In Alameda township there are two school districts in each of which two teachers are engaged. The schools being divided into Primary and Intermediate.

Number of children in Alameda District, between 5 and

15 years are boys, 67; girls, 55; total, 122. In Encinal District number of boys 51; number of girls, 51; total, 102.

In Brooklyn township there are three districts, in which eight teachers are employed, six in the Brooklyn District and one each in Redwood and Lockwood Districts. A new school house is being erected in the Lockwood School District at a cost of \$2,000. In the Brooklyn District is a school for colored children, under the charge of Miss Mary J. Sanderson (colored), the only school for colored children in the county, and a very successful one; the progress of these colored children in the acquirements of the elements of an education seems to be but little if any less rapid than that made by the superior race. The Brooklyn schools are second only to those of Oakland, in the number of children in attendance and in classification.

In Eden township there are six school districts, employ-

ing eleven teachers.

The Union District (San Leandro) employs four teachers, and during the last year maintained the schools for a term of 44 weeks.

The schools in this township are all prosperous. In 1868 the Laurel (Haywood) and Palmyras Districts were set off from the Eden Vale District, and two new school houses erected, commodious, pleasant and comfortable, including the modern improvements and latest styles of furniture.

Murray township now contains seven districts, three of which were set off from the Livermore District during the

past year.

These districts employ seven teachers. The rapid growth of the eastern portion of this large township, has required these changes and other districts will be required at an early day.

In Oakland township there are five school districts, employing twenty-one teachers. Nearly one-third of the amount paid in the county for teachers' salaries during the past year was paid by the Oakland District, more than onehalf paid for sites, buildings and repairs, and nearly one-half for other expenses for school purposes.

Washington township comprises eleven school districts which employ thirteen teachers, one new district, the Cos-
