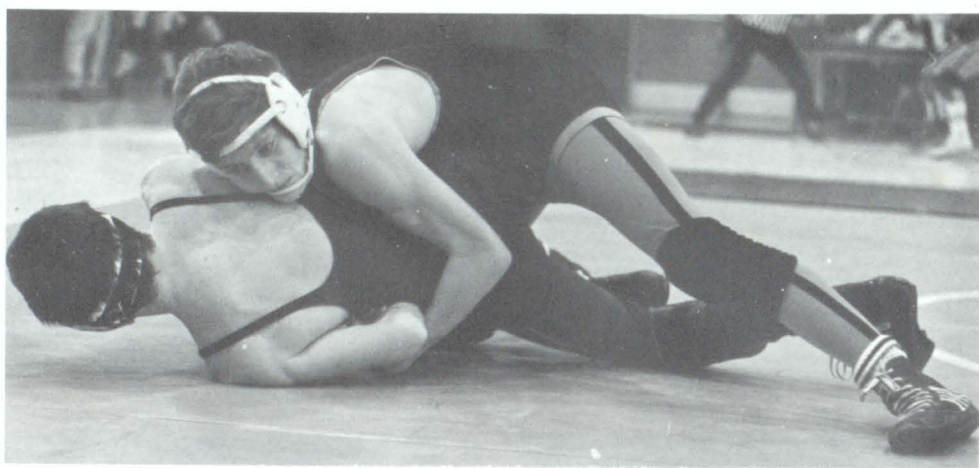
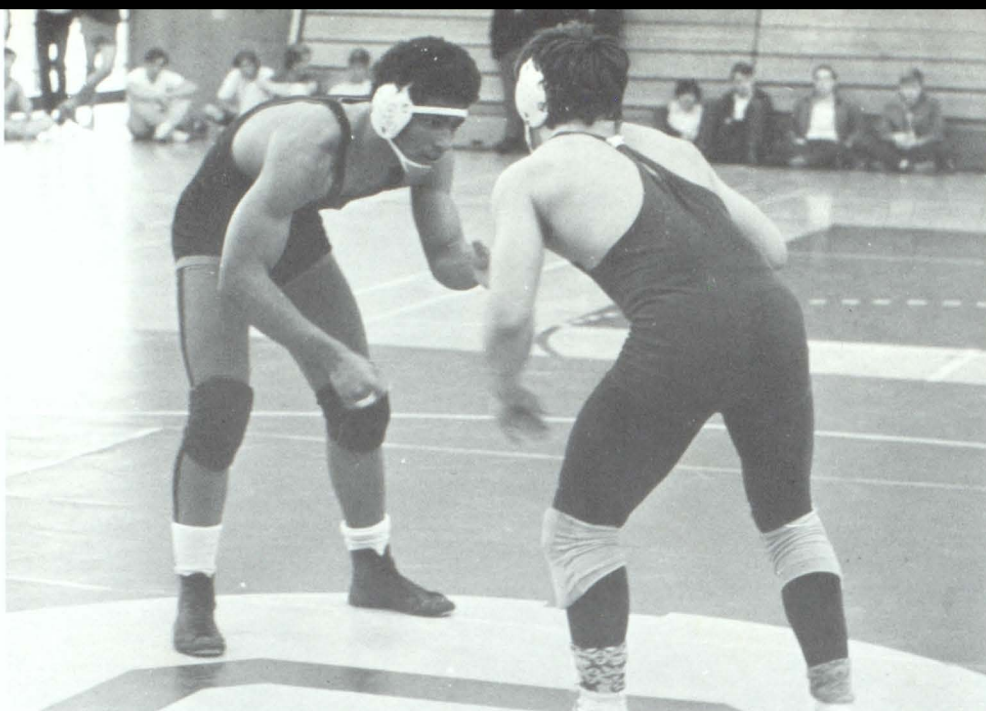


Wrestlers Settle for Second

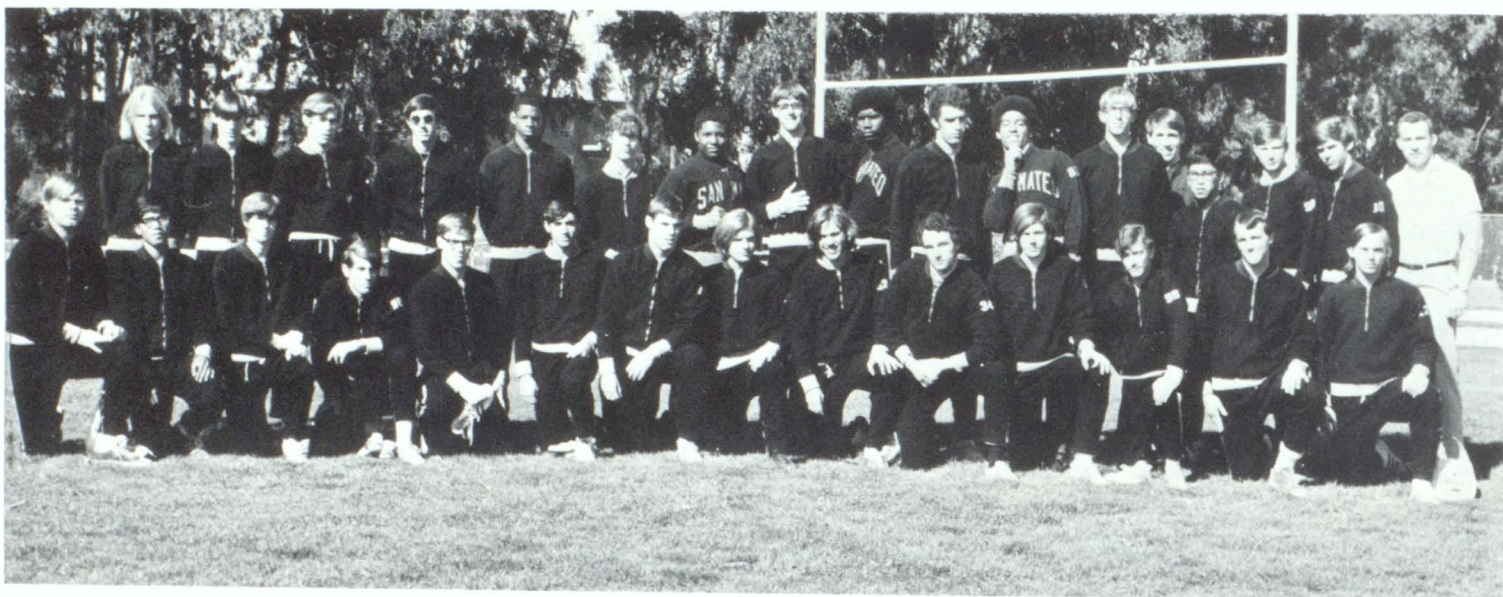

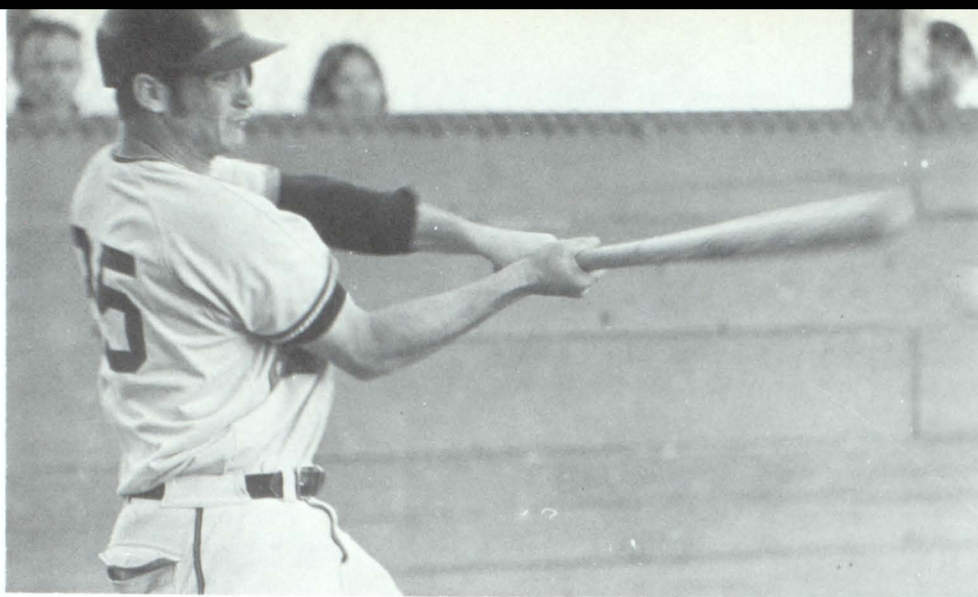

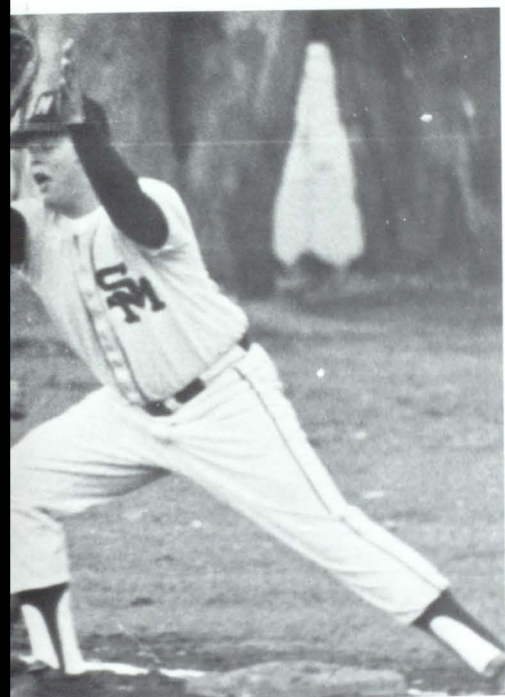

Gymnasts Proved to Be One of the Tops

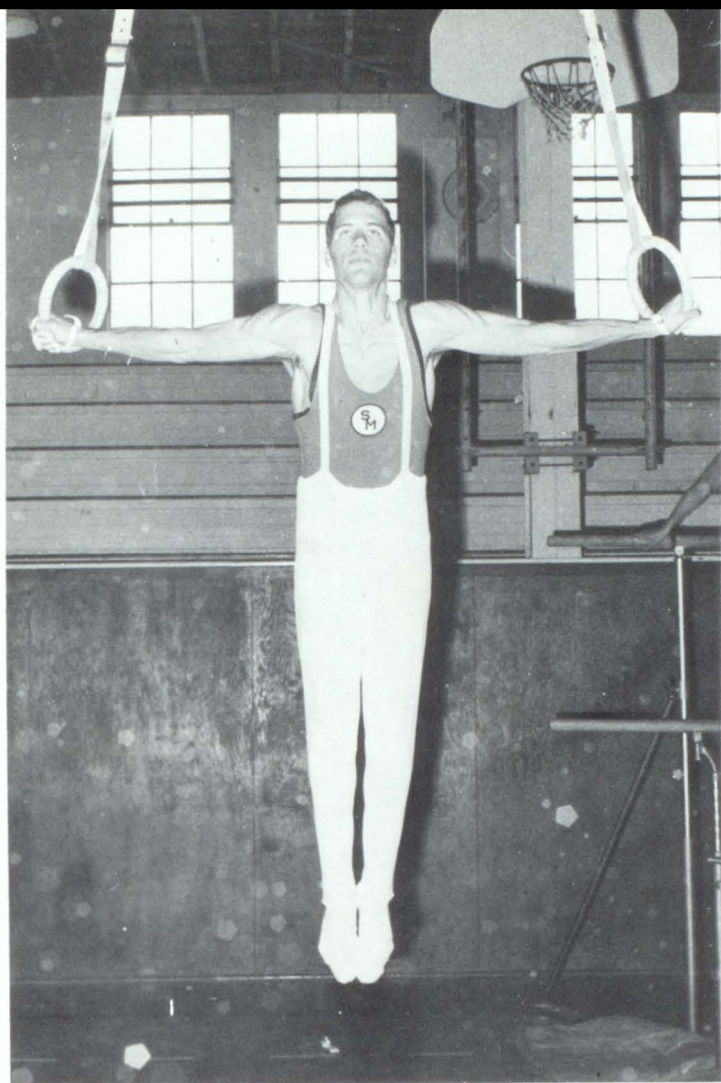

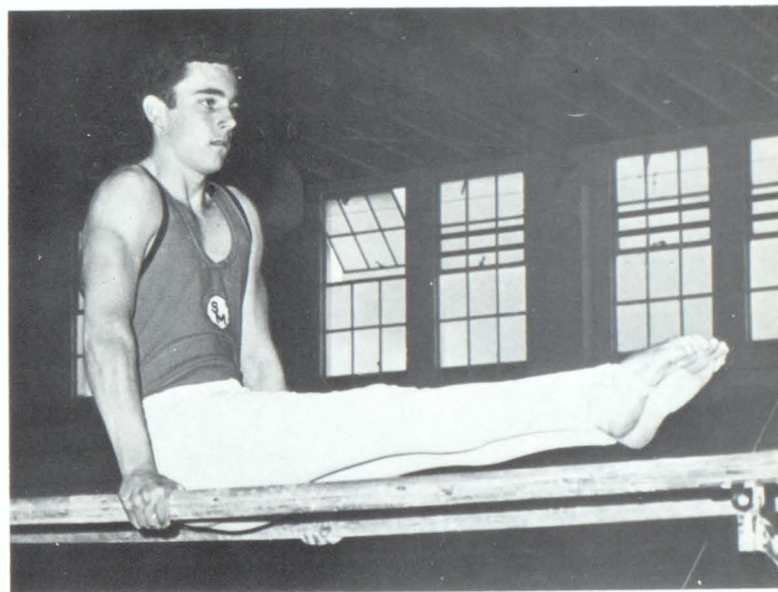

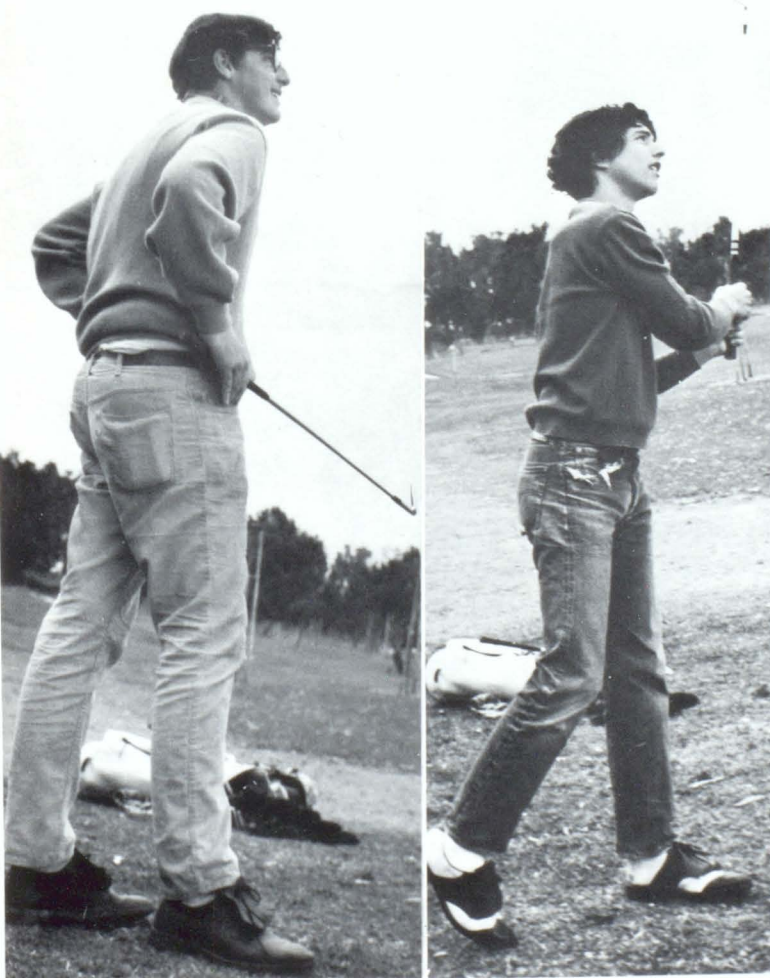
Golfers Were Tough Contenders to Beat
