Here the northern branch of the Califortu's Pacific, leaves the main line, running moth to Woodland and Grafton. The town is in the center of a large and well developed farming district, and has a large portion of northern Solano tributary to its business interests. Frui ulture in the neighborhood, has become one of the paramount industries, many large orchards being located here. From 30,000 to 35,000 tons of grain are bipped anneally from this youth.
