JEFFERSON COUNTY. This is one of the central counties of Montana, situated south of Edgerton County, near the east base of the Rocky Mountains. The prominent features of this county are its fine farming lands, its natural advantages for the raising of stock, and its beautiful and varied scenery. In 1862, mines were discovered, but until recently have never been thoroughly worked. Indications of quartz exist, but slight developments have been made. The county is well watered by the Prickly Pear and other affluents of the Missouri. Assessed value of real and personal property, \$190,628. County seat, Prickly Pear.

MADISON COUNTY. This county is situated in the extreme southern portion of Montana, and is one of the most wealthy and populous. It is especially noted for the extent and richness of its mines, which are annually yielding many millions of dollars. Within the limits of this county is Virginia City, the Territorial Capital, on the north side of Alder Creek. The county is watered by the North Fork of the Jefferson River. There are numerous valuable quartz ledges developed in this county, and the ore taken therefrom affords constant employment to several extensive quartz mills.
