"The Grand Lodge of California, F.&A.M., is conducting a state-wide campaign to raise funds for building a California Masonic Memorial Temple.

"This Memorial Temple, to be erected on a magnificent view-site on San Francisco's Nob Hill, at California and Taylor Streets, will be a beacon to Masonry, not only in the Pacific area, but throughout the world.

"Three stories in height, with ample dining and parking facilities, and a 3,200-seat auditorium whose every seat will enjoy an unobstructed view of the working space, the Temple will be a Memorial to all California Masons who gave their lives in any of America's wars.

"M. W. Frank Harwell, Jr., Grand Master of Masons in California, has officially decreed 1954 'The Year of the Temple.' All California Masons are asked to 'Become an Operative Mason for One Day' and to give at least one day's pay to the building of the Memorial Temple.

"Deferred payment pledges, payable over a two-year period, are being signed by many of the brethren.

"Contributions from Scottish Rite members, and from brethren visiting in California will be welcome.

MORALS AND DOGMA, RING AND PATENT

A copy of Morals and Dogma and the ring of the 14° will be presented to each candidate attaining the 14°. Each applicant attaining the Thirty-second degree receives from the Supreme Council an English Patent, for identification purposes.

New members will receive their copies as soon as the necessary preparations can be made for placing them on the mailing list.
