STEVENS COUNTY. Boundaries—North by British Columbia, east by Idaho Territory, south by Walla Walla and Yakima, and west by Yakima and the Cascade Range. The land embraced within the limits of this county comprises nearly one-half of the area of the Territory. Its surface is generally rough and uneven, but many extensive tracts exist adapted to agricultural purposes, with an abundance of timber for manufacturing purposes. Value of assessed property, \$195,770. Area of the county (including Spokane, not organized) is estimated at 28,900 square miles. County seat, Pinekney City.
