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The House of HEYNEMANN & Co. was established in 1850 under the style and firm of Heynemann, Pick & Co., and continued under that name until December 31st, 1861, when Mr. Pick (since deceased) retired from the business. Since then the present firm has continued the business of the house under the name of Heynemann & Co., as above. Prominent among their business operations, we would mention that in 1859 this firm erected at Black Point a large Mill for the manufacture of Woolen Goods, being the pioneer mill of the State, and establishing the same under the name of the San Francisco Pioneer Woolen Factory. In October, 1861, the mill was destroyed by fire, when a joint stock company was formed, under whose management the present mill was built. Messrs. Heynemann & Co. are the authorised agents for the sale of the company's fabrics, consisting of Blankets, Woolen Shirts and Underwear, Cloths, &c.
