THE BOHEMIAN CLUB

Participation and appreciation are the twin cornerstones of membership in Bohemia. Without the experience of personal participation, no member, young or old, can have any realization of the self-sacrifice, devotion and plain hard work that has been and is still being done to build the organization we now so fully enjoy. "Carrying a Spear in Bohemia" is not a trite phrase — it is an achievement challenge, carrying, in addition, soul filling satisfaction, for through active participation come new and often life-long friendships and a broadening of personal interests frequently far removed from the humdrum of business routine.

Ideas and ideals have for all of ninety years been the warp and woof of the tapestry into which is woven the tradition, history and varied color of the club, a tapestry that is ever in the process of weaving, that can never be called complete, a tapestry requiring new ideas, new approaches, fresh and fertile minds to keep it ever spinning from the loom. Creative thought and constructive criticism are two ever-needed essentials. These can come in an unceasing supply from our younger members who, to know our needs, must become

deeply interested as participants in the many facets of club activity.

Bohemia has no place for drones. The first article of the By-Laws mentions the obligation "to render, when called upon, assistance with" etc., but the phrase "when called upon" is not enough. A true Bohemian at heart, when first elected, will not wait to be called upon; he will hunt around for an activity he can enjoy, a niche into which he can fit, without waiting for the Jinks Committee or some other source to crook a summoning finger.

Appreciation calls for another approach. Bohemians are expected to attend entertainments and especially to lend every encouragement to men who may be trying their fledgling wings. In Bohemia no such beginning efforts should ever go unnoticed or unappreciated.

HISTORY

The Bohemian Club was founded in 1872 by a group of about a dozen working newspaper men who were looking for a quiet place of refuge after-hours, away from the noisy all-night din of the wide open bars of the period. The first election of officers was held April 1st of 1872 and the first article of the constitution, adopted at that meeting, gives a picture of the club as then envisioned:

The objects of the Club shall be, the promotion of social and intellectual intercourse between journalists and other writers, artists, actors and musicians, professional or amateur, and such others not included in this list as may by reason of knowledge and appreciation of polite literature, science and the fine arts, be deemed worthy of membership; and also the collection and preservation of records, mementos and archives illustrating the progress of literature, science and art on the Pacific Coast and calculated to perpetuate the memory of those who have been, or shall be instrumental in promoting such progress.

Two years later the present simplified form of the article, as found elsewhere in this book, was adopted and has remained without change ever since.

The first quarters were two rooms off Kearny Street on Sacramento at the corner of Webb (now called Spring) Street and during the first five years the format of the Club as we now know it was firmly established. The Owl as the symbol of the night-working newspaper men was a natural selection, although Dan O'Connell, who first used it in a Club announcement, possibly had also in mind its ancient status as "the bird of wisdom, the symbol of the goddess Athene."

"Weaving Spiders Come Not Here," taken from Shakespeare's "Midsummer Nights' Dream," was a warning that selfish shop-talk was out, which was further amplified by the refusal to grant membership "to the proprietors of newspapers." No apple-polishing permitted! The titles of High and Low Jinks were taken from Scott's "Guy Mannering" but St. John of Nepomuk had to wait until 1882 for his entry as Patron Saint of Bohemia when a nobleman from Europe's Bohemia, a visitor to San Francisco and to the Grove, had a noted wood carver in Prague create our present St. John, saved from the fire in 1906, that now guards the Library.

The following year Sculptor Marion Wells created a temporary seventy foot lath and plaster figure of the Saint just west of the present Campfire Circle.

A year after the founding the Club had one hundred and twenty-five members but by 1877 the first quarters were outgrown and a move was made to Pine Street "over the market" between Montgomery and Kearny Streets. A year later the roster boasted four hundred and fifty members, all but five of whom were listed with their given names — obviously intended to establish a complete camaraderie within the Club. The roster included fifteen Honorary Members, four of whom were women, whose names may be found in the In Memoriam list.

MIDSUMMER ENCAMPMENTS

Henry Edwards, an English actor and member of the famous stock company at the old California Theatre on Bush Street, had been the second president of the Club and when he was asked to leave for wider fields in New York City in the summer of 1878 his farewell was planned as an over-night picnic at Paper Mill Creek in Marin County. It was highly successful (note the sketches on the south wall of the Cartoon Room), so successful in fact that the next year the Club went far afield to Duncan's Mills on the Russian River and we have been going there or thereabouts every summer since with the exception of an encampment in 1892 at what is now Muir Woods. The Duncan's Mills outing was notable for the first al fresco performance of Shakespeare's "As You Like It," an idea soon adopted in England where open-air presentations at country estates became immensely popular.

The third and fourth encampments were held beside the river at Guerneville, the next five in the present Grove, 1887-1891 on Austin Creek near Cazadero, then Muir Woods, where Sculptor Wells created another seventy foot figure, this time of the Daibutsu Buddha, and the return was made to the present Grove in 1893 where encampments have been held ever since.

Early Grove entertainments were largely "House Jinks" outdoors, papers, speeches and more and more music, culminating in the first use of the present High Jinks stage for the "Gypsy Camp" of 1894. Small camp fires on the hillside were helped by a pair of calcium spot lights and as a climax the men at the tiny fires threw red powder on each, an effect that, with added green fire, was developed and became an unforgettable feature as the climax of Grove Plays until discontinued not too many years ago owing to a possible forest-fire hazard. Since then all effects have been electrical including the simulated volcano of 1958.

Every Midsummer Sire after 1894 tried to outdo his predecessor in the widening use of the stage but it was left for Charles K. Field and Joseph D. Redding as author and composer to create in 1902 the first completely original Grove Play, "The Man in the Forest," with the score played by a professional orchestra. This form of Grove Play has been continued through all the intervening years except that the San Francisco fire of 1906 forced the postponement of "The Triumph of Bohemia" until 1907 and during the three war years of 1943, 1944 and 1945 there were no performances.

PURCHASE OF THE GROVE

Many abortive attempts had been made to acquire one of the different groves the Club had used during the first twenty encampments, including the present grove, the latter always by courtesy of owner A. H. Meeker. However in March of 1898 Mr. Meeker demanded that the Club buy the property, threatening that otherwise he would start logging the flat land as he had already logged the adjoining hillsides and canyons.

This bestirred the Club members and especially Vice-President Vanderlynn Stow who, in the absence of President William Sproule, called a Club meeting. With eighty members present a price of \$27,500 was agreed upon, generous subscriptions were announced, bonds, some of them non-interest bearing, were sold, and the Club came into possession of the first 160 important acres in time for a dedi-

cation ceremony during the Encampment of 1900, although the final deed was not signed until November of 1901. The bonds were redeemed by an assessment of 50ϕ per month per member.

Because of his aggressive action and continuing interest Van became known as "The Father of the Grove;" the Campfire Circle was named for him and the present log seats, cut by Forester (Grove Keeper) David Hetzel in 1902, received the accolade "The Benches of Vanderlynn Stow." Not forgetting that Stowaway Camp was his original Grove home.

Another 120 acres were added in the next few years, 77 of them as the gift of Frank Deering, the first chairman of the Grove Committee, but in 1913 it was noted that a real estate development had been started on Smith Creek. To stop that threatened encroachment and any more of the same sort a campaign to acquire all the property within the Smith and Kitchen Creek watersheds was begun but not until November 14, 1944 were the last 33 of our present 2700 acres finally purchased. All the necessary funds were secured by private subscription within the Club, largely by the personal efforts of Land Fund Trustees Henry

Fortmann, John Lermen, W. H. (Doc) Leahy and Leo Korbel.

It is notable that the Grove Committee has had but five chairmen in sixty years. Frank Deering, John McLaren and John Lermen accounted for the first fifty-three, Leo Korbel for four more and Fred Cordes since 1957 but John Lermen remained as Honorary Chairman until 1960, thirty-seven years after he first joined the Committee.

CREMATION OF CARE

The Cremation of Care ceremony was originated in 1880 and for many years immediately followed the High Jinks and later the Grove Plays and, more often than not, there was a midnight Low Jinks after the Cremation. Until 1913 each Grove Play author was expected to include some sinister or antagonistic figure, destroyed as the climax of the plot, to provide a putative body of Care. This was too much of a handicap for the authors; it limited the scope of their ideas, and in that year the Cremation was moved to the opening of the Encampment where it has remained for most of the years since.

The High Priest for the years from 1880 to 1909 was the beloved "Uncle George" (George T.) Bromley and the ceremony was a simple

bonfire cremation with many touches of humor and a varying ritual. The present form was originated in 1923, again from the wideranging mind of Charlie Field, the lake was developed and in 1929 a temporary Owl figure replaced with Haig Patigian's magnificent Owl Shrine near which is Haig's earlier figure of Diana, created for the 1912 Grove Play "The Atonement of Pan."

TALENTED BOHEMIANS

The Club from the beginning has been very considerate of its talented members and for the first thirty years, until the creation of the Associate List in 1905, artists and musicians in particular were carried on what was called the Cartoon List. The early initiation fee of \$50 and later of \$100 was cut to \$10 for men of talent who might "commute their dues" for a year by painting a cartoon or portrait. The musicians were included for their freely given services at Club entertainments.

The Associate List of 1905 was planned originally to supply an adequate and reliable chorus for the Grove Plays but its broader possibilities were recognized by the organization of a Club Band in 1913 and the Orchestra in 1921. Two more Regular classifications were also voted, the List of Fifty in 1907 and

the Professional memberships in 1916. The Club Orchestra took over the playing of the Grove Plays from the professional orchestra in 1927. Another organization of more recent date is the Drama Group to train aspiring Thespians for Club and Grove performances.

Over the years the demands on the talented members of the Club have increased tremendously with three major productions and twelve Campfire or related programs during the Encampment and twenty or more Thursday nights in the City Club with five or six of these listed as major events. Is it any wonder that more than four hundred and fifty men on the special talent lists as well as the many Regular, Non-Resident, Faculty and Service members of comparable ability are kept happily busy? Further it should be remembered that with the exception of some of the drama and musical groups' performances all the material is created within Bohemia.

GROVE PLAYS

Beginning with 1902, fifty-six Grove Plays have been presented by the Club. Two were repeats: "St. Patrick at Tara" was given in 1909 and again in 1934 and the "Gest of Robin Hood," first performed in 1929, was repeated after twenty-five years in 1954. Another ex-

perimental repeat that has not been tried again was "for the Ladies" in 1912 when Joe Redding and Henry Hadley's "Atonement of Pan" was presented for the wives and women friends of the members two weeks after the original performance.

The Diamond Jubilee of the Club was celebrated in 1947 with a melange of high lights from many Grove Plays called "The Yesteryears," assembled by William H. Smith Jr. with musical excerpts arranged by Charles Hart.

Thus only fifty-three original plays have been written by twenty-nine composers and forty-four authors, including four recent plays in which two writers collaborated.

Top men among these great figures in Bohemia are Joe Redding with two books and two musical scores, Ulderico Marcelli with six scores, Dan Totheroh with four books and Charles Hart with four scores and the arrangements noted above. The plays have covered a wide range. Three have been primitive, six mythological, eighteen in the realm of fantasy and the balance founded on historical, traditional and folk-lore themes.

The campfires and calcium spots of 1894 were improved upon before the turn of the century by the addition of acetylene footlights on the two stage levels under the devoted direction of Eddie Duffey. The installation of the pipe organ in 1920 led to the use of electricity for stage lighting two years later. Acetylene was retained for general camp lighting for many years but, after much discussion and a very generous gift by a member, wiring was extended throughout the Grove in 1950 and gas lighting remains only in the Dining Circle.

TRANSPORTATION

Railway transportation was the only logical means of reaching the Grove until after World War I although hardy motorists tried unsuccessfully over country roads to beat the four hour boat and train trip before that period.

Beginning with the early 20's, the roads via Valley Ford or Sebastopol through Occidental were gradually improved and the Grove began to face the parking problem in 1923. Ultimately, with the abandonment of train service in 1936 and the conversion of the railway grade from Guerneville to Monte Rio into a highway, the motor car came into its own. Many members recall with a certain degree of nostalgia the companionship of the train trip but it is also easy to recall the heat, dust and general inconvenience of that experience. Nine

hundred motor cars presently needed to bring over sixteen hundred members and guests to the Grove for a single week end is an indication that a better "share-the-ride" plan should be worked out.

GROVE DEVELOPMENT AND DATA

The camps of the Grove were grouped closely about the Campfire (Stow) Circle until some years after the turn of the century but the Grove Committee early began to urge the members to clear the beautiful vistas and move to the hillsides and into what was then thought of as the hinterlands of the River Road, Westover (now Morse-Stephens) Canyon and Kitchen Hill. The process was slow but after some thirty-odd years the Grove's appearance, as the Committee first envisioned it, was generally achieved.

An old two horse bus that followed a leisurely course from the entrance of the Grove to the bluff above the swimming hole was the only transportation within the Grove until Jim Paige presented us with a ten passenger motor bus in 1927, largely for the benefit of some older members who lived up Snob and Kitchen Hills. Twelve years later Chester Weaver gave the original "Old Guard" bus, the Grove Committee bought "The Owl" and the first bus was turned into a fire truck, which it still is. Later on the "Bohemia" and "Hamadryad" were added, a new "Old Guard" purchased and the original of the latter converted into a truck. As of today the members, even those living on the flat-lands, feel they have been slighted if a bus isn't in sight at all times to carry them a hundred yards or so.

The Grove is about 68-plus miles from the Golden Gate Bridge, depending upon which of several routes is followed. The 2700 acres are contained in an area of about two miles by three. The floor of the valley is 55 feet and the High Point on the south ridge 1100 feet above sea level.

Within the Grove are over twenty miles of roadway, about half being on the rim following the fire breaks. There are twenty-two miles of trail built originally for fire fighting purposes.

There are, as of 1961, 128 listed camps which at full capacity could accommodate 1615 persons plus Camp Bromley's seventy-four beds. A careful survey by the Grove Committee shows that the listed membership of the camps is over 200 short of their capacity. With the exception of Mandalay, Isle of Aves and the camps along Sunny Row hillside, all others

are served by roadways although Rogers Hill camps have no regular bus service.

The club house above the swimming pool is the oldest building in the Grove, built in 1904 by Architect Bernard Maybeck and his engineer brother-in-law Mark White, long a member of the Chorus. Other buildings with their years of construction and architects are: Artists' Building (Ice House so-called) by Louis Mullgardt in 1930; Grill and Hospital by W. C. Hayes in 1931 and 1932; and the Civic Center by Ernest Weihe in 1935.

Grove Committeeman John Galloway triangulated and placed the heights on seven trees in the Grove in 1938, the tallest, outside the Dining Circle near the Kitchen Hill road, was then 301 feet. "Taller now," John said later. "The figures are only good for the one year, a tree will grow." The oldest tree ever cut in the Grove had 1100 yearly rings.

Two trees were cut to improve the sight lines on the Grove stage in 1913-14 and three trees have fallen in recent years. One wrecked the kitchen of Tarrytown Camp, another paid the same compliment to the Derelicts and another went through Mandalay's platform uprooting the Hermits' Camp at its foot as well as itself. These trees fell during heavy Spring

rains which weakened their roots. Dangerous trees in Pig and Whistle and Derelicts also had to be removed.

Field Circle was created in 1913 and has been several times enlarged in both stage and seating. Two large and two smaller trees in the rear-center were felled in 1958 to add about 200 seats to its total capacity which cannot be figured because of the large number of members who sit on the ground in front of the stage. The trunks of the two smaller trees were used to build the new Lermen Gate at the entrance of the Grove.

Camp Bromley for new members and others who have not yet joined private camps was established in 1928 and the tents replaced with cabins in 1957.

A new feature, the increasing use of the Grove for camp picnics, has resulted in more than 5000 persons visiting the Grove in the forty-five weeks when it is made available to the families of members and their friends. On some week ends over 1800 members and guests have been registered.

The Grove Play seats on the logs can accommodate 1100 persons in an area 60 by 90 feet.

From the last row of seats to the foot of "The Three Graces" (trees) is exactly 280 feet in a sight line. The elevation at that point is exactly 75 feet above the level of the lower stage. The breadth of the stage between the proscenium trees is 42 feet. The electrical equipment for the stage and general use is a single unit 225 K. W. transformer (about 300 H. P.).

The pipe organ presented by three members in 1920 cost \$15,000, its concrete vault \$7,500 and the electrical equipment (the first in the Grove) \$4,000 more. The organ was especially voiced for out-of-doors use. William Barnes, the famous organ architect, elected to membership in 1959 after three years as a guest in the Grove, gave the Club and personally installed a new trumpet stop which has added greatly to the quality and power of the instrument.

The organ was formerly heated throughout the year with electric radiators. It is now more easily cared for with de-humidifiers which are also used in the piano warehouse where upwards of fifty instruments can be stored for the greater part of the year.

The water supply for the Grove is obtained from two 80 foot wells, 14 inches in diameter, sunk in the sand spit in 1951 and 1954 near the swimming pool. They have sealed-in 30 H. P. motors, each with a capacity of 300 gallons a minute with a third stand-by motor of the same output for emergencies. The storage capacity of the fourteen tanks at the same level on the hillsides is 600,000 gallons. For fire-fighting purposes there are also seventeen smaller tanks filled with run-off water during the rainy season. The main Grove supply lines are regularly sampled at several points three times each year before the encampment, the last time early in July. The samples are sent to the U. C. Medical Bacteriological Laboratory and the result has always been negative. The water is not chlorinated.

With the improvement of facilities in the Grove its enjoyment by the members has resulted in a great gain in attendance during the mid-week period between the three major week end programs.

Of the latter, the Low Jinks on the second Saturday night has shown a great improvement over the early days. The first completely original one, with book and music by Clay Greene and Uda Waldrop, was in 1924 for "The Lady of Monte Rio." There was a cast of five, with Uda at the piano and but one

costume, that for the "lady" played by Fred McNulty.. Since then cast, orchestra and production staffs have sometimes totaled 220 as compared with 360 for some Grove Plays and 200 for Cremations.

The shift of the Grove Play to Friday night of the second week brought the attendance in 1961 up to 1613, greatest ever recorded.

Noon-time talks were originated by Wilbur Hall in 1932 and for the years since then the final address each year has been by the beloved Bohemian, Herbert Hoover. The first Rim Rides were in 1939 and Emanuel Fritz originated the daily Walkie Talkies in 1949.

CITY CLUB

While the Grove has been the focal point of the Club's most outstanding activity, the growth of membership has constantly demanded greater and more adequate accommodations in town. The rooms on Pine Street were abandoned in February of 1889 for the luxurious quarters of the Pacific Club on three upper floors of a building at the northeast corner of Post Street and Grant Avenue. This was the year the Pacific and Union Clubs joined forces. Bohemia's former rooms "over the market" were occupied by the Press Club,

which had been formed in 1887 after the Sons of the Owl had expanded and more or less outgrown the character the founding newspaper men had in mind.

Despite the seeming luxury, Bohemia sorely needed a Jinks Room and finally in 1899 a dance hall across Ashburton Place was converted to the Club's use and a wide stairway built into it from the Club Rooms. It was a beautiful room and the scene of some notable performances and dinners before the 1906 fire.

Earlier a hoped-for permanent Club building had been contracted for at the northwest corner of Sutter and Mason Streets but the 1893 depression intervened and, with the building almost finished, the Club paid \$27,500 to be released from the contract, exactly the price paid for the original Grove acreage a few years later. The owner, who had in the meantime been elected to membership, converted the premises into a doctors' office building, numbered 606 Sutter Street, but "B. C." and the Owl over the doorway remained until that April day in 1906.

DESTRUCTION - SALVAGE - REBIRTH

Artist and Board member Charles J. Dickman was the hero of the 1906 disaster. Furnished with two one-horse delivery trucks by Reuben Hale he took fifty or more paintings and cartoons on their stretchers from out their frames, added all the Members' and Board of Directors' minutes books from the beginning of the Club, photograph albums going back to 1887 and, with St. John of Nepomuk presiding over all, the wagons found their way to safe storage in the old Art Museum, left over from the 1894 Midwinter Fair in Golden Gate Park. Despite the tradition in such cases, none of these pictures were "cut" from their frames.

Just one additional item. A Director thoughtfully added the Members' Ledger to the salvage load, an ungracious act for which he was never thereafter permitted to atone or allowed to forget. The Club Building was destroyed by fire shortly after midnight of April 18th. It was not dynamited.

One week later Jack Wilson opened his basement billiard room at 2171 Pacific Avenue as Club headquarters and on June 1st Bohemian Harry Williams' house at the southwest corner of Octavia and Sacramento Streets was occupied.

Because there was no room large enough for Jinks purposes the Cooper Medical auditorium, "two short blocks to the west" was made available for several performances. The Christmas Jinks was held, believe it or not, in the City of Paris Tea Garden, a notable event, for there Harry Melvin first sang Wallace Sabin and Charlie Aikin's "Bohemia's Home is Here." The Christmas Dinner, complete with the red-robed choristers and a gleaming silverladen sideboard took place at the Nordhoff Cafe on Pine Street.

Fourteen months on Octavia Street and on August 17, 1907 the "Little Palace" at the northwest corner of Post and Leavenworth Streets became a very acceptable and adequate interim club house. The pictures were back from the Park and an eighty foot lounge made a splendid Jinks Room.

A Club-owned building had long been the desire of Bohemians and the first effective step had been taken in March of 1904 when a contract to buy the greater part of our present property was signed. The purchase price was covered by an assessment of \$100 per member, payable in monthly installments of \$4; suspended during the period immediately following the 1906 disaster. When the property had been paid for the initiation fee of later members was raised from \$200 to \$300 to equalize them with the original contributors.

The contract for the new building was let

March 11, 1907 and on the same day a contract was signed for the purchase of the balance of our Taylor Street frontage. The cornerstone was laid in the rain at 2 A. M. Sunday morning September 26, 1909 and Bohemians moved into their first "own" home November 12, 1910.

It was a beautiful building. A large skylighted central court or lounge was surrounded by billiard and card rooms, the Cartoon, Red and Owl Rooms with dining room and kitchen below on the Post Street level. Unfortunately the Jinks Room and Library were on the second floor with only a single broad stairway for exit from the Library, Jinks Room and its gallery and understage dressing rooms.

Twenty-three years later constantly growing membership, two dangerous fires, a continual threat of panic in the second floor Jinks Room (which had already caused Fire Department comment) and certain structural inadequacies necessitated replacement, not achieved without strenuous opposition. To many younger members the old building was Bohemia but not to most of the older members, some of whom remembered the Pine Street

days and three other Club locations before and after 1906.

During demolition and construction temporary quarters were rented in the Sir Francis Drake Hotel from July 2, 1933 until the dedication of the present building October 13, 1934. One other date seems worthy of mention. Frank Van Sloun's magnificent murals in the Grove Rooms were not completed for dedication until exactly two months later, December 13th.

The courage of the Board of Directors and membership in building during the depths of the depression may be realized by the fact that the structure was reputedly the only steel frame, Class A building constructed in this country by private capital during those years. May we wonder how many of the Old Guard appreciate the fact that we have been in the new building longer than the old? Thanks to many favorable factors, freedom from debt was celebrated by a symbolic "mortgage burning" November 4, 1954, twenty years and three weeks after the dedication.

"Where were you the night of October 13, 1934?" was the title of the Silver Anniversary celebration of the new building in 1959. Research revealed the fact that of the 1900 members of the Club less than 400 had been

members on that date, an indication of the tremendous turn-over of membership in a quarter-century. Despite this, the Club can still boast of an Old Guard list of more than eighty with forty years membership. A fourth of these have over a half century to their credit.

DEVELOPMENT OF THE JINKS

During the early years the monthly Saturday night entertainments tried to maintain a rather formal intellectual tone. The works of writers of the standing of Dickens, Goethe, Hawthorne, Schiller, Shakespeare, Thackery, Tennyson and the like were discussed but after the serious part of the evening some carefree souls were likely to organize an impromptu Low Jinks until the latter became such a popular feature that complaints were made, particularly by actor and four-time Club President Henry Edwards, that members would play cards during the high-brow part of the evening and adjourn only for the reputedly somewhat infra-dig after-show.

During later years more formalized Low Jinks followed each High Jinks program but during the memory of most present-day Bohemians the only scheduled Low Jinks has been held on the second Saturday night of the Grove Encampment, Impromptu after-glows in the Cartoon Room following each program in the City Club have a definite emphasis on music which Henry Edwards probably would have found much more to his liking.

The early monthly Saturday night Jinks of the Club were changed to more frequent occasions after the turn of the century and, since the adoption about 1917 of Thursday instead of Saturday as Club Night, every Thursday has been a gathering occasion, even when nothing formal is planned. The Thursdays are fairly busy early in the year but Los Angeles and Grove Fever Nights usually close the programs to clear the way for Grove-events rehearsals. After the Encampment the first Autumn Jinks is usually the Afterglow followed by the President's Dinner, a Football Night, Thanksgiving Dinner and in December the Christmas Jinks (the oldest traditional Club function) with the Christmas Dinner the following Thursday.

CLUB LIBRARY

Before 1906 the Club had accumulated a splendid library of over 8000 volumes including the remarkable Halleck Law Library all of which was, of course, destroyed in the April fire. Almost the first appeal to the members that year was for donations to a new library. This work was pursued in a more or less desultory manner until the Club, thanks to the generous donation of a member, acquired a goodly portion of the splendid Henry Taylor library of fine bindings and first editions in 1937.

Two years previously Librarian John Herzog had been engaged and for the next few years, until he was also assigned as secretary of the Membership Committee, he did a major work in cataloging and arranging the previously acquired melange and giving it a true library format. This work included placing rare and valuable works and bindings in the locked cases at the east end of the room.

The recent revival of the occasionally-published Library Notes and the fact that the lending feature has been brought to the attention of the members have added to the Library's value. Any volume not in the locked cases and not of a reference character may be borrowed by a member whose signature in the "lending book" is all that is required.

The 13,000 volumes in the Library also include upwards of 800 volumes by the over 175 past and present Club authors.

The Club has nearly always been blessed (some may not agree with that word) with waiting lists but the present one which began to pile up in 1943 is certainly tops for the course and the struggle of the Directors and Membership Committee to resolve the problem fairly has resulted in many headaches and finally in the drastic amendments emphasizing youth and possible Club usefulness that have been in effect the last few years.

At the present time the total membership of the Club is usually about 1900. Of these 1050 are listed as Regular members. A careful reading of the By-Laws and inspection of the membership listing will reveal that there are thirteen classifications of membership although further additions to the Life and Honorary Life lists are not planned.

As was said previously, Bohemia is essentially a club of friendships, usually founded on a similarity of tastes, often undiscovered until they are brought to light in a Club activity where men work together unselfishly for Bohemia. The fact that a stranger is seldom allowed to be alone in the Cartoon Room or at meal times is remarked upon by members of other clubs where noses are often tip-tilted to strangers. It is not surprising that, as Rudyard Kipling said of the Club over seventy years ago "... its fame extends over the world."

INCORPORATION

The original incorporation papers of the Bohemian Club were filed and recorded on the 17th day of May, 1872.

Proceedings to continue the existence of the corporation were filed April 29, 1892 and an extension of fifty years was dated June 29, 1909.

The certificate of perpetual existence was filed in the year 1954 as shown in the following formal copy.

CERTIFICATE OF AMENDMENT OF ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF BOHEMIAN CLUB

The undersigned, J. HAROLD WEISE and THO-MAS G. FRANCK hereby certify that they are respectively and have been at all times herein mentioned, the duly elected and acting President and Secretary of BOHEMIAN CLUB, a California corporation, and further that:

1. At a regular meeting of the Board of Directors of said corporation, duly held at its principal office for the transaction of business at 1:00 o'clock P. M. on the 23rd day of August, 1954, at which meeting there was at all times present and acting in excess of a two-thirds majority of the members of said Board, the following resolution was duly and unanimously adopted:

"WHEREAS, it is deemed to be for the best interests of this corporation and the best interests of its members that its articles of incorporation be amended so as to make its existence perpetual:

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the articles of incorporation of this corporation be amended by adding thereto a paragraph reading as follows:

- " 'The term of existence of this corporation shall be perpetual.'
- 2. That said amendment of the articles of incorporation is made pursuant to Sections 3700 and 3701 of the Corporations Code of the State of California by the foregoing resolution of the Board of Directors adopted by in excess of a two-thirds majority of the members of said Board.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

ORGANIZATION

This organization shall be known as the Bohemian Club. It is instituted for the association of gentlemen connected professionally with Literature, Art, Music, the Drama, and also those who, by reason of their love or appreciation of these objects, may be deemed eligible.

ARTICLE II

CLUB GOVERNMENT

The government of the Club shall be vested in a Board of Directors of eleven members, consisting of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer, and seven other Directors, to be elected and hold office as provided in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE III

CLUB PROPERTY

The legal title and ownership of all the property and assets of the Club shall vest in the Bohemian Club.

ARTICLE IV

BIGHTS IN CLUB PROPERTY

Any person ceasing from any cause to be a member shall forfeit, *ipso facto*, all right and title to the property, funds, and assets of the Club, and every part thereof.

ARTICLE V

STRICTLY SOCIAL CHARACTER

No demonstration on behalf of any religious or political object shall ever be made by the Club.

ARTICLE VI

AMENDMENTS TO CONSTITUTION

Amendments to the Constitution may be made at any meeting of the Club, regular or special, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members present. Notice of proposed amendments to the Constitution shall be furnished to the Secretary and posted in a conspicuous place in the Club House at least thirty days before the meeting. Amendments to amendments and substitutes must be posted fifteen days before the meeting.

ARTICLE VII

TIME OF TAKING EFFECT OF CONSTITUTION

This Constitution shall take effect immediately, and all provisions of former Constitutions are hereby repealed.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

- SECTION 1. In accordance with Article I of the Constitution, the membership of the Bohemian Club shall consist of gentlemen who are connected professionally with Literature, Art, Music, the Drama, and also those who, by reason of their love or appreciation of these objects, may be deemed eligible.
- Sec. 2. Membership shall be classified as follows: Regular, Non-Resident, Faculty and Service, Associate, Temporary, and Honorary.
- SEC. 3. Each member of the Club, upon acceptance of membership, assumes the obligation to render to the Club, when called upon, such assistance with the objects, purposes, and customs of the Club as lies within his abilities.
- SEC. 4. No application for membership shall be received from anyone under the age of twenty-one.
- SEC. 5. Resignations from membership must be in writing.

ARTICLE II REGULAR MEMBERS

- Section 1. The Regular membership shall consist of a General List, a List of Fifty, a Life List, an Honorary Life List, and an Honorary Regular List.
- Sec. 2. The General List shall be limited to one thousand memberships, of which one hundred shall be reserved for persons connected professionally with Literature, Art, Music, or the Drama. This

reservation shall not limit the number of such persons within the General List; but the number of persons not so connected shall not exceed nine hundred.

- Sec. 3. In recognition of services rendered to the Club, the Board of Directors may select the names of not to exceed fifty members who shall be known as the List of Fifty. To be eligible for this list a member shall have been a member of the Club for the ten years immediately preceding his selection and shall be distinguished in Literature, Art, Music, the Drama, or Science. For those who are not already Regular members the selection for the List of Fifty shall constitute election to Regular membership and shall continue as such at the discretion of the Board of Directors, but no admission fee shall be required. The Board may remit in whole or in part the dues, Grove charges, and assessments of any member of the List of Fifty.
- SEC. 4. Any member of the Club who has been a Regular member of the Club for the ten years immediately preceding, and shall be distinguished in Literature, Art, Music, the Drama, or Science, may be elected an Honorary Regular member by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors; such membership may be terminated at any time at the discretion of the Board of Directors. The number of such members shall not exceed twenty-five at any one time. They shall pay full Grove charges if they attend the Encampment, otherwise one-half the amount, but the Board may remit in whole or in part the dues or charges of such members.

- Sec. 5. Election to the List of Fifty or to the Honorary Regular List shall not be made within thirty days of a nomination made at a regular meeting of the Board.
- SEC. 6. Life members who have been elected under former by-laws shall continue on the Life List. They shall pay Grove charges (if elected since January 18, 1927) but no dues or assessments. No additions shall be made to this list.
- Sec. 7. Honorary Life members who have been elected under former by-laws shall continue on the Honorary Life List. They may be required to pay Grove charges but no dues. No additions shall be made to this list.

ARTICLE III

NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS

- Section 1. Persons whose bona fide residence and principal place of business are more than two hundred miles radius from San Francisco may be elected to Non-Resident membership. Non-Resident members shall pay admission fees, dues, and assessments as fixed by the Board of Directors. They shall pay full Grove charges, except that the Board shall have power to waive or adjust such charges in special circumstances. The number of Non-Resident members shall not exceed four hundred. Non-Resident members shall not be eligible to hold office or to vote at elections.
- Sec. 2. If a Non-Resident member resides temporarily for more than three months continuously within two hundred miles radius of San Francisco

he shall pay full regular dues beginning with the first month after the expiration of the three months period.

- SEC. 3. If a Non-Resident member who has not formerly been a Regular member moves his residence or principal place of business to within two hundred miles radius of San Francisco his membership shall terminate after the expiration of three months unless, in the meantime, he shall have made written application for election to Regular membership. Upon receipt of such application the Membership Committee shall cause notice of it to be given to the members of the Club. If after thirty days from the mailing of such notice no objection is received. the applicant shall be transferred to Regular membership preferentially. If there is no vacancy, his name shall continue on the Non-Resident list until a vacancy occurs: but, in the meantime, he shall pay full regular dues. If an objection from any member is received in writing within thirty days from the mailing of notice, the Membership Committee shall proceed to consider the application in the usual manner, except that it shall be acted upon within ninety days from the date of the application and no sponsors shall be required. During the period of consideration, and thereafter if elected, until a vacancy occurs, the applicant shall continue on the Non-Resident list, but shall pay full regular dues.
- Sec. 4. If a Non-Resident member who has formerly been a Regular member returns his residence or principal place of business to within two hundred

miles radius of San Francisco he shall be transferred by the Board of Directors to Regular membership preferentially. If there is no vacancy, his name shall continue on the Non-Resident list until a vacancy occurs; but, in the meantime, he shall pay full regular dues.

Sec. 5. If a Regular member removes his residence (or, if not a resident, his principal place of business) two hundred miles radius from San Francisco he shall, upon application to the Board of Directors, be transferred to Non-Resident membership preferentially. If there is no vacancy, his name shall continue on the Regular list until a vacancy occurs; but, in the meantime, he shall pay Non-Resident dues.

ARTICLE IV

FACULTY AND SERVICE MEMBERS

SECTION 1. The following, provided they are not engaged to any substantial degree in the practice of a profession or in a business, may be elected to Faculty and Service membership:

(a) Members of the faculties or academic staffs of the University of California and Stanford University, who reside within two hundred miles radius of San Francisco, and who devote a major portion of their time to such universities or who are Retired or Emeritus, and who do not derive a major portion of their incomes from other sources. Faculty members shall be elected for a period of five years which may be thereafter successively renewed by the Membership Committee for additional

- periods of five years, subject, however, to the right of the Board of Directors at its discretion to terminate any such membership at any time. All Faculty members at date of adoption of these by-laws shall continue for five years from date.
- (b) Officers, permanent or temporary, on active duty in the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard of the United States, while stationed within two hundred miles radius of San Francisco, except temporary officers whose residence or principal place of business is within two hundred miles radius of San Francisco.
- (c) Regular officers on the Retired List of the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard of the United States, who reside within two hundred miles radius from San Francisco and who were members of the Club on October 15, 1946.
- (d) Officers of the armed forces of nations allied with the United States in time of war, while stationed within two hundred miles radius from San Francisco.
- (e) Consuls-general, or consuls, representing in San Francisco friendly foreign nations.
- (f) Such others as the Board of Directors may from time to time by unanimous vote certify to the Membership Committee to be eligible because of similar office or circumstances, whether or not residing within two hundred miles radius from San Francisco.

- Sec. 2. The total number of members provided for by this article shall not exceed one hundred and sixty; except that in time of war the Board of Directors may add to this number at its discretion. The Board may from time to time fix limits upon the number of members in each classification or subdivision thereof.
- Sec. 3. In the case of applicants elected to Faculty and Service membership, the Board of Directors may in its discretion, but only upon resolution in each individual case, fix the admission fee, monthly dues. Grove charges, and assessments at such amounts, not exceeding the regular fee and dues, as it may deem appropriate. The Board may at any time change the amount of monthly dues of such members, but may not increase the admission fee once it has been set. Should a Faculty or Service member, who has paid an admission fee, become a Regular member or a Non-Resident member, there shall be deducted from the amount of admission fee payable upon his election the amount of admission fee previously paid. Faculty and Service members shall not be eligible to hold office or to vote at elections.
- SEC. 4. If, in the opinion of the Board of Directors, a Faculty or Service member has lost the qualification for eligibility under this Article, the Board shall notify him that his membership will terminate at a date, to be fixed by the Board, not later than three months from the end of the month in which such notice is given; except that, if before the termination date he shall have applied for Reg-

ular or Non-Resident membership, providing he has been a member for at least two years next preceding, and provided that, in the opinion of the Board, he has participated in the activities of the Club to an extent that merits such consideration, his application shall receive preferential treatment and he shall continue on the Faculty or Service list until his application shall have been passed upon. In the meantime he shall pay the dues required for the class of membership for which he has applied.

- Sec. 5. A member may not be transferred from one subdivision to another under Section 1 of this Article, but should he lose the qualifications for eligibility in the subdivision to which he was elected and be eligible for membership in another subdivision, he may make application for such membership in the same manner and under the same terms as provided for in Section 4 of this Article.
- SEC. 6. All members heretofore classed as Transient members who are on the Transient list at the time this amendment is adopted shall become Faculty or Service members and shall be placed in the appropriate subdivision under Section 1 of this Article.

ARTICLE V ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

SECTION 1. Persons who are proficient in Literature, Art, Music, the Drama, Science, or technical work connected therewith, may be elected to Associate membership. Election to Associate membership shall be for a period not exceeding one year, but may

be extended annually for not more than a year at a time, dating from the beginning of the current fiscal year. If at the expiration of a year, no definite action has been taken by the Membership Committee in respect to an Associate membership such membership shall continue until such action is taken; except that the Board of Directors may terminate such membership if it has extended more than a year from the latest action of the Membership Committee.

- Sec. 2. Associate members and Honorary Associate members shall not be required to pay an admission fee, and shall not be subject to assessments. They shall pay such dues and Grove charges, not exceeding the regular dues and charges as may be fixed from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- SEC. 3. In wartime, or during a period of emergency, the Board of Directors may grant a leave of absence to an Associate member who has entered the active service in the armed forces of the United States or governmental emergency work, and during such leave of absence no dues shall be required of him. At the termination of such leave of absence he shall resume the status he held at the beginning in respect to the annual renewal of his membership. An Associate member who may have resigned to enter upon active duty in the armed forces may be accorded the same privileges by the Board of Directors.
- SEC. 4. The number of Associate members shall not, at any time, exceed two hundred and sixty, of whom two hundred and fifty must reside within one hundred miles radius, and ten must reside more

than one hundred miles radius, of San Francisco. Associate members to whom leaves of absence have been granted under Section 3 of this Article shall not be counted in determining the number of Associate members. If the termination of leaves of absence causes the number of Associate members to exceed two hundred and sixty, no new Associate members may be elected until the number falls below two hundred and sixty; but the membership of those already on the Associate list may be extended annually notwithstanding.

- SEC. 5. An Associate member who has rendered distinguished service to the Club and who has been an Associate member for fifteen years within the twenty years immediately preceding may, by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, be elected an Honorary Associate member and shall continue as such at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. The period of time required for eligibility shall include the time covered by a leave of absence or service in the armed forces as provided for in Section 3. The number of Honorary Associate members shall not exceed eighty-five and shall not be included in determining the limitation placed on the number of Associate members.
- Sec. 6. Associate members and Honorary Associate members shall not be eligible to hold office or to vote at election.

ARTICLE VI

TEMPORARY MEMBERS

SECTION 1. A non-resident of the State of California, temporarily visiting this state, may be admitted as a Temporary member for a period of three months, upon payment in advance of full regular

dues for the entire period. Temporary members do not have the privilege, under this By-Law, of visiting the Grove during the Midsummer Encampment.

- SEC. 2. Application for Temporary membership shall be made to the Membership Committee in the regular way except that the name of the applicant need not be submitted to the Club membership in advance of election, but shall instead be posted in the Club for a period of at least seven days before action.
- SEC. 3. The Board of Directors may, upon request of two sponsors, extend the membership of a Temporary member for a period not exceeding three months upon payment in advance of dues for the period of the extension.
- Sec. 4. The sponsors of a Temporary member shall be held responsible for all indebtedness to the Club incurred by such member during the period of his Temporary membership for which they were his sponsors.
- Sec. 5. Temporary members may not vote or participate in business meetings of the Club. They may not entertain visitors at the Grove, nor may they request the issuance of visitors' cards. They may, however, entertain guests in the Club House under the House Rules.

ARTICLE VII

HONORARY MEMBERS

SECTION 1. Persons of special eminence in Literature, Art, Music, the Drama, Science, or Education, or in Military or Diplomatic affairs, or other

public service, may, by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors, be made Honorary members.

Sec. 2. Honorary members shall have all the privileges of Regular membership, except that they may not vote or hold office. They shall pay no admission fee, dues, or assessments and shall not be subject to Grove charges.

ARTICLE VIII

CLUB MEETINGS

- SECTION 1. All regular meetings of the Club shall be held at the Club House in San Francisco. Fifty Regular members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings. Only Regular members in good standing shall be entitled to vote at any Club meeting. If there be no quorum, those present may adjourn the meeting from day to day, until a quorum shall be present.
- Sec. 2. The annual meeting of the Club shall be held at 12:30 p. m. on the third Tuesday in October of each year, and regular stated meetings of the Club shall be held at 12:30 p. m. on the third Tuesday of January, April and June in each year.
- SEC. 3. Special meetings of the Club may be called by the Directors to be held at the Club House or, during the Midsummer Encampment, at the Grove. On the application in writing of twenty-five members, a special meeting must be called.
- SEC. 4. Notice of all meetings of the Club, regular or special, shall be given by mailing to each member of the Club at least ten days before the meeting, notice thereof in writing. The notice of a

special meeting shall state the purpose for which the meeting has been called, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting.

Sec. 5. In any action requiring the sanction of two-thirds of the entire membership of the Club, members may vote by proxy at a meeting called to consider such action, but no proxies shall be allowed for any other purpose. Proxies may be given only to a member, and must be filed with the Secretary at least five days before any meeting at which they are to be used.

ARTICLE IX

ELECTIONS

- SECTION 1. An election of Officers and Directors shall be held annually at the annual meeting of the Club.
- Sec. 2. At the stated meeting in June of each year, there shall be selected a Nominating Committee consisting of five Regular members of at least five years' standing. No member shall serve on this committee more than once in three years.
- SEC. 3. Nominations for said Committee shall be in writing, signed by at least two members, and shall be filed with the Secretary at least seven days before said stated meeting. Each nomination shall be made separately, and no member shall nominate more than one person as a nominee for said Committee.
- Sec. 4. The Secretary shall prepare a printed ballot on which the names of candidates shall ap-

pear in alphabetical order, a copy of which ballot shall be posted in the Club House where it may readily be seen for at least three days before said stated meeting.

- SEC. 5. The presiding officer shall arrange that the polls shall be kept open for one hour at the meeting, and he shall appoint two tellers to count the ballots. The five nominees receiving the highest number of votes shall constitute the Nominating Committee. In case of a tie, the presiding officer shall cast a lot to determine the election.
- Sec. 6. The Nominating Committee shall nominate a list of Officers and Directors to be elected at the annual meeting. The list, to be known as the Regular Ticket, shall be mailed to each member of the Club at least two weeks before the election, and shall also be posted in the Club for at least two weeks before the election.
- Sec. 7. Other tickets may be submitted by two or more members of the Club, stating the nominees and designating the office for which each is nominated. Such tickets must be designated as Opposition Tickets, and must be filed with the Secretary, printed uniformly with the Regular Ticket, and posted in the Club House, near the Regular Ticket, for at least one week before the election.
- Sec. 8. The presiding officer shall arrange that the polls shall be kept open for one hour at the annual meeting, and he shall appoint two Judges of Election, who shall count the votes and report the names of the Officers and Directors elected. A plurality of votes shall elect. In case of a tie, a special

election shall be called by the Board of Directors to take place within two weeks, at which a ballot will be taken upon the tying candidates.

Sec. 9. Officers and Directors shall assume their duties on the day following their election.

ARTICLE X

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. The government of the Club shall be vested in a Board of Directors consisting of the President, the Vice President, the Secretary, the Treasurer and seven other members. The officers and other members of the Board of Directors shall be elected in the following manner: the President and the Vice President shall be elected annually for a term of one year; the Secretary and two Board Members shall be elected at the annual meeting after the adoption of this By-Law for a term of three years, and every third year thereafter for successive terms of three years; the Treasurer and two Board Members shall be elected at the annual meeting after the adoption of this By-Law for a term of two years and thereupon and every third year thereafter for successive terms of three years: three Board Members shall be elected at the annual meeting one year after the adoption of this By-Law for a term of three years and every third year thereafter for successive terms of three years.

Sec. 2. Only Regular members of the Club in good standing who have been Regular members for at least five years shall be eligible to serve as officers or members of the Board of Directors. No member of the Board shall receive compensation from the Club for his personal services in any capacity dur-

ing the term of his office. Any member of the Board of Directors who shall be absent from its meetings for a period of sixty days without leave voted by the Board shall cease to be a member thereof.

- SEC. 3. The Board of Directors shall exercise general control of the Club and its activities, and shall have power to make and enforce such rules as may be necessary for this purpose, including House and Grove Rules. It shall have authority to employ and discharge agents and employees, and to fix their compensation. It shall control all receipts and disbursements of the Club, and shall have the power to incur indebtedness, to levy charges and assessments upon the membership, to fix the amounts of fees and dues not prescribed by these by-laws, and to cancel in whole or in part the indebtedness of any member.
- Sec. 4. The Board shall deal conclusively with all matters relating to Club discipline and may suspend or expel a member for infraction of Club rules.
- Sec. 5. The Board shall have authority to reinstate a member who for any reason within a period of two years prior to his application for reinstatement may have lost his membership. Such reinstatement may be made on such terms as the Board may deem to be appropriate. In all other cases, the consideration of the application for reinstatement shall be conducted by the Membership Committee pursuant to the provisions of these by-laws.
- Sec. 6. The Board shall prescribe the duties of administrative committees not specifically prescribed elsewhere in these by-laws.

- Sec. 7. The Board shall have power to fill vacancies in the offices of Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, and in the Board membership.
- Sec. 8. The Board may appoint an Assistant Secretary, not a member of the Club, at such salary as it may fix, who shall hold office at its pleasure and perform such duties as the Board may prescribe.
- Sec. 9. Regular meetings of the Board shall be held at such times as it may determine. Special meetings may be called by the President, or in his absence by the Vice-President; or by the Secretary upon the written request of six members of the Board. Notice of special meetings shall be given by mailing a notice to each member of the Board at his regular address at least one day before the day of the meeting.
- Sec. 10. Six members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Board. Acts of the Board shall be by majority vote, except as otherwise prescribed in these by-laws.
- SEC. 11. No information of proceedings or happenings of the Club shall be published, or made available for publication, by printing, pictorial reproduction, or otherwise, except by written permission of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XI DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall exercise general supervision over the affairs of the Club, shall sign all contracts, and shall render a report annually to the members. He shall appoint the members of committees, and shall be ex-officio a member of all ad-

ministrative committees. He shall have authority to fill all vacancies in committees, and to remove members of committees. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors, and shall have the deciding vote in case of a tie on any question, except as provided elsewhere by these by-laws.

- Sec. 2. In the absence or disability of the President, the power and duties of his office shall devolve upon the Vice-President. In the absence or disability of the President and Vice-President, an Acting President shall be elected by the Board of Directors from its membership.
- Sec. 3. The Secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors, and shall have the custody of all papers and documents. He shall issue notices relative to Club matters, conduct the correspondence of the Club, and perform such duties as may be assigned to him.
- Sec. 4. The Treasurer shall have control of the Club's financial accounts. All receipts and disbursements shall be under his direction, subject to the supervision of the Board of Directors. All cash received shall be deposited in bank, to be withdrawn only by check signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by such officer as may be designated by the Board; except that revolving funds may be established from which withdrawals may be made by check signed by such officers or employees as may be designated by the Board, not exceeding the amounts of the respective funds. As soon as practicable after the close of the Club's fiscal year the

Treasurer shall make an annual report to the Board of Directors showing the financial condition of the Club and its operating results.

ARTICLE XII

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEES

- SECTION 1. The President shall, at the beginning of his term of office, appoint administrative committees which shall direct matters pertaining to Art, Library, Finance, and House and Restaurant. The chairman of each committee shall be a Director. The members of these committees shall hold office for one year or until their successors are appointed. The duties prescribed shall be subject to direction and amplification by the Board of Directors.
- SEC. 2. The Art Committee shall supervise the care and custody of all works of art belonging to the Club and shall have charge of all exhibitions of works of art held by the Club and of the placing and hanging of all works of art within the Club House and at the Grove.
- Sec. 3. The Library Committee shall supervise the administration of the Library, pass on proposed purchases, and make recommendations to the Board of Directors on the acceptability of gifts. It shall have charge of all books, manuscripts, prints, musical scores, and memorabilia in the Library collections, and of all exhibitions thereof. The President shall designate one of the members of the Library Committee to be Historiographer, whose duties under the supervision of the Library Committee, shall be to collect and classify the literary, musical and historical records and memorabilia of the Club,

to gather and preserve the Scattered Leaves, and to maintain the Annals of Bohemia.

- Sec. 4. The Finance Committee, of which the Treasurer shall be Chairman, shall assist the Treasurer in supervising the finances of the Club and in making recommendations to the Board of Directors. It shall periodically review delinquent accounts and make recommendations concerning the same to the Board of Directors. It shall at least once in three years review and submit a report regarding the dues and charges payable by members whose dues are fixed individually by the Board of Directors.
- SEC. 5. The House and Restaurant Committee shall supervise the operation, maintenance, and repairs of the Club House, and the purchasing, storing, preparation and serving of all food and beverages both at the Club House and at the Grove. It shall supervise the enforcement of the House Rules.
- Sec. 6. The President, with the consent of the Board of Directors, may appoint other committees for the term of his office and may designate the members and the chairman thereof.

ARTICLE XIII

THE GROVE COMMITTEE

- Section 1. The Club property in Sonoma County known as the Grove shall be supervised and managed by a Grove Committee, subject to the direction and approval of the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 2. The Grove Committee shall consist of seven members appointed by the President, as follows: one member to be selected from the Board of Directors, who shall serve until the expiration of

his term of office; six members selected from the Regular membership, who shall serve for terms of three years, two to be appointed each year. The President shall annually designate a member of this Committee to be its chairman. The Committee may designate one of its members to be its secretary.

- SEC. 3. The Committee shall manage the Midsummer Encampment and shall provide for the care of members, guests, and employees, and shall cooperate with and assist the House and Restaurant Committee in the purchasing, storing, preparation and serving of food and beverages at the Grove, and the Jinks Committee in its functions.
- SEC. 4. The Committee shall determine the character and extent of all ground improvements and structures in the Grove, whether made by the Club or by members for their camps, except that additions, alterations and upkeep relating to stages, auditoriums, and other centers of entertainment shall be undertaken jointly with the Jinks Committee, and that additions, alterations and upkeep relating to the kitchen, dining room, and other restaurant facilities shall be undertaken jointly with the House and Restaurant Committee.
- SEC. 5. Allotments of camp-sites for members' camps shall be made and controlled by the Committee, which shall have authority to establish and alter boundaries and to revoke allotments, except that appeal from any alteration or revocation of allotment may be made to the Board of Directors for final determination.
- Sec. 6. The Committee shall on or before the first of November of each year, submit to the Board

of Directors a budget of proposed expenditure for the ensuing fiscal year for operation, maintenance, and improvements, and after its approval by the Board, the Committee shall not authorize or incur any expenditure for improvements in excess of the amounts approved for such purposes, nor shall it authorize or incur any expenditure in excess of the total amount of the approved budget, without specific approval by the Board. All vouchers and payrolls for the Grove budget must be certified by the Chairman or the Secretary of the Committee before being submitted to the Treasurer for payment.

- Sec. 7. On or before the first of November of each year the Committee shall make a report to the Board of Directors on its activities for the preceding fiscal year.
- SEC. 8. The Committee shall supervise the enforcement of the Grove Rules.
- Sec. 9. The Grove Committee may appoint from its membership a Camp Committee to administer such of its functions as it may designate.
- Sec. 10. The Grove Committee may appoint a Regular member of the Club to be Captain of the Grove to serve as its executive officer during the Midsummer Encampment.

ARTICLE XIV

THE JINKS COMMITTEE

Section 1. A Jinks Committee shall be appointed by the President, consisting of ten members, as follows: one member to be selected from the Board of Directors, who shall serve until the expiration of his term of office; and nine members selected from the membership-at-large, who shall serve for terms of three years, three to be appointed each year. The President shall annually designate a member of the Committee to be its Chairman. The Committee may appoint a Secretary, who may be an employee of the Club.

- SEC. 2. The Jinks Committee shall have charge of all Club functions, both at the Club House and at the Grove. It shall appoint Sires to preside over these functions, it shall appoint Authors and Composers for Grove Plays and for other entertainments, and it shall select participants in these functions. All Sires, Authors, Composers, and participants shall be selected from the Club membership, unless specific permission is obtained from the Board of Directors in each case. It shall select, supervise, and exercise censorship over all plays and other forms of entertainment given in the Club House or at the Grove.
- SEC. 3. The Committee shall have charge of the stages, auditoriums, and other centers of entertainment, and of all stage properties and paraphernalia, both at the Club House and at the Grove, except that additions, alterations, and upkeep at the Grove shall be undertaken jointly with the Grove Committee.
- Sec. 4. The Committee shall on or before the first of November of each year, submit to the Board of Directors a budget of proposed expenditures for the ensuing fiscal year for the functions under its control, and after its approval by the Board, the Committee shall not authorize or incur any expend-

itures for any major function in excess of the amounts approved for such purposes, nor shall it authorize or incur expenditure in excess of the total amount of the approved budget without specific approval by the Board. All vouchers and payrolls for the Jinks budget must be certified by the chairman of the Committee, or, in his absence, by a member appointed by the Committee, before being submitted to the Treasurer for payment.

SEC. 5. On or before the first of November of each year the Committee shall make a report to the Board of Directors on its activities for the preceding fiscal year.

ARTICLE XV

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE AND ELECTION OF MEMBERS

Section 1. A membership Committee shall be appointed by the President, consisting of eleven members and five alternates as follows: one member to be selected from the Board of Directors, who shall serve for one year; ten members and five alternates, selected from the Regular membership, who shall serve for terms of three years: five alternates to be appointed each year to serve one year as an alternate and two years as a member. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment. An appointment to a vacancy during the year shall be for the unexpired term. The President shall designate the Chairman of the Committee. The alternates shall have the privilege of attending all meetings of the Committee and shall serve as substitutes for absent members. The Chairman shall have the authority to designate alternates for this purpose.

- SEC. 2. The power of election of applicants for all classes of membership is vested in the Membership Committee. The Committee shall consider and vote upon applicants for all classes of membership under the stated policies designed to preserve a balance in the Club membership based on age, anticipated participation in Club function, and capacity to contribute actively to the objectives of the Club: which said policies shall provide that within the respective classifications and categories established by such policies, the Committee shall consider and vote upon applications in the order in which their names appear on the respective lists. Said policies shall also determine the preferential treatment to be given the types of applicants specified in Section 6 of this Article. All such stated policies, and amendments and modifications thereof, shall, subject to Article X, be first proposed by the Committee and submitted to the Board of Directors for approval. amendment, or rejection. All such stated policies and amendments and modifications thereof, when approved by the Board of Directors, shall be set forth in full in the Minutes of the Committee and copies thereof mailed to the members of the Club within thirty days of the approval thereof by the Board of Directors. The Committee shall prescribe its own rules of procedure, subject to the provisions of these By-Laws.
- Sec. 3. Each application for membership in the Club, except Honorary membership, shall be in writing on a form prescribed by the Committee and shall be signed by the applicant and by two sponsors who shall be Regular members of the Club in good

standing, except that Honorary Associates may act as sponsors for applicants for Associate membership. Members of the Committee and alternates may not serve as sponsors during incumbency. The Committee may require of the applicant and his sponsors such information about the applicant as it may deem appropriate and may require the sponsors to appear in person before the Committee.

- Sec. 4. If there is no vacancy when an application is received, the applicant shall not be immediately considered for election, but shall be placed on a list designated "Applicants for Regular Membership," or for Non-resident, Faculty, or Service membership, as the case may be. Names shall be shown on the respective lists in the order in which the applications were received, excepting as provided for in Sections 2, 6, and 7 of this Article. The list of applicants shall be kept posted in the Club House where they may be readily seen by the members.
- Sec. 5. The Committee may give consideration to any application for membership in accordance with its own rules of procedure, but before any final action is taken on the election of any member, except Temporary members, the Committee shall cause notice to be given to the members of the Club of such application for membership and shall take no further action thereon for at least one week following the mailing of such notice.
- Sec. 6. The Committee shall give preferential treatment to the following types of applicants:
- (a) an applicant for Regular membership connected professionally with Literature, Art, Music, or

the Drama shall have consideration above all other applicants;

(b) a former Regular or Non-Resident member; a former Associate or Honorary Associate member of at least ten years continuous membership; a present Associate, Honorary Associate, Faculty, or Service member, who has been a member for at least two years preceding and whose application has been approved by the Board of Directors.

The order of preferential treatment between such applicants shall be in accordance with the policies specified in Section 2 of this Article.

- Sec. 7. Should an application for one class of membership be changed to another class, the date of the original application shall govern its place on the list.
- Sec. 8. Not more than five applicants on each list may be voted on prior to the occurrence of a vacancy in the respective classification. The notice of election shall not be issued until a vacancy occurs.
- Sec. 9. Election to Regular membership and Non-Resident membership shall be by secret ballot. The applicant's name shall be entered in a poll book and each member, or his designated alternate, shall attest his vote by signing the poll book. Nine affirmative votes shall be necessary to elect. When the balloting has been completed by the attestation of eleven voters, the ballot box shall be opened by two members of the Board of Directors in the presence of each other. They shall examine the ballots cast and certify the result by writing in the poll book

"Elected" or "Not Elected," and by signing their names. If a discrepancy should be found between the number of ballots cast and the number of attesting signatures, such as to cast doubt upon the result, the election shall be declared "Void" and a new election shall be held.

- SEC. 10. Election to other classifications of membership may be by such methods as the Committee may prescribe for itself; provided, however, that no election shall be valid unless at least eleven votes are cast of which at least nine are affirmative.
- Sec. 11. Immediately upon the election of an applicant, or as soon thereafter as a vacancy occurs in the classification to which he was elected, he shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the Club of his election and the amount of his admission fee and monthly dues. The latter shall begin on the first of the month following his election.
- Sec. 12. The Committee may at any time, whether or not an applicant has been listed, by affirmative vote of three members out of eleven voting, request the sponsors to withdraw an application, provided the sponsors have been heard or have been given an opportunity to be heard by the Committee. Notice of such request shall be given to the sponsors in writing by registered mail. If the sponsors fail or refuse to withdraw the application within forty-five days after such mailing the application shall be deemed rejected.
- Sec. 13. An application may be withdrawn by the applicant or by the sponsors at any time prior

to election. An application so withdrawn may not be presented again within one year from date of withdrawal.

Sec. 14. An applicant who has failed of election, or whose application has been withdrawn at the request of the Committee in accordance with Section 12 of this Article, may not make application for membership again in any classification within three years of such failure or withdrawal.

ARTICLE XVI

FEES, DUES AND CHARGES

- Section 1. Except as provided for elsewhere in these By-Laws, the regular fee for admission to the Club shall be fixed by the Board of Directors. It must be paid by newly elected members within fifteen days from the date of written notice of election, except as provided for in Section 3 of this Article. Upon failure of a member to pay the Admission fee as herein provided, his election shall be canceled, unless an extension of time, which shall not exceed sixty days, shall be granted by the Board of Directors.
- SEC. 2. The amount of regular monthly dues shall be fixed by the Board of Directors. Monthly dues are payable in advance at the beginning of each month
- Sec. 3. If an applicant for Regular membership is under thirty-five years of age at the date of his election he shall pay one-half of the admission fee for Regular members, payable within fifteen days from the date of written notice of election, and the

dues of such member shall be one-half of the Regular monthly dues until he becomes thirty-five years of age when he shall commence to pay the full regular monthly dues.

- SEC. 4. In the case of applicants elected to Regular membership on the General List who are connected professionally with Literature, Art. Music. or the Drama, the Board of Directors may in its discretion, but only upon resolution in each individual case, fix the admission fee and monthly dues at such amounts, not exceeding the regular fee and dues, as it may deem appropriate; provided, however, that there shall never be more than one hundred members on the General List, elected in this manner, who have paid less than the regular admission fee or are paying less than the regular monthly dues. The Board may at any time change the amount of monthly dues of such professional members, but may not increase the admission fee once it has been set.
- Sec. 5. The Board of Directors shall fix in advance of the annual mid-summer encampment the amount of Grove charges to be assessed against the membership for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Encampment. Such charges shall be made uniformly to the membership, except as exemptions and remissions are provided for elsewhere in these by-laws.
- Sec. 6. The Board of Directors may levy assessments on such basis as it may deem equitable.

- SEC. 7. The fees and dues specified in this Article do not include governmental taxes.
- Sec. 8. In war time, or during a period of emergency, the Board of Directors shall have the power to reduce or remit the dues and Grove charges of members who have entered active service in the armed forces or governmental emergency work, and to restore them when, in its opinion, the reason for reduction or remission shall have ceased.
- SEC. 9. The Board of Directors shall have the power to suspend or remit the dues of any regular member who, after many years of membership, may suffer a physical disability or illness. In the discretion of the Board of Directors the suspension or remission of dues may be for such period as the disability or illness may continue.

ARTICLE XVII

INDEBTEDNESS OF MEMBERS

- SECTION 1. Monthly dues shall be payable in advance, together with any indebtedness previously incurred.
- SEC. 2. If payment of indebtedness is not made on or before the twentieth of the month it shall become delinquent. Notice of his delinquency shall be given to the delinquent member by the Secretary, and from the date of such notice further credit shall be denied such member until his indebtedness shall be paid in full.
 - SEC. 3. If within thirty days from the giving of

such notice his indebtedness is not paid in full, the delinquent member shall become suspended. During the period of his suspension he shall not have the privileges of the Club and his name shall be posted in the Club House on a Suspended List. During the period of his suspension, however, he shall be charged with monthly dues and with such other charges as pertain to his class of membership. The suspension shall continue for three months, unless in the meantime his indebtedness shall be paid in full. The Board of Directors may, however, upon good cause being shown, extend the time of suspension. If the indebtedness is not paid in full by the end of the term of suspension, the suspended member shall cease to be a member of the Club.

Sec. 4. The Board of Directors may, in its discretion, cancel the whole or any part of indebtedness of any kind, extend credit to a member, or limit or deny credit to a member.

ARTICLE XVIII

DISCIPLINE

- SECTION 1. Any member who may conduct himself in a manner not becoming a gentleman, either in the Club or elsewhere, or who shall do anything calculated to disturb the harmony or impair the good name of the Club, may be reprimanded, fined, suspended, or expelled.
- Sec. 2. Action may be taken in reference to such conduct upon the initiative of the Board of Directors, or upon written charges preferred by a member of the Club to the Board of Directors.

- SEC. 3. Before any action is taken by the Board against the accused, he shall be given three days' notice in writing of a meeting of the Board at which the matter shall be considered and at which the accusation shall be stated to the accused.
- Sec. 4. An affirmative vote of at least nine members of the Board shall be necessary for expulsion of the accused.
- SEC. 5. If for any reason a member who shall have been expelled from the Club, as above provided, shall desire a rehearing, upon written application signed by twenty members of the Club, the Board of Directors shall reconsider the matter. Three days' notice in writing of a meeting for reconsideration shall be given to him and to such applicants, and the Board shall either rescind or reaffirm its former decision by a majority vote.
- Sec. 6. If the former decision of the Board shall be reaffirmed, the applicants in behalf of the expelled member may appeal to a general meeting of the Club, which shall be called at their request, but a vote of two-thirds of those present at such meeting shall be necessary for a reversal of the decision of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XIX

VISITORS

SECTION 1. At the request of a member in good standing, recorded in the visitors' book and approved by two Directors, a card may be issued to a non-resident of the City of San Francisco living more than one hundred miles therefrom, which shall entitle him to the privileges of the Club for a period of two weeks, but not to the privileges of the Midsummer Encampment. A charge to be fixed by the Board of Directors to cover expenses incident thereto shall be made to the member for the issuance of each visitor's card.

- Sec. 2. A visitor's card may be renewed without charge for a period not to exceed two weeks, upon application to the Club office. The Board of Directors may, in its discretion, further extend a visitor's privileges for an additional period, not to exceed four weeks.
- Sec. 3. A visitor's card shall not be issued to the same person more than twice in twelve months. A member may not have outstanding at one time more than three visitors' cards issued at his request.
- Sec. 4. The holder of a visitor's card shall have the regular privileges of the Club, including attendance at entertainments and the signing of chits to be charged to his account. He may not, however, introduce others to the Club House.
- Sec. 5. No visitor shall be permitted in the Club House without a visitor's card unless he be accompanied by a member, excepting by specific or general invitation of the Board of Directors or in the rooms reserved for public functions and private parties. The number of visitors who may accompany a member shall be regulated by the House Rules.

- SEC. 6. The introduction of visitors to the Grove, except for the Midsummer Encampment, shall be regulated by the Grove Rules.
- Sec. 7. Members introducing guests will be held responsible for their conduct while in the Club House and for any indebtedness which may accrue on their account.
- SEC. 8. Invitations to guests to attend the Midsummer Encampment may be issued solely by the Board of Directors or with its approval. Applications by members for approval of guest invitations shall be in writing and shall contain full information for the guidance of the Board in determining the merits and qualifications of the proposed guest. No member may invite more than two guests for one Encampment; no guest, except by special invitation of the Board shall attend the Encampment in two successive years or on more than three occasions in all: no resident of the State of California may attend the Encampment as a guest, except by special invitation of the Board. Applications for guest invitations shall not be acted upon before the first day of May. The Board may limit the total number of guest invitations to be approved for each Encampment and may adopt its own means of determining the approval or rejection of an application and the order in which approval shall be given.
- Sec. 9. The Board of Directors shall annually, before the first day of May fix a uniform charge to

cover the expenses incident to attendance at the Encampment as a guest. The member who invites the guest shall be responsible for the payment of this and all other indebtedness which may accrue on account of the guest.

SEC. 10. The Board of Directors may issue invitations to attend the Encampment as guests of the Club to such persons whose presence, in its opinion, will be desirable. The Board may, in its discretion, allot two such invitations each to the author and composer of the Grove Play and to such others as, in its opinion, are contributing outstanding service to the Encampment.

ARTICLE XX

AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS TO BY-LAWS

- SECTION 1. Amendments or additions to these bylaws may be adopted by either of the following methods:
- (a) The Board of Directors may propose an amendment or addition, notice of which shall be given through the regular monthly mailing, or by special mailing, to all members entitled to vote, and the text of the proposal shall be posted by the Secretary in the Club House and shall remain posted for at least thirty days after the mailing of notice. After thirty days from such mailing, if written protests have not been received by the Secretary from more than ten members entitled to vote, the Secretary shall declare the by-law or amendment adopted. If more than ten such protests are received, the

proposal shall be submitted for vote in the manner set forth in Section 2 of this Article:

- (b) An amendment or addition may be proposed by petition signed by at least twenty members entitled to vote. Such petition shall be submitted to the Board of Directors and if the proposal is approved by the Board it shall follow the procedure set forth in paragraph (a) of this Section; but if not approved by the Board, notice shall be given and posting made as in paragraph (a), and the proposal shall be submitted for vote in the manner set forth in Section 2 of this Article.
- Sec. 2. Amendments or additions to these bylaws submitted for vote may be adopted at any meeting of the Club, regular or special held not earlier than thirty days after notice to members of the proposal. A two-thirds vote of the members present entitled to vote shall be required for adoption.
- SEC. 3. Changes in proposed amendments or in proposed additions shall be made by the same method as provided for in Section 1 of this Article, except that by unanimous consent of those present and entitled to vote at the meeting at which a proposal is submitted for vote textual changes tending to clarify the amendment or addition may be made.
- Sec. 4. By-laws and amendments to by-laws shall take effect immediately upon their adoption.



HOUSE RULES

- 1. The Club House will be open daily from 7:00 A.M. Persons other than those residing in the Club will not be admitted after 2:00 A.M.
- 2. The office of the Club is open from 8:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. on business days and from 11:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. on Sundays and holidays. A member not in arrears may have checks cashed at the office for an amount not exceeding \$25 in one day, provided such checks are presented during business hours by the drawer or endorser thereof. The Treasurer of the Club shall have the power to suspend this privilege whenever, in his opinion, it is abused.
- 3. Gentlemen residing in or within one hundred miles of San Francisco may be entertained in the restaurant and other public rooms as the guests of members, but except with the permission of the Board of Directors a member shall not entertain the same guest more often than once in thirty days. The name and residence of each guest and the name of the member introducing him must be recorded in the guest book in the entrance hall.
- 4. Unless the Board of Directors grants permission, guests may not be entertained on any evening when any scheduled dinner or other entertainment is given in the club.
- 5. As the Club's facilities are intended for the exclusive use, accommodation and enjoyment of the members, none of the facilities shall at any time or in any manner be made available to the general public or to any outside group or organization. Sub-

ject to the House Rules and the following requirements, the Art Gallery, Owl Room, Red Room and the Club's other private dining rooms and the Club's facilities for serving food and beverages, may be engaged by members for the entertainment of guests provided that the member or members are present at and during the stated function. Each such member shall be responsible for all of the charges incurred. Invitations shall be in the name of the member or members. Subscriptions for private parties may not be permitted by any group or organization. Photographs may not be taken at or concerning functions in any of the Club rooms, nor may any information or account of or pertaining to any such function be released or made available for publication, without written permission of the Board of Directors having first been obtained. Paintings may not be removed from the walls or any hanging, exhibit or other article brought into the Club without previous and specific authorization of the House and Restaurant Committee.

- 6. Except when accompanied by a member, nonmembers other than guests holding visitors' cards will be admitted only to the reception room.
- 7. Gentlemen who present acceptable evidence of membership in a Club with which the Bohemian Club exchanges privileges will be accorded the privileges of the Bohemian Club for a period of three months. Upon application to the Board of Directors these privileges may be extended for a further period of not to exceed three months.

- 8. As the sleeping apartments in the Club are primarily intended for the use and accommodation of members who make the Club House their home, the Board of Directors may require a member to relinquish his room if, in the opinion of the Board, he is not complying with the purpose and intent of this rule. If a member, intending to absent himself from San Francisco for a period of more than sixty days, desires to retain his room, he shall make application to the Board of Directors; if such application is not made or is not favorably acted upon, the Board of Directors may call upon the member to relinquish his room.
- 9. Not more than one person may occupy a bedroom, and no transfer or subletting of bedrooms is permitted. Except with the permission of the Board of Directors, none but members or persons having the privileges of membership may occupy rooms. The Secretary, upon the advice of a physician, may order the temporary removal of an occupant who becomes seriously ill; and if the illness shall continue, the Board of Directors may call upon him to relinquish his room.
- 10. Food will be served only in such rooms as the Board of Directors may designate. All food shall be procured from the Club.
- 11. The playing of cards and other games shall be restricted to such rooms as the Board of Directors may designate. The Board has the authority to suppress any game which may cause disharmony in the Club.

- 12. None but members or persons having the privileges of membership may sign cards for refreshments or services. Cash in payment of same will not be accepted from anyone.
- 13. Damage to property of the Club or of its members or guests will be charged to the member or members responsible.
- 14. The seating of members and guests at Club functions shall be arranged by the Club management and, when necessary, in the order that applications are received. In the case of subscription dinners, the price shall be stated in the announcement or in the invitation.
 - 15. Gratuities to Club employees are prohibited.
- 16. Club employees may not be sent out of the Club House on the business of a member or guest.
- 17. A member must not reprimand an employee of the Club. Inattention to duty or discourtesy should be reported to the Manager.
- 18. The Club is not responsible to a member for the loss in any manner whatsoever of property of any kind.
- 19. Except with the written permission of the Board of Directors, property of the Club, such as pictures, photographs, paintings, cartoons, books, manuscripts, newspapers, pamphlets, shall not be taken away from the Club House, mutilated, altered, destroyed, or otherwise disposed of.

- 20. Except with the written permission of the Board of Directors, property of the Club, such as an original cartoon, picture, music or writing, shall not be reproduced or published.
- 21. Subject to regulations established from time to time by the Library Committee and approved by the Board of Directors, members of the Club may withdraw books from the Library, reference works excepted. Current periodicals and similar publications and books placed on a restricted list by the Committee shall not be removed from the rooms in which they are made available.
 - 22. Quiet shall be observed in the library.
- 23. Except with the permission of the Board of Directors, no funds shall be solicited, no advertisements displayed, and no article exposed for sale or sold, within the Club House.
- 24. Except with the permission of the Board of Directors, a member may not use the name or address of the Club for business purposes.
- 25. Except with the written permission of the Board of Directors, Club proceedings and happenings shall not be made available for publication.
- 26. Except with the permission of the Board of Directors, minors under eighteen shall be admitted only to the reception room.
- 27. Dogs and other animals are not permitted in the Club House.

- 28. Guests who reside within one hundred miles of San Francisco may be entertained at any Club entertainment or function at which guests are permitted. The Board of Directors or the Jinks Committee may limit the number so entertained. Special permission may be required if more than two guests are to be present. On other occasions not more than five guests may be entertained whether or not residing within a one hundred mile radius.
- 29. Neither directly nor indirectly, upon his own behalf or upon behalf of others, shall any member or guest, while in or about Club premises, solicit or obtain from any other person, whether member or guest, any autograph, autographed souvenir, or souvenir drawing or inscription of any kind.

GROVE RULES

- 1. As far as applicable, all rules for observance by members in the San Francisco Club House shall be in force in the Grove unless they conflict with the special rules which follow, in which case the latter shall govern.
- 2. Trees, limbs and branches of trees, shrubbery, ferns, roots and stumps are the property of the Club and shall be respected as such.
- 3. Permission of the Captain of the Grove is required for the use of Club properties for private purposes. Similar permission is required for the engagement of Club employees in private work or private service for members.
- 4. Members desiring to engage the Grove Club House shall make application through the office in the San Francisco Club House. Notice sufficient to enable the management to communicate with the Grove Keeper shall be required. A suitable charge will be made. Arrangements for service and supplies may also be made through the San Francisco office. When vacating, members shall leave the premises in orderly condition. Other members and guests shall not visit the Club House when it is engaged.
- 5. If other applications for immediate occupancy are on file, the term of occupancy of the Grove Club House by one member or one group shall be limited to one week.
- 6. As provided in Article XIX of the By-Laws, ladies accompanied by members may visit the Grove between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.,

except during the period when the Grove is closed to visitors.

- 7. The use in private camps of decorations and emblems shall be subject to the control of the Grove Committee.
- 8. The title to all camp locations and to all permanent improvements thereon shall be vested in the Club at all times. No individual member or group of members shall have at any time or under any circumstances any proprietary interest therein. Their sole right shall be the right of occupancy as defined in Rule 11 of these Rules. The Club shall have no liability or responsibility to the camps or the members thereof of any kind whatsoever by reason of any loss or damage to such permanent improvements. Risk of loss or damage of any kind to said improvements shall be borne by said camp and the members thereof. Neither said camp nor its members nor any insurance carrier of said camp or its members shall have any right of subrogation or claim for damages against the Club by reason of any loss or damages to said improvements, or any part thereof.
- 9. Members desiring to obtain a location for a private camp shall make written application to the Grove Committee. The names of the members who intend to occupy the camp shall be stated in the application.
- 10. As soon as a private camp is organized its members shall select one of their number as camp captain and subject to the approval of the Grove Committee shall adopt a distinguishing name.

- 11. The right of occupancy of any location shall be subject to the following:
 - a) Each captain shall designate in writing on or before May 1st of each year all members of his camp and such designation shall continue until written notice of any change or changes therein is made to the Grove Committee.
 - b) All members so designated shall have the right subject to these rules and the By-Laws of the Club, to occupy said camp.
 - c) Should all members so designated die, the right of occupancy shall be automatically revoked.
 - d) No member shall have the sole right to two locations for a period in excess of two consecutive years.
 - e) When a location is not used for two consecutive years the right to that location may be revoked by the Grove Committee.
- 12. All dealings of the camp with the Club shall be through the camp's captain. He shall be billed for all Club charges, and primarily held responsible for the payment thereof.

All members of the camp at all times shall be jointly and severally bound for the payment of such charges.

If, however, by August 20th, following the Midsummer Encampment, the camp's captain shall file with the Club office a written request to do so, the Club will include in the bills rendered on September 1st to the members of that camp such portion of the charges due the Club as may be designated to be collected from each respective camp member. If the camp captain files such a request with respect to charges incurred at some other time of the year, he shall do so prior to the end of the month in which the charges accrue. The Club, however, assumes no responsibility for such division by the camp's captain.

In accordance with Article XVII, Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the By-Laws, if on September 21st neither the camp's captain nor its members collectively shall have paid in full all charges incurred during the Midsummer Encampment, the indebtedness of the camp shall become delinquent, and each one of its members shall be charged forthwith with the whole sum then owing by the camp, but only the camp's captain shall be posted therefor on September 21st. The Club office will on or immediately after September 21st notify each member of the delinquent camp of the fact that the entire indebtedness of the camp, the amount being stated in the notice, has been charged against him and if such charges shall not have been paid by October 21st each member of the camp shall then be posted with the whole sum then owing by the camp. If such charges shall have been incurred at some other time of the year and remain unpaid, the camp and each member thereof shall be deemed to be delinquent as of the 21st day of the month following that in which the charges accrued, but only the camp's captain shall be posted therefor on the 21st day of the first month in which the charges shall thus become delinquent. The Club office will immediately

after so charging the amount as to which the camp is delinquent against each of the members, notify each member of the delinquent camp of the fact that the entire indebtedness of the camp, the amount being stated in the notice, has been charged against him and if such charges shall not have been paid by the 21st day of the month following that in which the charges became delinquent each member of the camp shall then be posted with the whole sum then owing by the camp. In either event, payment of the camp's whole indebtedness by any member or members thereof shall release the others in so far as the Club is concerned. Should the Club receive in the aggregate from the camp's members more than the whole sum due, the excess will be returned to the member or members concerned.

- 13. All private camp construction, alterations, or repairs, as well as the installation or change of such fixed equipment as stoves, heaters, plumbing, and lighting apparatus, shall be undertaken by the Grove Keeper only upon the issuance by the San Francisco office of a work order. Written request for all such work, accompanied by plans and specifications, in duplicate, shall be made by the camp's captain not later than April 15th prior to the opening of the Midsummer Encampment. Except for ordinary repairs not involving alterations or additions, each work order shall be approved by the Grove Committee.
- 14. Requests for tents or furniture shall be made on or before July 1st of each year.

- 15. The Grove Committee has established a building code and an electrical code pertaining to the construction, alteration and electrification of private camps. A copy of these codes is available for inspection at the office of the Club.
- 16. The Grove Committee reserves the right to make emergency repairs to any camp structures and to charge the camp therefor.
- 17. During the Midsummer Encampment all supplies for private camps shall be purchased from the Club.
- 18. The Grove Committee shall have jurisdiction over all employees in private camps. Employees shall wear such insignia as may be prescribed by the Committee.
- 19. The permission of the Grove Committee is necessary to the possession or use of pianos, organs or other musical instruments. Between the hours of 1:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M., musical instruments shall not be played. Radios, phonographs, television sets and recording devices shall not be permitted in the Grove during the Midsummer Encampment.
- 20. During the Midsummer Encampment members shall sign the register when arriving at or departing from the Grove. Failure to sign the register at the time of departure shall subject a member to a continuation of the *per diem* charge for meals.
- 21. During the Midsummer Encampment a per diem charge for meals shall be levied upon all members and guests while in the Grove.

- 22. A member or guest who conducts himself in a manner unbecoming a gentleman may be expelled from the Grove by order of the Captain of the Grove or, in his absence, by any member of the Camp Committee.
- 23. Except by permission of the Grove Committee, saddle horses, automobiles, or other vehicles shall not be admitted to the Grove. Firearms may be brought into the Grove only for use in the trap-shooting tournament. Fireworks shall be used only under the direction of the Grove and Jinks Committees.
 - 24. Dogs are not allowed in the Grove.
- 25. The Grove swimming pool and both sides of the river adjacent to it are reserved throughout the year for the exclusive use of members and all gentlemen who are guests of members. Ladies and minors shall not be invited to visit the pool, nor permitted its use for swimming, boating or any other purpose whatsoever.
- 26. Minors under eighteen years of age shall not be admitted to the Grove at any time except as follows: The minor children of a member, when accompanied by a member, will be admitted during the period commencing October 1st of any year to and including April 30th of the succeeding year. Any member taking children into the Grove shall be deemed to have accepted entire responsibility and liability for them. Minors must be accompanied by a member at all times while in the Grove.

- 27. Still cameras may be used in the Grove, but during the Encampment no photographs shall be taken at the swimming pool, the Grove Stage, or of any Club activity or entertainment. Any use of moving-picture cameras is prohibited.
- 28. The Board of Directors shall establish a Stage Committee, consisting of three members appointed annually, one of whom shall be the duly appointed representative of the Board of Directors on the Grove Committee, and one shall be a member of the Grove Committee recommended by that Committee, and one shall be a member of the Jinks Committee recommended by that Committee.

It shall be the duty of the Stage Committee to direct the preservation, maintenance and repair of all areas in the Grove utilized for organized entertainment under the direction of the Jinks Committee, including the Grove Stage, Field Circle, Campfire Circle and the Owl Shrine.

No work shall be done in those areas except with the previous approval of the Stage Committee, which, subject to established budgetary procedures, shall have authority to incur such expense as may be necessary to perform such work. The Board of Directors shall provide the funds necessary to pay the cost of same.

29. Neither directly nor indirectly, upon his own behalf or upon behalf of others, shall any member or guest, during any Grove Encampment, solicit or obtain from any other person attending such En-

campment, whether member or guest, any autograph, autographed souvenir, or souvenir drawing or inscription of any kind.

30. All inside fireplaces and all outside fireplaces constructed on or adjacent to a wooden platform shall be equipped with a suitable screen which must be placed in front of the fireplace whenever it is left unattended.
