LIBRARIES.

The State Library at Carson City contains 4,721 volumes, of which 2,209 are of law, and 2,512 of a miscellaneous character. The increase in 1866 was 1,432 volumes. The rapidity with which this library has accumulated, and the number and importance of the works contained therein, reflect great credit upon the State.
