

..Selborne School for Boys..

This School changed hands in January of last year, and under the able management of the present Principal, Rev. Chas. Hitchcock, B. A., Cambridge, assisted by an efficient staff of resident masters, is rapidly increasing in numbers.

There is a splendidly equipped Gymnasium; out-door games are given every encouragement, the Principal believing that boys interested in healthy recreation will keep out of mischief. A good base-ball team was the result during the first part of the year, and during the latter half a football coach was engaged from Berkeley, and a splendid team put into the field.

Games, however, in no way interfere with work. Long years of experience have confirmed the Principal in his plan of individual instruction and the careful grounding of young boys, and this individual instruction is continued till the pupils graduate.

The course of study is based upon the requirements of the Universities of California, but boys are also prepared for Eastern Colleges. In 1898 two pupils, while still at the school, passed all their entrance examinations for Harvard.

While Selborne is in no sense sectarian, and boys of all denominations are to be found at the school, special attention is paid to moral and religious training.
