The HERALD was started July 3, 1865, by the present Proprietor. It has been well sustained by the community generally, who evidently appreciated the efforts of the publisher to supply an evening publication for the accommodation of the public. As evidence of public favor, the publisher has been compelled to enlarge the paper three times, and it now contains twenty-eight columns.

Although the HERALD is not published in the interest of any political party, it was appointed the "Litigant Paper" for San Joaquin County, on the passage of the Litigant Law, which position it now fills.

Stockton Weekly Gazette.

The GAZETTE is published at the office of the DAILY EVENING HERALD,

The GAZETTE was originally published in connection with the *Daily Gazette*, as a Democratic paper, and was started August 26, 1867, by Miller & Harrison, who disposed of their interest to P. L. Shoaf, who subsequently sold out to D. W. Gelwicks. On the 13th September, 1869, Mr. Gelwicks sold the establishment to Mr. Biven, who continued the publication of the WEEKLY GAZETTE in lieu of the *San Joaquin Herald*. Under the present management, the GAZETTE has been disrobed of its political character, and is published as an independent newspaper.
