**ORMSBY COUNTY.** Boundaries—North by Washoe and Lyon, east by Lyon, south by Douglas, and west by Lake Tahoe (or Bigler). The surface of the county is rough and mountainous, with a soil exceedingly dry and barren, except a few tracts of limited extent, situated in the valleys. Estimated number of acres of arable and grazing land, 5,000. Rich deposits of quartz have been discovered in Ormsby County, but, with the exception of the "Athen's Ledge," but little has been done as yet towards developing them. In September, 1866, there were eight quartz mills, with an aggregate of 175 stamps, crushing ore from the "Comstock Lode," in Storey County. County seat, Carson City.

**ROOP COUNTY.** Boundaries—North by the State of Oregon, east by Humboldt, south by Washoe, west by the State of California. This county is unorganized, but is attached to Washoe for judicial and legislative purposes. Portions of the county furnish fine agricultural lands, and many thousands of acres could be made highly profitable by a proper system of irrigation. The newly discovered mining district of Black Rock, in Humboldt County, is causing the valleys in the southern section to be settled, and another year many work many changes. At present, however, but little attention has been paid to developing its resources, although wherever attempts have been made to cultivate the soil, they have proved highly encouraging and remunerative. In the neighborhood of Pyramid Lake there are fine agricultural and meadow lands, which form part of the "Indian Reservation."
