goes to Montuna. Great Salt Lake City is a city of orchards, and from the "bench" on the mountains the houses seem, in the summer, to be peeping out of a forest. The most plentiful fruits are apricots, apples, and struwberries. Stock raising is also an important branch of the farming interests. Southern Utah will be a land of vineyards and cotton. Cotton has already been raised in considerable quantities. In manufactures, of cotton particularly, a good beginning has been made. A large quantity of cotton yarn is already spun from cotton grown in the Territory. There are two large cotton factories, one of them belonging to Brigham Young, and there are several smaller ones. The whole Mormon community has long been, and is still, clothed in cloth and linesy of homespun, and almost every house is a manufactory."—
