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# Planning and Building







# Student Leaders Build A Student Organization





The Executive Council was the first student government to exist at Woodrow Wilson. Its first meeting was held on Wednesday, January 16, 1963, before the school was formally opened. This board was composed of ten student representatives from Balboa, and ten from Mission as well as future members of Wilson's faculty and representatives from the Board of Education. From these students came our temporary officers: Stephanie Brown, President; Carole Dominge, Vice-President; Chris Collins, Secretary; Toni Sorich, Treasurer; Mike Boulland, Social Activities Commissioner.

During these meetings the board discussed three choices of school colors to be voted upon, the procedure for electing our mascot, qualifications for officers, and the general student body schedule.

Despite the rains, numerous curious parents as well as future Woodrow Wilson students were present at Open House on January 31. Members of the Executive Council were selected to act as guides at this occasion. They took parents and students through the school, pointing out the modern, functional features.

Present also were representatives of many San Francisco newspapers, anxious to discover just what kind of people would compose Wilson. Mr. Knowles held a session in the cafeteria, orientating the guests concerning the school and the students. An atmosphere of excitement and good-nature prevailed, as our principal laid a foundation for parent-teacher-student relationships.

## Ribbon Ceremony Marks Official Opening

Woodrow Wilson, the first comprehensive high school in San Francisco in twenty-two years, officially opened on February 4, 1963. The day began with the traditional cutting of the ribbon by temporary President Stephanie Brown, while Principal Knowles, Mr. Fernandez, and students observed approvingly.

Students and faculty members became the new "Wilsonites" (Wilsonians?) in an atmosphere of confusion and strangeness. High schools and junior highs from all over the city were represented. These students, the first at Wilson, first favored and missed their former schools, but as soon as Wilson's potential was realized, spirit rose.

There was the usual scatter of schedules that day. New classes, new teachers, new faces, all were seen on February 4. Students had butterflies and were curious to see who would be in their classes and what the teachers would be like. Each one milled around like a bee in a swarm, trying to find his classes, and occasionally getting lost.

Opening Day at Wilson was no ordinary day - it was a day of confusion, strangeness and making new friends. It was a day long to be remembered, to be smiled at, to be proud of, but not to be repeated.

The rally was introduced by Mr. Barnett, the Social Activities advisor. He presented Principal Barton Knowles and the temporary officers. Stephanie Brown, temporary President, then proceeded as Mistress of Ceremonies for the rest of the program.

Wilson found much untapped talent inside her doors. Those who participated in the rally were indeed well chosen. Diane Robles smoothly sang two of everyone's favorites, "Calcutta" and "Sad Movies". Ken Peterson accompanied her with the accordian as she sang "Moon River", and went on to play three top instrumentals: "Never on Sunday", "Lonely Bull", and his own version of "In the Mood". Most important of these was the decision of school colors: Green and Gold.




## Office Seekers Campaign For Votes

Principal Knowles, because of his desire to maintain close contact with the students and their ideas, created what has been known as the Principal's Cabinet. This body, composed of registry vice-presidents, was invited to bring in their opinions and air their complaints. Each suggestion was thoroughly examined for possible use in the student activities program. As a result, student participation and involvement in school functions increased, leading to a more co-operative atmosphere between students and teachers. Through these weekly morning meetings, the cafeteria became a more popular place. Coke and potato chips were put on sale, meatless dishes were prepared for Fridays, and F.M. music became part of the lunch hour in the "cafe." The Cabinet served as a medium of communication between registries, the Executive Board, and the faculty.

## Principal's Cabinet

The Student Council served in a similar capacity as the Principal's Cabinet, but concerned itself more with student government and organization. President Bob Scontrino presided at these meetings, composed of registry presidents. Discussion of qualifications for officers, procedure of rallies, methods of voting, means of student control, and the like, kept the meetings interesting and informative.




The G.A.A. council was composed of three representatives from each sport. They met once a week to compose a constitution and plan fund-raising drives.

## J. V.'s Build for Future





# Ticker-Tape Tension



Each "ding" from the machine has a special meaning for Principal Knowles.

The principal's office at Woodrow Wilson High School looks like a combination of firehouse, electronics laboratory, and stock exchange. On the wall is a strange assortment of red lights, green lights, buzzers, switches, and a contraption that the unmechanical mind might confuse for a seismograph or a movie film rewinding outfit.


This electronic monster, and the lights, buzzers, and switches surrounding it, are part of the fire alarm system for Woodrow Wilson High School. But also part of the system, though perhaps a less important part, is the principal, who is supposed to do certain things in the event instruments begin lighting, buzzing, and clicking. Here's how it works:

If the fire alarm sounds, the green light on the wall of the office goes out, and one of the red lights comes on. The buzzer begins sounding and the "ticker-tape" monster whirls into operation. At the same time the fire bells throughout the campus begin sounding their codes, the tape in the monster begins moving from north to south and a punch makes a hole in the tape which is synchronized with the dings on the bells. At this point the principal heaves himself out of his chair with as much speed as his age and weight permit, whips off his regular glasses and puts on his reading glasses and then moves over to the monster and assumes a watchful stance.

After the punched tape has moved through one cycle and the code has been punched, the principal then repeats the code to himself, and mutters it over and over as he dashes to the wall and looks at a diagram of the campus. The code and location of each fire alarm box is indicated there. After he determines which fire box originated the alarm, he dashes out of his office, up or down stairs as the case may be, sniffing the air as he goes. Of course, if the box is on an upper floor, he is bucking the flow of students who are moving down the stairways en masse toward the fire exits, but this is one of the many calculated risks of the job of principal.

When he reaches the source of the alarm, he assesses the situation with as much thoughtfulness as he can muster between his gaspings and puffings resulting from such undue exercise. If the situation warrants, and the fire department should be called, he dashes back to his office or notifies the secretary by phone or messenger, and another lever is pulled, thus activating the fire box on the street and summoning the fire engines.

The subject of bells was quite thoroughly covered by Edgar Allan Poe in a poem more than a hundred years ago. But perhaps if Mr. Poe were a member of the Woodrow Wilson faculty during this semester his repertoire of adjectives describing bells might become even more expensive. Perhaps he might even write a poem about ticker-tapes!




