Nanaimo, is situated about 80 miles n of Victoria, and is the only point in the interior of Vancouver Island which has assumed the pretensions of a town. It has a splendid bay opening from the Gulf of Georgia, which is well buoyed, and capable of admitting the largest class man-of-war. It is only 30 miles from Burrard Inlet, which is rapidly coming into prominence for its superior lumber. It is a fine agricultural district; the principal interest, however, is coal; the Vancouver Company Coal Mine being located here.

New Westminster, capital of British Columbia, P O, incorporated by Royal Charter, organized August, 1860, on the Frazer river about 20 miles above the entrance proper, and is the only port of entry in the colony. Its population is estimated at about 600. The magnitude and commercial importance of the Frazer is second only to the Columbia on the north-west coast of America, and at some future time will give an equal importance to New Westminster. The town already contains a number of excellent buildings, wharves, and private residences. A novel feature of New Westminster, recalling many pleasing recollections to strangers, is the splendid peal of eight bells, presented by Miss Burdett Coutts to the Episcopal church. The climate, though severe in winter, is delightful and healthy in summer.
