**WOOLEN MILLS.**—Last but not least in our list of notices of Manufactures, we would make mention of the Pioneer Woollen Factory at 311 California street, and the Mission Woollen Mills at 217 Battery street. The fabrics manufactured at these Mills consist of blankets, woollen underwear, cloths, &c., and are more substantial than those imported from the East. These goods are manufactured solely of California wool, and are now in general wear and use by families, also by the U. S. Forces throughout the Pacific coast.
