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CONSTITUTION

Templar Lodge, No.17,

I. O. O. F.

PREAMBLE.

For the purpose of effecting uniformity in the administration of the privileges, honors and benefits of Odd Fellowship within this jurisdiction, the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of the State of California ordains the following Constitution of Subordinate Lodges under its jurisdiction:

ARTICLE I.

SECTION 1. This Lodge shall consist of at least *1 five members, including one qualified to preside at its meetings, to be hailed and entitled TEMPLAR LODGE, No. 17, of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, of California, holding a legal and unreclaimed Charter, granted or sanctioned by the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of the State of California. It cannot voluntarily surrender its Charter, or dissolve, so long as five Third Degree brothers in good standing object thereto.

ARTICLE II.

OF MEMBERSHIP.

SECTION 1. All candidates for initiation must be

free white males, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards; of sound health; of good moral character and industrious habits, having some known respectable means of support, and believe in the existence of a Supreme Being, the Creator and Preserver of the Universe, and be proposed in the Lodge nearest his residence, except that Lodge grant permission for his joining another Lodge; provided, that application for membership may be made to any Lodge nearest the residence of the applicant, in the same county or district. A person may be admitted to any Lodge in the city or village in which he resides; but all candidates for initiation must reside in this jurisdiction, except such candidates as may apply from other States or Territories where there is no Grand Lodge or District Deputy Grand Sire located.

SEC. 2. All candidates for membership by deposit of card or certificates of dismissal, or as Ancient Odd Fellows, whose cards or certificates of dismissal have been granted more than twelve months, shall deposit their cards or certificates with their proposition, or furnish satisfactory evidence that such card or certificate has been lost.

SEC. 3. No suspended or expelled member of the Order can be admitted to membership in this Lodge except on a dismissal certificate, or on being reinstated and receiving a withdrawal card from the Lodge which suspended or expelled him, or from the Grand Secretary, as prescribed by law.

SEC. 4. An Odd Fellow who has been regularly

initiated into the Order, and has retained membership therein for at least five consecutive years, and who at the time of making application for reinstatement or membership shall be over fifty years of ago, may be admitted to membership in this Lodge as a non-beneficial member, upon such terms as the By-Laws may prescribe, by presenting a petition, as required under Section 1, Article III, for proposals for membership by initiation, which shall be disposed of according to said section.

SEC. 5. When an application for membership 6 is received from a person residing nearer to another Lodge than the one to which the application is made, the Lodge receiving such application shall communicate the fact to the Lodge nearest the residence of such applicant, and shall inquire whether such person is a fit and proper person to be admitted into our Order, and, if in the same county or district, shall also ask the consent of such Lodge to receive and act upon such application; and it shall take no further action upon such application until an answer is received to such communication. The Lodge receiving such communication shall appoint a committee of three to investigate the character, standing and health of the petitioner, in the same manner as if the application was made directly to such Lodge. Such committee shall report at the next regular meeting of the Lodge, and a certified copy of the report, together with a certified copy of the minutes showing the action of the Lodge upon the request for

consent to receive and act upon the application (if such consent was necessary), shall be forthwith forwarded to the Lodge in which such application is filed, and said last-named Lodge may then proceed upon such application as in other cases, except that, if it be a case where the consent of the other Lodge is necessary, and that consent be refused, the petitioner's money (if any has been paid) shall be returned, and no further action shall be had in the premises.

ARTICLE III.

OF PROPOSITIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP.

SECTION 1. The name of a person offered for membership, with the age, residence and occupation, must be proposed by a member, in writing, signed by the applicant, with the names of two persons as references attached, and entered upon the record, and forthwith be referred to a committee of three members for investigation, who shall report at the next succeeding regular meeting (unless extraordinary circumstances prevent), when the candidate may be balloted for with (ball) ballots, and if less than three black balls appear, the candidate shall be declared elected; but if three or more appear, he shall be declared rejected,

SEC. 2. No reconsideration of an unfavorable ballot can be had unless all the brothers who may east black balls against an applicant for membership voluntarily make a motion for a reconsider. ation of the ballot; provided, such reconsideration

be had within four regular meeting nights next succeeding such rejection; and in such case the vote on reconsideration shall be taken by ball ballots, and if the balls cast be in favor of it, the reconsideration shall be had; whereupon, the application shall lie over till the succeeding meeting, when another ballot shall be had with ball ballots, and if the same be unanimously in favor of the applicant, he shall thereby be elected; but if one or more black balls appear in either ballot, the applicant shall be rejected; and in no case shall a reconsideration be had except upon a voluntary motion of all those who cast black balls; and never more than one motion for a reconsideration in the same case shall be allowed. A favorable balloting can be reconsidered at any meeting prior to the admission of the candidate, provided a majority of the members present agree thereto.

SEC. 3. When a candidate for initiation has been rejected, notice thereof shall be sent, without delay, to the Grand Secretary, and to all the Lodges in the county and district, and he cannot be proposed again in any Lodge for the space of one year after such rejection. All other applications for membership may be renewed at any time.

SEC. 4. No proposition can be withdrawn after being referred to a committee, unless by consent 10 of two-thirds of the members present at a regular meeting, and before the report of the committee has been read to the Lodge.

- SEC. 5. If any person shall gain admittance to any Lodge upon a petition containing any false representations, he shall be expelled.
- SEC. 6. In case the name of any member of the Order, shall at any time appear-upon memorial duly presented by him-not to be his correct name, the Lodge may, upon motion duly made therefor, order such name changed upon the records of the Lodge to his true name; provided a motion therefor shall be submitted in writing at least two weeks prior to action thereon; and provided, further, that two-thirds of the members present at the meeting of the Lodge consent thereto, and the Secretary shall report such action to the Grand Secretary, who shall report the same to all the Lodges in the jurisdiction.

ARTICLE IV.

OF FEES, DUES AND BENEFITS.

SECTION 1. The fees of this Lodge shall not be less than ten dollars for initiation, five dollars for each degree, five dollars for admission by card, and eight dollars for an Ancient Odd Fellow. The dues of this Lodge shall not be less than twelve cents per week. In addition to the foregoing, the Lodge may provide by its By-Laws, for a Widow's, Orphan's and Education Fund and Funeral Tax, and for extraordinary assessments for Lodge purposes.)

SEC. 2. Every third degree member, qualified as required by the By-Laws, shall, in case of being disabled by sickness or bodily accident from following his usual occupation, or otherwise from earning a livelihood, be entitled to and may receive such weekly benefits as may be fixed by law, from the funds of the Lodge, which in no case shall be less than four dollars per week; provided, that members who have not received the third degree, shall, if sick or disabled as aforesaid, and are otherwise qualified, receive not less than one dollar per week. All such benefits shall commence within six months from the date of admission to membership. Benefits are rights personal to the member, his family and dependant relatives, and are not payable to the legal representatives of a member's estate. When a member of unsound mind is entitled to benefits, and has no family nor dependant relatives, is cared for and supported at public expense, his Lodge shall, from time to time, appropriate and apply, on account of his benefits, such sums as may ameliorate or better his condition, to be a credit on any final accounting for benefits.

SEC. 3. In case of the death of a member, there shall be allowed from the Lodge not less than 15 thirty dollars to defray the expenses of the burial, to be paid by the N. G. on account of the funeral; provided, the brother be buried by the Order, or by the family of the deceased. In the absence of competent relations the N. G. shall take charge of the funeral, and render an account of the disbursements.

- 16 SEC. 4. The funeral and sick benefits shall be regulated by the By-Laws of the Lodge, and all orders drawn for the above benefits shall be by vote of the Lodge.
- SEC. 5. If a Lodge refuses or neglects to grant sick benefits to a brother, he may, at any time within four weeks thereafter, demand in writing that the Lodge appoint a committee to investigate the matter, whereupon the Lodge shall appoint a committee of five to hear the evidence and report the facts and their conclusions to the Lodge. Such committee shall, without unnecessary delay, summons or notify the brother of the time and place of their meeting and investigate the case. They shall keep full minutes of the evidence and their proceedings, and report the same to the Lodge. with their conclusions. If a witness be a member of the Order, he shall give his testimony on the honor of an Odd Fellow. If he is not a member, then on oath or affirmation, and the proceedings must state that such obligation was administered. The obligation may be administered by any member of the committee. No testimony shall be taken without notice or opportunity for crossexamination by the opposing party. The brother has the affirmation of the issue. The report of the committee must be submitted and acted upon by the Lodge without unnecessary delay. The Lodge may change, modity, sustain or reject the report, or refer the same back to the same or another committee. An appeal from the action of the

Lodge may be taken by the brother at any time within two weeks thereafter, to the Grand Lodge, on questions of law or fact, or both.

ARTICLE V.

OF DEGREES!

Section 1. Application for election to either of the three subordinate degrees may be made immediately after having received the preceding one, and shall be accompanied with the amount required therefor, and presented to the Lodge under the proper head, when the Lodge shall ballot upon the applications, and if not more than two black balls be cast, he shall be declared elected; and if the Lodge does not confer the degrees upon its own members, a certificate shall be given the applicant, addressed to a Degree Lodge, or officer authorized to confer degrees, showing that he is a member of this Lodge, and has been authorized to receive them.

SEC. 2. Not more than one degree shall be granted to or conferred upon a candidate at any one meeting, except by dispensation. If the degree be refused a brother, no application shall be again received from him within three months.

ARTICLE VI.

SECTION 1. The elective officers of this Lodge shall consist of a Noble Grand, Vice Grand, Secretary, and Treasurer, who shall serve a regular term each, and the Lodge may elect a Permanent Secre-

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tary, for the same time or for one year, to take charge of the accounts between the Lodge and its members.

- 21 Sec. 2. The appointed officers shall consist of a Warden, Conductor, O. G., I. G., R. S. to N. G., L. S. to N. G., R. S. to V. G., L. S. to V. G., and R. and L. S. S., who shall each serve a regular term, and the Lodge may also appoint a Chaplain for a regular term.
- Sec. 3. No member shall be installed as Noble Grand unless he has served a term as Vice Grand, or the last of a term to fill a vacancy; nor as Vice Grand, unless he has served twenty-six weeks in an inferior office, other than Permanent Secretary and Chaplain; that service in office, whether elective or appointed, is qualifying in any other Lodge as well as in this Lodge, providing a brother has a certificate to that effect, under seal of a Lodge in good standing; provided, that any member of the Degree of Truth may be elected if all qualified brothers refuse to serve, and a dispensation being granted by the Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master, or Deputy of the District, previous to the election.
- 23 SEC. 4. All elective officers, Warden, Outside Guardian and Inside Guardian, shall be clear of all pecuniary charges on the books, and have attained the Degree of Truth previous to installation.
- 24 Sec. 5. Nominations for elective officers shall be made only on the two meetings immediately

preceding that of a regular election, except when the nominees for an office all decline.

SEC. 6. Officers shall be elected four weeks 25 prior to the last regular meeting in each term, and be installed at the first regular meeting in the new term; provided, the installing officer be present; if absent, the Lodge may, by vote, defer it for one week, or call a special meeting for the purpose, at the request of the District Deputy Grand Master.

SEC. 7. Any officer absenting himself from the Lodge for three successive meetings, except in case of sickness, or any officer for misconduct or neglect as such, may be removed by a vote of two-thirds of the members voting at the next meeting after a resolution therefor has been offered in the Lodge.

SEC. 8. Vacancies in any elective office may be filled by the Lodge, by nomination and election, at the next regular meeting after nominating; and until so filled, the Noble Grand shall appoint a member to the office, pro tem.

SEC. 9. The duties of the various officers shall 28 be as laid down in the charges of office, and as specified by this Constitution and By-Laws of the Lodge.

SEC. 10. The Noble Grand, or officer acting as such, shall appoint the majority, and the Vice 29 Grand, or officer acting as such, the minority of all committees on candidates or charges.

SEC. 11. The Lodge, at any regular meeting, within two months previous to the second Tuesday

in May, of each year, shall elect one representative to the Grand Lodge for its members of fifty or under; also one representative for every fifty members over and above said first number of fifty. and one for every fraction exceeding thirty members in good standing, as shown by its report on the 31st day of December of the previous year. The date of such election having been fixed by vote of the Lodge at least one week prior thereto.

SEC. 12. No member holding an office relating to the management or disbursement of Lodge funds shall be eligible to any other office of similar character in the same Lodge during the term of office to which he was first elected.

ARTICLE VII.

OF PENALTIES AND TRIALS.

SECTION 1-Clause 1. Any member neglecting or refusing to make payment of his dues or demands against him to the Lodge, according to its By-Laws, for the space of eleven months, shall be notified by the Lodge in writing, of the state of his account; if his account still remains unsettled, the fact of his dues and demands against him being so in arrears and unpaid shall be announced in open Lodge at the last two regular meetings previous to the time he would be twelve months in arrears. and if his account still remains unsettled, he shall, when he is twelve months in arrears, be suspended from membership and so declared by the Noble Grand; provided, that no person shall cease to be a

member under this section while charges are pending against him, and provided, that a member may pay a sufficient portion of the amount due to avoid suspension.

Clause 2. Any member suspended from mem- 33 bership for non-payment of dues may be reinstated in the Lodge from which he was suspended within one year thereafter, by paying the amount of one year's dues and by receiving a vote of two-thirds of the members present-a motion to that effect having been laid over one week; but after one year he may be reinstated upon the payment of the fee charged for an initiate of the same age, as provided by the By-Laws, or such lesser sums as may be fixed by the By-Laws of the Lodge to which such application is made; provided, such sum be not less than the amount of one year's dues of said Lodge; and he shall petition the Lodge, in writing, to be reinstated, which shall be disposed of, in all respects, as provided for in Article III, Section 1, for petitions for membership by initiation.

Clause 3. A member suspended from membership for non-payment of dues, and who makes application for reinstatement and for a withdrawal card for the purpose of uniting with another Lodge in this jurisdiction, may be reinstated and granted a final card at any time within five years from the date of suspension, upon the payment of one year's dues and the usual price of a card.

Clause 4. A member after being suspended in 35

this jurisdiction for non-payment of dues for the space of five years, wishing to join a Lodge in this jurisdiction, shall be entitled to receive, and the Lodge shall grant him, upon proper application, a dismissal certificate, upon the receipt of one dollar.

Clause 5. A member suspended from membership in this jurisdiction for non-payment of dues, wishing to regain membership in another jurisdiction, shall, upon proper application, be entitled to receive from the Lodge from which he was so suspended a dismissal certificate, upon the payment to said Lodge of one dollar.

7 Clause 6. In all cases, when a member has been suspended for non-payment of dues, and his Lodge has refused to reinstate him, he shall, upon proper application, be entitled to receive, and the Lodge shall grant a dismissal certificate, upon the receipt therefor of one dollar.

18 Clause 7. Dismissal certificates may be received from the holders thereof, on application for membership in Subordinate Lodges, in the same manner and with the same effect as withdrawal cards; and applications made on such certificates shall be received and acted on in like manner as upon withdrawal cards. But the holders of such certificates shall in no case be allowed to visit thereon.

39 Clause 8. The certificates named in this section shall be only those provided by the Grand Secretary of the Sovereign Grand Lodge.

SEC. 2. Any member who shall violate any of the principles of the Order, or offend against the

Constitution, By-Laws, or Rules of Order of this Lodge, shall be fined, reprimanded, suspended or expelled, as the By-Laws may direct or the Lodge determine.

Sec. 3. Every member shall be entitled to a fair trial for any offense involving reprimand, suspension or expulsion. No member shall be put upon trial unless charges duly specifying the offense, so as fully to apprise him of the nature thereof, and to enable him to prepare for his defense, shall be submitted to the Lodge in writing, and signed by a member of a Lodge within this jurisdiction, and a copy thereof, under seal of the Lodge, be served upon him.

SEC. 4. Such charges shall be referred to a 42 committee of five members. Such committee shall, without unnecessary delay, summon the parties and try the case. They shall keep full minutes of the evidence and their of proceedings, and report the same to the Lodge, with their verdict. If a witness be a member of the Order, he shall give his evidence on the honor of an Odd Fellow; if he be not a member, then on oath or affirmation, and the proceedings must state that such obligation or oath was administered. No testimony shall be taken without notice, or opportunity for cross-examination by the opposing party. Upon the report being made, notice thereof shall forthwith be given, by the Secretary, to the party against whom the verdict is rendered, and he shall have two weeks in which to file his

exceptions. If no exceptions are filed within two weeks, the Lodge shall proceed to pronounce judgment upon the verdict, and affix the penalty. An appeal from the judgment of the Lodge may be taken, at any time within two weeks thereafter, to the Grand Lodge; and if no such appeal is taken, the judgment of the Lodge is final. When a bill of exceptions to the report of the committee is filed, as above provided, the Lodge may determine upon its merits, and either sustain the report of the committee, or refer the same back to the same or another committee, or grant a new trial. If the Lodge deems the exceptions not well taken, it shall proceed to pronounce its judgment and affix the penalty.

SEC. 5. If the accused refuse or neglect to stand trial when duly summoned, the committee shall report him guilty of contempt of the Lodge, which report shall be conclusive, and the punishment

shall be expulsion.

SEC. 6. If a specific penalty for an offense be provided in the Constitution or By-Laws, the Noble Grand shall enforce it. If none be so provided, the Lodge shall decide by paper ballot whether the penalty shall be expulsion, suspension, or reprimand and fine. During the ballot the accused brother shall withdraw from the Lodge-room. If upon the ballot it shall appear that two-thirds of the ballots are east for expulsion, such shall be the penalty; if two-thirds of the ballots are east for suspension, suspension shall be the penalty, and

the Lodge shall proceed to fix the duration of such suspension. If neither expulsion nor suspension is determined as the penalty, as above provided, then the penalty shall either be reprimand, fine, or both; if fine is determined upon, then the Lodge shall fix the amount, not exceeding ten dollars; if reprimand is decided upon, then the accused shall be reprimanded in open Lodge by the acting Noble Grand. No ballot held under this section shall be reconsidered. All fines imposed under this section shall be charged to his account, and considered, in determining his standing in the Lodge, as dues; and when the fine thus imposed, added to his dues, brings him under the penalty of Section 1 of this Article, he shall be notified, and allowed the usual time to make payment. In all cases, if he ceases to be a member, upon reinstatement he shall pay the whole amount of fines and dues.

SEC. 7. When a member shall be subject to the penalty of reprimand, he shall be summoned to attend at some regular meeting, to be fixed by the Noble Grand, to be reprimanded from the chair of the Noble Grand; and until he so attend and be reprimanded, he shall be suspended from all benefits and privileges of membership.

SEC. 8. Notice of all suspensions, expulsions, rejections and reinstatements, and of brothers who have ceased to be members in accordance with Section 1 of this Article, shall forthwith be forwarded to every Lodge in the county, and to the

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Subordinate Encampment of which the Lodge shall have been notified of such brother having become a member; and also to the Grand Secretary, who shall, at the end of each quarter, forward the same to all the Lodges in the State, and also to the Grand Scribe of the Grand Encampment of California.

SEC. 9. An expelled member can be reinstated only after a proposition, reference and election by ballot, as in the case of a newly proposed member. A brother suspended for any cause, may be reinstated on the removal of the cause, or the expiration of the term for which he was suspended, without action of the Lodge, and the Noble Grand shall declare in open Lodge his being reinstated.

SEC. 10. Any member intending to appeal from the action of the Lodge, either in a decision of law, or where charges have been preferred, shall file with the Secretary a notice of his appeal and the grounds thereof; upon which the Secretary shall forthwith send the notice or a true copy of the same, together with a certified copy of all charges, reports, evidence, and proceedings of the Lodge relating to the case, to the District Deputy Grand Master.

ARTICLE VIII.

OF FUNDS AND PROPERTY.

49 Section 1. The funds and property of this Lodge shall be held exclusively as a Trust Fund, to be devoted to no other purpose than the chari-

table uses of the I. O. O. F., and the expenditures legitimately made for Lodge purposes, and the advancement of the interests of the Lodge or Order. The funds may be invested from time to time as the Lodge shall direct, but no part thereof, or of the Lodge property, or of the proceeds of any sale of such property, shall ever be divided among the members; and in case of a surrender or forfeiture of the Lodge Charter, all the funds and property of the Lodge, of whatsoever kind, shall be immediately surrendered and delivered up to the Grand Lodge of this jurisdiction, or to its officers or agents properly authorized to receive them.

ARTICLE IX.

OF OFFENSES.

Section 1. No member of this Lodge shall be concerned in organizing or visiting any illegal, spurious, expelled, extinct, or suspended Lodge of Odd Fellows; nor receive or put any motion from the chair of the Noble Grand, unless he be a present or past Noble Grand or Vice Grand, except that the R. S. to the Noble Grand, when occupying the chair of the Noble Grand temporarily, may entertain a motion, put the question, and declare the result.

SEC. 2. This Lodge shall not have a public procession unless to attend the funeral of a member 51 or have any public celebration of any kind, or get up any ball or public amusement in the name of the Order, or admit to membership any member

of an expelled or extinct Lodge, or reinstate an expelled or suspended member of this Lodge, without permission of the Grand Master.)

SEC. 3. No member of this Lodge shall exhibit, or in any way use, for business purposes, or upon his business card or sign, any emblem of the Order, or any name by which this Order or any of its branches are known. And no member of this Lodge shall become or continue a member or officer of any association or corporation using such emblem or name for business purposes. Any member violating any of the provisions of this section, shall, upon conviction thereof, be suspended for not less than one year, or expelled, as the Lodge may determine. The provisions of this section shall not apply to Odd Fellows' Library, Hall, Cemetery, or Mutual Aid Associations, nor to corporations or associations now existing which are bona fide in process of dissolution, and which shall in good faith prosecute such dissolution to completion within a reasonable time.

ARTICLE X.

OF TERMS AND RETURNS.

SECTION 1. All terms shall commence on the first day of January and July in each year, and end on the day on which the succeeding one commences.

SEC. 2. The officers for the term about expiring 54 shall prepare and deliver to the officers who shall install their successors, the result of the elections,

and a report of the work of the term, including the names of those admitted, whether by Initiation, by Card, as an Ancient Odd Fellow, or by Dismissal Certificate, together with their age, nativity, occupation, and rank; also, those suspended and expelled, and the cause thereof, those reinstated and deceased, the number of certificates for degrees granted, the whole number in membership, and amount of receipts, accompanied by whatever amount may be due to the Grand Lodge.

SEC. 3. In addition to the above, the officers for the term expiring on the first meeting in January, shall annually make to the Grand Lodge a full return of the members of the Lodge (except such as are more than one year in arrears, or have been expelled), ranked according to the degrees attained, and a statement of the number of members relieved in the past year; the number of widowed families relieved; the number of members buried: the number of sisters buried; the amount of money applied to each of these purposes; the amount paid for the education of orphans: the amount of money in the Treasury; amount of Widows' and Orphans' Fund; amount and nature of investments; amount paid for charity, and amount paid for current expenses.

SEC. 4. Should this Lodge fail to make any of 56 its returns, as required by the two preceding sections, for one year, it shall thereby forfeit its charter and become extinct; and it shall be the duty of the Grand Master or District Deputy Grand

Master to withhold the A.T. P. W. and the semiannual P. W. until such returns are made, and the amount due the Grand Lodge paid. And it shall be the duty of the last installed officers to transmit or surrender to the Grand Master or his Deputy, the charter, books, papers, furniture and funds of the Lodge.

ARTICLE XI.

(OF CARDS.)

57 Section 1. Withdrawal Cards may be granted to members who are clear of the books, according to law, by a majority vote, by ballot, of the members present when application is made. Should the Lodge refuse to grant the card, the applicant, on tendering a written resignation of membership and paying all dues, shall be entitled to receive from the Secretary a certificate, under seal of the Lodge, to that effect; and such certificate shall be sufficient evidence of good standing at the time of such resignation.

SEC. 2. Visiting Cards shall be applied for in open Lodge, and the dues must be paid up to the time for which the Card is to be granted.

ARTICLE XII.

59 SECTION 1. When any doubt arises of the true meaning of any part of these Articles, it shall be determined by the Grand Lodge.

SEC. 2. These Articles, or any part thereof, 60 shall not be altered, amended, suspended, or annulled, except on motion made in the Grand Lodge, at a regular session.

ARTICLE XIII.

OF BY-LAWS.

SECTION 1. This Lodge may make, alter or rescind such By-Laws, Rules and Resolutions, from time to time, as may be deemed expedient; provided, that they do not in any wise contravene this Constitution, or the Constitution, By-Laws, or Regulations of the Grand Lodge of the State of California, or of the United States.

SEC. 2. The By-Laws of this Lodge shall be in force from the time of their approval by the Committee on Laws of Subordinates, subject to the approval of the Grand Lodge, and the manuscript copy of such By-Laws shall, immediately after their adoption by the Lodge, and before being printed, be transmitted to the Grand Secretary, to be submitted to the Committee on Laws of Subordinates for their approval.

BY-LAWS

- OF -

TEMPLAR LODGE, No. 17, I. O. O. F.

ADOPTED JANUARY, 1854

Revised and Amended August 1st, 1882.

ARTICLE I.

MEETINGS.

Section 1. The regular meetings of this Lodge, for the transaction of general business, shall be on Wednesday evening of each week. Special meetings may be called by the N. G., either at his discretion, or at the written request of five third degree members in good standing, or by a vote of the Lodge; and in either case the members must be notified by the Secretary, or by publication in one or more newspapers. No business shall be transacted at special meetings other than that for which such meetings may be called.

(SEC. 2. The hour of meeting shall be at eight o'clock.)

SEC. 3. At all meetings five third degree members, including one qualified to preside, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

BY-LAWS.

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ARTICLE II.

The N. G. shall preside at all meetings, shall 66 preserve order and decorum, and may enforce the same by a fine of not less than three, nor more than ten dollars; but his decisions on all questions shall be subject to appeal. He shall strictly enforce the provisions of the Constitution and By-Laws, see that all officers of the Lodge and members of committees perform their respective duties, as enjoined by the usages of the Order and by the Constitution and By-Laws, and enforce all fines and penalties imposed by the Constitution and By-Laws or by a vote of the Lodge, appoint all committees (unless otherwise directed), except on candidates and charges, of which he shall appoint the majority. On the night of his installation he shall appoint, subject to the approval of the Lodge, the following standing committees, viz; Finance, Relief and Room Committees. He shall give the casting vote on all questions before the Lodge, except in the election of officers, when he shall be entitled to vote; inspect and announce the result of all ballotings, or other voting, have charge of the Charter, which he must always have in the Lodge; sign all drafts upon the Treasurer for such sums as may have been ordered by the Lodge, and perform ail other duties appertaining to his office. He shall not make nor second any motion or resolution, nor take part in any debate while in the

chair. Previous to closing the Lodge, he shall ascertain from the Permanent Secretary the amount of the receipts of the evening, and from the Treasurer if he has received the same.

ARTICLE III. (DUTIES OF THE V. G.)

The V. G. shall assist the N. G. in presiding over the Lodge; appoint his own Supporters, and the minority of all committees on investigation and charges; have especial charge of the door, and in the absence of the N. G. preside in his stead, and perform all the duties required by the laws and usages of the Order, and by the Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE IV.

(DUTIES OF THE RECORDING SECRETARY)

The R. Secretary shall keep correct minutes of all proceedings; fill up all certificates granted by the Lodge; write and issue all communications, summonses and notices required; notify all candidates of their election; and attest all drafts for money ordered to be paid at a regular meeting. He shall endorse upon all petitions for membership the name of the applicant and committee of investigation to whom referred, and forthwith notify each member of said committee, by a printed or written notice, of their appointment; such notice to contain the name of the applicant and of the brother recommending him, and the names of the references and of the investigating committee. He

alone shall have, safely keep and use (when ordered) the Seal of the Lodge. He shall have the authority to give, without the vote of the Lodge, provided the brother be clear of the books and otherwise qualified, the required certificate to enable a brother to join an Encampment. He shall, at the end of the term, make out for the Grand Lodge a full report of the work of the Lodge during the term, and shall enter it upon the minutes. He shall enter the name, age, occupation and residence of all candidates upon the minutes, stating whether they joined by initiation, deposit of card, or as Ancient Odd Fellows. He shall enter a brief statement of the contents of all communications, petitions and memorials upon the records, and shall enter all communications from the Grand Lodge and reports of Finance and Special Committees in full upon the records. He shall perform such other duties as are required of him by the Lodge and the usage of the Order, and shall deliver to his successor all books, papers, and other property appertaining to his office. He shall receive as compensation for his services, whatever sum the Lodge shall from time to time determine.

ARTICLE V.

DUTIES OF THE PERMANENT SECRETARY.

The Permanent Secretary shall be elected annually, at the regular election for officers held four weeks prior to the last regular meeting in June. He shall have a regular set of books, in which he

shall keep just and true accounts between the Lodge and its members. He shall keep account of all stocks, properties, investments and funds of the Lodge, which shall at all times be open to the inspection of the Finance Committee. He shall also act as secretary of the Board of Trustees of the Lodge, whenever requested by them so to do. He shall receive all moneys due the Lodge, and pay the same over to the Treasurer at the close of each meeting, taking his receipt therefor. He shall, at the commencement of his term of office, notify every member, who is in arrears, of the amount due from him to the Lodge. He shall, at the last meeting of every term, report the whole amount of receipts for initiation, degrees, fines, regular dues, or from any other source, and also the amount due the Lodge, and from whom, with a full exhibit of all the funds of the Lodge. He shall keep a list of the members elected to degrees, with the date of election and name of degree. He shall fill up all cards, and endorse all cards of visitors, and at the close of each term, shall assist the Recording Secretary in making up the regular returns for the Grand Lodge. He shall have prepared, on the night of election for officers, a list of all brothers entitled to vote. He shall receive as compensation for such services, the sum of three hundred dollars per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first meeting night of each term of the Lodge. He shall, previous to his installation, execute a bond, payable to the trustees of the Lodge, in the sum of five hundred (500) dollars, with two sureties, for the faithful performance of his duties; which bond, when approved by the Lodge, shall be entered in full upon the records.

ARTICLE VI.

DUTIES OF THE TREASURER.

70 The Treasurer shall, prior to his installation, execute to the Trustees of this Lodge a bond in the penal sum of two thousand (2,000) dollars, or such sum as the Lodge shall, from time to time, require, with two good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by the Lodge, for the faithful performance of his duties. The bond of the Treasurer, when approved, shall be entered in full upon the records. He shall receive all moneys of the Lodge, and keep a correct account of all sums received or paid out. He shall pay all orders drawn on him by the N. G., voted by the Lodge, and attested by the R. Secretary, under Seal of the Lodge, and on the day appointed for him to visit the sick, shall pay to the sick brother such benefits as may be due and voted to him by the Lodge. He shall, whenever requested by the N. G., give a statement, in writing, of the aggregate amount of funds on hand; and whenever requested by the N. G., or five members, make a report to the Lodge, showing the amount of all receipts and expenditures, and balance on hand. He shall deliver to his successor in office all the books, papers, funds, and other property belonging to the Lodge.

ARTICLE VII. (DUTIES OF THE JUNIOR P. G.

It shall be the duty of the Junior P. G. to attend and act in the capacity of P. G., and to perform all other duties appertaining to his office.

ARTICLE VIII.

The Warden, assisted by the O.G., shall have charge of the regalia and property of the Lodge, and shall report to the N.G. any injury done to the same. They shall place the regalia for the use of the officers and members, at the opening of the Lodge, and at the close, carefully collect and replace it, and shall see that the Lodge-room and its ante-chambers are in proper order. The Warden shall canvass all votes on motions and resolutions, when required so to do. He shall be the messenger of the Lodge, during its meetings, and perform such other duties as may be required by the Lodge.

ARTICLE IX. DUTIES OF THE O. G.)

The O. G., in addition to the duties of his office, shall (under the direction of the Warden) carefully place and replace the regalia, clean and light the room, and perform such other labor as is necessary to keep the room in proper order for the meetings of the Lodge.

ARTICLE X. DUTIES OF THE TRUSTEES.)

Three Trustees shall be elected by ballot, at the regular election of officers held four weeks prior

to the last regular meeting in June, and hold office for one year. It shall be their duty to draw from the Treasurer, from time to time, (in drafts drawn in regular form) such sums of money as the Lodge shall direct, and place the same at interest, taking as security, a lien on real estate, at least double the value of the amount loaned, or such an amount of stocks as shall be deemed amply sufficient to secure the debt, or to invest the same in real estate or stocks (mining stocks excepted); to collect the interest and rents monthly, and pay the same to the Lodge; to call in the loans or sue the sureties whenever the Lodge may require them so to do. The evidence of every debt shall be deposited in some fire-proof sa'e in this city, and shall be exhibited in open Lodge, at each regular meeting next following the election for officers, or when the N. G. or five Third Degree members call for the same. Previous to entering on the discharge of their duties, the Trustees shall give a joint and several bond, payable to the Noble Grand, Vice Grand and Junior Past Grand of this Lodge, with three securities, to be approved by the Lodge, in the sum of five thousand dollars, or such sum as shall, from time to time be required, for the faithful performance of their duties; and this bond shall be entered in full upon the records. Should any orphans or children of a member of this Lodge be left in poverty, without a guardian, it shall be the duty of the Trustees to endeavor to place them in a situation where they may precure a livelihood, and at

the same time be preserved from vice. They shall, from time to time, make inquiries into their situations and report to the Lodge. Should the widow of a member of this Lodge, who, at the time of his death, was entitled to benefits, be left in indigent circumstances, it shall be the duty of the Trustees to make inquiries into her situation, and report to the Lodge what assistance she may need. Either or all of the Trustees may, for non-performance of duty, or improper conduct, be removed from office, if two-thirds of all the members present vote in favor of such removal; provided, that no removal can take place, unless a resolution to that effect shall have been offered and laid over for one week. and a copy of said resolution shall have been served upon said Trustees, unless they shall have been personally present in the Lodge-room and cognizant of the action of the Lodge. When a Trustee is removed, he shall deliver to the N. G. all property in his possession belonging to the Lodge.

ARTICLE XI. DUTIES OF VISITING COMMITTEE.

The Visiting Committee shall consist of the N. G., V. G., and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall visit on Thursday; the Vice Grand on Sunday, and the Noble Grand on Wednesday, of each week. *Provided*, that nothing in this section shall be construed as relieving the N. G. from his obligation to visit all cases of sickness reported to him, as soon as possible, so as to ascertain whether there is any pressing necessity requiring attention.

Which visit of inquiry shall not be delayed longer than one day from the time that notice is given. The Visiting Committee, so constituted, shall have charge of and visit regularly all cases of sickness of brothers belonging to this Lodge and residing within the limits of the city of San Francisco. Provided, that the Lodge may any time, when it shall see fit, refer the case of any brother to a special committee; and when so referred, the Visiting Committee shall be relieved of all care of the case until the special committee shall have reported thereon, and the case again placed in their charge.

ARTICLE XII.

NURSES FOR THE SICK.

The N. G. may, when it becomes necessary, employ a nurse to attend upon a sick member, at an expense to the Lodge not to exceed (except in cases of contagious diseases) three dollars per diem; and the N. G. shall report at each regular meeting of the Lodge the number of nurses employed and the amount so charged against the Lodge.

ARTICLE XIII.

DUTIES OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE.

The Finance Committee shall consist of three 77 Third Degree members. It shall be their duty to examine all claims against the Lodge, and all accounts which may be referred to them, and to report thereon, in writing, over their own proper signature; also, to inspect and audit the accounts of the Permanent Secretary, Treasurer, Trustees,

and all other officers or committees, who may be charged with the receipts or expenditures of the funds of the Lodge, and to report, in writing, on the same at the first regular meeting in each term, or whenever required by the Lodge.

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ARTICLE XIV.

(DUTIES OF THE RELIEF COMMITTEE.)

The Relief Committee shall consist of two members, one of whom shall be the N. G. and the other the V. G., or a Third Degree member, to be governed by the laws of the General Relief Committee, when approved by this Lodge. If the relief be pecuniary, it shall not exceed the amount of which the brother is entitled in his own Lodge.

ARTICLE XV.

REPORTS.

Reports of committees shall be made in writing, 79 and signed by a majority thereof.

ARTICLE XVI.

TERMS OF ADMISSION.

All persons admitted as members of this Lodge shall accompany their application with the requisite fee, viz:

For Initiation, if not exceeding 30 years of

For Deposit of Card, if not exceeding 30 years of age......\$25 00 And two dollars for each additional year up to the age of 50; and five dollars for each additional year after 50 up to the age of 60, and for each additional year after 60 the further sum of 10 00 For admission as an Ancient Odd Fellow, if not exceeding 30 years of age 25 00 And two dollars for each additional year up to the age of 50; and five dollars for each additional year after the age of 50 up to the age of 60; and for each additional year after the age of 60, the further sum of..... 10 00 ARTICLE XVII.

DUES.

Every member shall pay into the General Fund 81 seven dollars semi-annually; and no member owing over thirteen weeks' dues shall be entitled to vote for officers.

ARTICLE XVIII. DEGREES.

No degree shall be granted to any member who is in arrears for dues, or against whom there are fines or assessments unpaid, or charges undetermined. (Members shall pay for the First Degree, six dollars; for the Second Degree, nine dollars; and for the Third Degree, ten dollars. If not more than two black balls be deposited, a certificate shall be given to the applicant, under seal of the Lodge, in conformity with Article V, Section

2, of the Constitution; but if the applicant be rejected, no application shall again be entertained from the same member for three months from the time of his rejection.)

ARTICLE XIX. MEMBERSHIP.

Section 1. All persons admitted as members must be of industrious habits, possessed of some 83 known and honorable means of support, free from all infirmities which may prevent them from gaining a livelihood for themselves or families, and otherwise qualified in accordance with Article II of the Constitution. All applications for membership must be accompanied by a certificate of a regular physician, who shall be a member of the Order, to the effect that the applicant is in sound health, and by a recommendation of a member of this Lodge, in good standing, together with not less than two references, and with the amount of the fee required therefor, in accordance with Article XVI of these By-Laws; but if an applicant be rejected, the fee shall be returned to him. Should he be elected, and not appear for initiation within eight weeks thereafter, the fee deposited by him shall be returned, and he shall not be admitted; but he may present a new petition, which must take the usual course. No candidate shall be initiated on the evening of his election, without a motion, which must receive the affirmative votes of two-thirds of the members present. Every person, upon being admitted a member of this Lodge, shall sign the

Constitution and By-Laws, thereby pledging himself to support, maintain and abide by the same, and to pay promptly all demands against him as soon as they shall become due. He shall also inform the Permanent Secretary of his place of residence, and should he change it, he shall immediately give notice to the Permanent Secretary of

in debate, or vote, on the night of his initiation. ARTICLE XX.

such change. He shall not be entitled to take part

BALLOTS AND ELECTIONS.

SECTION 1. When ballots are taken, the ballot-box shall be placed upon the pedestal in front, in full view of the N. G. The members shall advance singly and deposit their ballots, which shall be duly inspected by the N. G. and his Supporters, and the result declared to the Lodge.

SEC. 2. At elections for officers, the Warden shall (in conjunction with two tellers, appointed by the N. G.) receive the votes cast in the ballot-box. (Blank ballots and ballots for any brother not regularly nominated, shall be counted as blanks). A majority of all the ballots cast shall be necessary to elect. They shall canvass all the ballots, and declare the result to the N. G., by whom it shall be announced to the Lodge. If, on the second ballot, no candidate shall have received a majority of all the votes cast, a third ballot shall be had between the two highest candidates on the list.

ARTICLE XXI.

BENEFITS.

SECTION 1. A member, not disqualified to receive benefits, who, by sickness or accident, may be rendered incapable of earning a livelihood, shall be entitled to, and may receive from the funds of the Lodge, three dollars per week, if he be an initiatory or First Degree member; five dollars per week, if he has attained only the Second Degree; or ten dollars per week, if he has attained the Third Degree, during such sickness or inability, except he be absent from the city, in which case he must comply with the requisitions of the second Section of this Article. His benefits shall commence at the time of being reported to the Lodge, or to any member of the Visiting Committee. If his sickness or inability proceed from intemperance or immoral conduct, or be occasioned by any constitutional disease, or bodily infirmity, which existed at the time of his admission, and which was concealed intentionally from the Lodge, he shall not be entitled to receive any benefits. And no brother shall be entitled to benefits until he shall have been a member six months. When the Visiting Committee are in doubt as to the proper status of a sick member under the provision of this section, they shall have power to employ one or more physicians, to determine such status, and the fee for such examinations shall not exceed five dollars to each physician for every brother so examined.

SEC. 2. To entitle a member taken sick at a point remote from this Lodge to benefits, he must send or cause to be sent to the N. G., a true statemeut of his case, complaint and circumstances, and the cause and origin of his illness, attested by the N. G. of some Lodge near him; but if there be no Lodge near him, then the same must be stated by the certificate of a physician, a magistrate, an American Consul, or a master of a vessel.

SEC. 3. The widow of a brother, who, at the time of his death, was entitled to benefits, if disabled by sickness or accident from earning a livelihood, shall receive from the funds of the Lodge such sums as circumstances may require and the Lodge may determine.

SEC. 4. No member who owes six months dues shall be entitled to receive benefits by reason of any payments he may make during his sickness or bodily infirmity.

SEC. 5. On the death of a brother entitled to benefits, the sum of one hundred dollars shall be appropriated and paid by the N. G. towards defraying his funeral expenses; and no further expense shall be incurred, except such as may be necessary for the accommodation of the Lodge in attending the funeral. On the death of the wife of a brother entitled to benefits, he shall receive fifty dollars, to assist him in defraying the funeral expenses. On the death of the widow of a brother, who was at the time of his death entitled to benefits, the sum of thirty-five dollars shall be appropriated, to assist

in defraying her funeral expenses, unless otherwise ordered by the Lodge. If no funeral expenses are incurred by the death of a brother, wife, or widow. no appropriation shall be made from the funds of this Lodge. -

ARTICLE XXII.

(CARDS.)

A Withdrawal Card may be granted to a brother 91 upon the payment of two dollars; provided, he is clear of the books on the date of application. Withdrawal Cards must be balloted for in conformity to Article XI, Section 1, of the Constitution. A Visiting Card may be granted to a brother at a charge of fifty cents; provided, his dues are paid to the end of the time for which the card may be granted. Visiting or Withdrawal Cards can be granted only in open Lodge. Dismissal Certificates may be granted in conformity with Article VII of the Constitution.

> ARTICLE XXIII. FINES AND PENALTIES.

SECTION 1. A member owing six months dues 99 shall not be entitled to receive the pecuniary benefiis of this Lodge. A member owing over six months dues shall not be entitled to receive benefits until one month after payment is made; and no suspended or expelled member shall be entitled to receive benefits until the expiration of six months from the time of his reinstatement.

SEC. 2. Every member who shall neglect or re. 93 fuse to pay his dues or demands to the Lodge for

the space of eleven months, shall be notified thereof by the P. Secretary; and if, after one month, his account remains unsettled, he shall be suspended from membership. Any member so suspended may be reinstated as provided in Clause 2, Section 1, Article VII of the Constitution.

- 94 SEC. 3. Every member of a committee who may fail to perform his duty, shall be fined not less than two nor more than ten dollars for each neglect.
- SEC. 4. If any member shall disregard the authority of the N. G., by persisting in using improper language, or shall be guilty of improper conduct, either in or out of the Lodge, or shall knowingly propose any unworthy candidate for membership, or shall be guilty of habitual drunkenness, or any infamous offenses against the laws of the land, or feigning sickness, with a view to abuse the benevolent intentions of the Order, or shall divulge (except to a member of the Order) any of the proceedings of this or of any Lodge, required by him to be kept secret, or the name of a brother who opposed the admission of a candidate, or shall reveal any of the secrets of the Order, shall be reprimanded, fined, suspended or expelled, at the discretion of the Lodge.
- 96 SEC. 5. Every officer who shall be absent at the opening of the Lodge, at a regular or special meeting, shall be fined as follows: The Noble Grand and other elective officers, two dollars and fifty cents; Warden and other appointed officers, fifty cents. Absentees shall render their excuses in

open Lodge. Absence from the city, sickness of self or family, attendance on the sick, and on Lodge or official duties, shall be good excuses for non-attendance; but without any of these excuses, the fine shall be enforced. An officer or member having been-fined, may appeal to the Lodge to have his fine remitted; and if the appeal be sustained by two-thirds of all the members present, the fine shall be remitted.

SEC. 6. All fines and assessments remaining 97 unpaid on the first regular meeting of each term, shall be considered as dues, in determining a member's right to receive benefits.

ARTICLE XXIV.

(FUNDS.)

Benefits due, relief granted, or the current expenses of the Lodge, may be paid at any regular 98 meeting, by a majority vote of the members present; but the stocks, investments, securities, and funds of this Lodge shall not be otherwise disposed of, or transferred, in whole or in part, unless by a resolution to that effect, offered at a regular meeting, which shall be acted upon at the next regular meeting; when, if two-thirds of all the members present concur therein, it shall be adopted; provided, that no motion to loan the funds to private individuals or members of the Lodge, shall at any time be put to the Lodge. There shall not be paid out of the funds of this Lodge a sum to exceed fifty dollars, by donation, unless a motion to that ffect shall have been laid over one week, and shall

receive the affirmative votes of two-thirds of the members present.

ARTICLE XXV.

99 Section 1. On the death of a brother of this Lodge, it shall be the duty of the N. G. and other athorized officers of the Lodge, to immediately make preparation for the funeral, and as soon as possible, after the death of the brother is made known, summon every brother of the Lodge to attend the funeral, by advertising a notice thereof in as many of the daily papers of this city as the exigency of the case will admit, unless otherwise requested by the nearest relatives of the deceased.

Sec. 2. On the first regular meeting following the burial of any deceased member, the N. G. shall declare levied a funeral assessment of fifty cents upon each and every member of the Lodge, and shall direct the Permanent Secretary to charge the same to the account of each member. Provided, if no expense is incurred by the Lodge for such funeral, the assessment of fifty cents shall not be levied. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to enter upon the minutes of the funeral the names of all members attending, and the Permanent Secretary shall credit the account of each member so recorded with the amount of fifty cents.

101 SEC. 3. At each special meeting for the burial of brothers of this Lodge, the Recording Secretary shall furnish to every member attending a card bearing the name of the deceased brother, and that

of the member to whom it is given; and at the conclusion of the ceremonies at the grave the members shall hand such cards to the N. G., who shall return them to the Recording Secretary. From the cards thus received, the Permanent Secretary shall enter up the credits provided in the By-Laws, and no other credits for attendance at the funeral shall be made. Any Brother leaving the Lodge or procession before the close of the funeral ceremonies, shall not be entitled to the credit of fifty cents provided for in Section 2 of this Article.

ARTICLE XXVI.

MISCELLANEOUS.

SECTION 1. No part of these By-Laws shall be 102 repealed, altered or amended unless a proposition in writing be made, at least one regular meeting previous to the time of its being acted upon, when, if two-thirds of all the members present yote in favor of such proposition, it shall be adopted.

(Sec. 2.) These By-Laws shall be in force from 103 the time of their approval by the Committee on Laws of Subordinates, subject to the approval of the Grand Lodge; and all By-Laws, Resolutions, or Rules of Order, that conflict with these By-Laws, are hereby rescinded.

RULES OF ORDER

OF

Templar Lodge, No.17,

I. O. O. F.

Rule 1. When the N. G. takes the chair, the officers and brothers shall take their respective stations, and at the sound of the gavel there shall be general silence, and if there be a Chaplain, then join with him in prayer.

RULE 2. The N. G. shall preserve order and decorum, and pronounce the decision of the Lodge on all subjects; he shall decide questions of order without debate, subject to an appeal to the Lodge by any member, on which appeal no brother shall speak but once, when the question before the Lodge shall be: "Shall the decision of the N. G. stand as the judgment of the Lodge"

RULE 3. No question shall be stated unless moved and seconded, nor be open for consideration until stated by the N. G. (and when a question is before the Lodge, no motion shall be received, unless: 1st, To lay on the table; 2d, The previous question; 3d, To postpone to a particular time; 4th, To postpone indefinitely; 5th, To re-commit; 6th, To refer; 7th, To amend. And they shall have preference in the order in which they are here arranged, and the first two shall be decided without debate.)

RULE 4. No motion shall be made by one brother while another is speaking; and no motion shall be made or seconded without rising and addressing the N. G.

Rule 5. Any brother making a motion, shall reduce the same to writing at the request of the N. G., or any brother, in which case it shall not be before the Lodge until it be so written, and read from the Secretary's desk.

Rule 6. No resolution shall be offered to the Lodge, except in writing, and signed by the brother offering the same.

Rule 7. No brother shall be interrupted while speaking, except it be to call him to order, or for the purpose of explanation.

Rule 8. If a brother, while speaking, be called to order, he shall take his seat until the question of order is determined by the N. G.; when, if permitted, he may proceed.

Rule 9. No brother shall speak without rising in his place, respectfully addressing the N. G. by his title, and having his name announced by the Chair. Brothers shall confine themselves to the question under debate, and avoid all personalities and indecorous or sarcastic language.

Rule 10. If two or more brothers rise to speak at the same time, the N. G. shall decide which is entitled to the floor; and no brother shall speak more than once upon the same subject or question, until all who wish to speak shall have had an opportunity to do so; nor more than twice without

permission from the N. G. Each brother, while speaking, shall designate the brother spoken of by his proper rank or title, according to his standing in the Order.

(RULE 11.) When a blank is to be filled, the question shall be first taken on the highest sum or number, and the longest time proposed.

(RULE 12. Any brother may call for a division of a question when the sense will admit of it. And any five brothers calling for the yeas and nays, they shall be ordered by the N. G., and recorded on the minutes.)

RULE 13. Before putting the question, the N. G. shall ask: "Is the Lodge ready for the question?" If no brother rises to speak, he shall rise and put it; and after he has risen to put the question, no brother shall be permitted to speak upon it. While the N. G. is addressing the Lodge or putting the question, silence shall be observed in the Lodgeroom.

Rule 14. After any question, except one of indefinite postponement, has been decided, any two brothers who voted in the majority may, at the same time, or next regular meeting, move for a reconsideration thereof; but no discussion of the main question shall be allowed unless reconsidered.

Rule 15. When a brother has been called to order for the manifestation of temper or improper feeling, he shall not be allowed to speak again in the Lodge at that meeting, unless by special permission of the Lodge.

Rule 16. No brother shall vote on any question in which he is immediately interested.

Rule !7. Every brother present (not in arrears) shall vote, unless for special reasons, except in the case specified in the preceding Rule; provided, this Rule does not interfere with the provisions of the By-Laws regarding new members, etc.

Rule 18. In speaking on points of order, the N. G. shall have precedence; but he cannot speak on any other subject, except to state facts within his own knowledge, without previously vacating his chair and filling it by a qualified brother.

Rule 19. No brother shall retire without leave of the N. G. And during opening, closing, initiation, recess, or taking the yeas and nays, no brother shall be permitted to retire.

Rule 20. On the call of three members for the previous question, the N. G. shall put the question in this form: "Shall the main question be now put?" If the motion be carried, the vote shall be first upon all pending amendments, after which upon the main question. If decided in the negative, the question shall lay over until the next regular meeting.

Rule 21. Any brother may excuse himself from serving on a committee, if, at the time of his appointment he is a member of two other committees. No brother can be appointed on a committee when absent from the Lodge.

Rule 22. The first brother named on a committee shall act as chairman until another is chosen

be the committee. The mover of a resolution, referred to a special committee, is usually the first named thereon.

Rule 23. No committee can be finally discharged until all the debts contracted by it shall have been paid.

Rule 24. A motion to close is always in order after the regular business is gone through, which motion shall be decided without debate.

Rule 25. These Rules of Order may be altered or amended after one week's notice, in writing, has been given, specifying the proposed alteration or amendment; but any one of them, or any clause thereof, may be suspended for the time being, by a vote of two-thirds of all present. And any parliamentary question, not covered by these Rules of Order, shall be decided by Cushing's Manual.
