RENO—Reno is located on Truckee river and is quite an important station on the Central Pacific Railroad. Its altitude is about 4,507 feet. From Sacramento it is distant 154 miles, and from Omaha 1,620. It was named in honor of General Reno who was killed in battle at South Mountain. The place numbers about 1,000 inhabitants who are an ambitious and stirring people. There are published two papers, the *Nevada State Journal* and the *Crescent*. Reno is the nearest point on the railroad to Virginia City and will soon be connected with that place, direct by rail, whereas at present travelers are conveyed between these two points by the Opposition Stage Company and Woodruff & Ennor, who dispatch daily coaches. In the neighborhood of the town are large forests of timber and several saw mills. Mining operations are being carried on extensively in gold, silver and copper, the latter predominating. Much of the ground around the town is of a nature fit for cultivation. Within the past year the County Seat of Washoe County has been removed from Washoe City to Reno, giving thereby this place another advantage, which with those of its being a railroad
