## CHURCHES.

Howard Presbyterian Church. Location south side of Mission Street between

Third and Fourth. Pastor, (vacant). The church was organized September, 1850. to supply a portion of the city then destitute of relix-ions privileges, under the auspices of the Rev. S. H. Willey, who continued in the pastorage for twelve years. The building then occupied by the congregation was dedicated June 17th, 1851; was enlarged and repaired in 1864, and in 1867 was sold to the Third Baptist Society. The Rev. H. M. Scudder, D.D., who was for many years a missionary in Judia, was installed by the Presbytery of San Fran-cisco, July 23d, 1865, and prosecuted his work with great success until March, 1871, when he resigned. The number of communicants is about five hundred and fifty.

The present church building was erected in 1866, and dedicated Jannary 6th, 1867. The cost, includ-ing the lot, was about \$65,000. It will seat comfortably nearly one thousand four hundred persons, and is considered in all respects well adapted for the

## Larkin Street Presbyterian Church.

This enterprise was commenced by Rev. J. D. Strong, in the Spring Valley School Honse, in April, 1862. A Union Sabbath School, under the superin-tendence of E. R. Waterman, had previously ex-isted in the ueighborhood for more than two years, but was not formally connected with the church effort was made to erect a house of worship, but failed for want of the requisite funds. During the following summer the effort was revived, and in September, 1863, a Board of Trustees was incorporated, a lot purchased at an expense of \$1,000, plans and specifications prepared by S. H. Williams, and the contract for building the church edifice let to J. W. Daucan. On the fourth of September, 1864, the building was completed and dedicated. This church was organized May 14th, 1865, with fifty-three members. At present it has on its roll the names of about two hundred and fifty, and is rapidly increasing. In the summer of 1865, the con-gregation erected an edifice on Mission Street begregation erected an editice on Mission Street be-tween Fifth and Sixth, where they worshiped nn-til the summer of 1869, when their present handsome house of worship was completed. The new church was formally dedicated to the service of God on Sunday, November 28th, 1869. The building is constructed of wood and ap-proaches a semi-Gothic style of architecture. The

main andience room will seat comfortably about six hundred persons. The pew system has been adopted. although the sittings are always free for strangers. The building, furniture, etc., exclusive of the lot, cost about \$25,000. The Rev. John G. Fackler through whose labors the congregation was gathered, offi-ciated from April, 1866, until the present pastor took charge
