shall be fined, in any sum not more than five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment, not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and his office shall thereupon become vacant.

SEC. 44. The City Council may require of the City Attorney, as well as of all the officers of trust, a good and sufficient bond, for the faithful discharge of all the duties imposed by law or ordinance, and each and all officers who fail or neglect to perform all the duties imposed upon them, shall be liable upon their official bond, to the city, or to any party aggrieved.

The Mayor elected under this charter shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, execute an official bond payable to the city, in such sum as the Council may direct, for the faithful discharge of his official duties, which bond shall be subject to the approval of the Council, and be deposited with the Clerk. He shall communicate to the Council, semi-annually, or oftener, if necessary, a general statement of the situation and condition of the city, together with such recommendations relative thereto as he may deem expedient; he shall be vigilant and active in causing the ordinances of the city to be executed and enforced, and he shall be the head of the Police, and shall exercise a supervision and control over the conduct of all subordinate officers, and receive and examine into all such complaints as may be preferred against any of them, for violation or neglect of duty, and certify the same to the Council. He shall sign all ordinances and contracts made in behalf of the city, and countersign all licenses and warrants on the Treasury, and have jurisdiction of all violations of the city ordinances, and shall have, within the limits of the city, like jurisdiction as is conferred on Justices of the Peace. He shall have power to administer oaths and affirmations, and shall act as City Attorney until the next election after which he may be appointed City Attorney, by the Council.

Sec. 46. The Treasurer shall receive, and pay out, all moneys belonging to the city, and keep an account of all receipts and expenditures, under such regulations as may be prescribed
