Name of city—Alameda.

Slogan or sub-phrase—"The Dahlia City."

Form of government—City Manager and Charter.

Population—1930 census, 35,033; 1933 estimate, 37,000.

Area—10.85 square miles.

Altitude—15 feet.

Assessed valuation—\$34,383,054, with \$1.45 tax.

White population—37,000.

Predominating nationalities in city are American.

Parks number 5 and municipal golf course with 209.33 acres.

City's bonded debt is \$985,822.

Telephones in service—8,650.

Church buildings—17.

Building and construction: Value of building permits, \$780,595.

Hotels: There are 3 hotels and many apartments with transient and permanent accommodations.

City served by Western Pacific, Southern Pacific, Santa Fe railroads.

Amusements: Largest theater or auditorium seats 2,300 people. There are 3 theaters, with a total seating capacity of 5,000 people. Also Neptune Beach Amusement Park.

Hospitals: There are 2 hospitals, with modern service and attendance.

Education: Names of colleges, etc. Number of schools, 13, including 1 high school, 1 parochial and 1 private school. Number of pupils in public schools, 7,700; in private schools, 300. Total number of teachers, 300.

There are approximately 75,000 volumes in the free public library.

City Statistics: Total street mileage, 71.5, with 66.5 miles paved. Miles of gas mains, 50; of sewers, 64.5. Fire department employs 57 men, with following equipment: 3 engines, 2 hose and chemical wagons, 2 hook and ladder trucks, in 4 station houses. Value of fire department with property is \$124,719. Police department has 38 men, with 1 station and 12 pieces of motor equipment.

Post Office receipts: \$95,656.65.
