APPENDIX.

The Consolidation Act, with the Amendments thereto, January, 1873.

AN ACT

O REPEAL THE SEVERAL CHARTERS OF THE CITY OF SAN FRANCISCO, TO ESTABLISH THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO, AND TO CONSOL-IDATE THE GOVERNMENT THEREOF.—APPROVED, APRIL 19, 1856.

he People of the State of California, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

ARTICLE I.

SECTION 1. The Corporation, or body politic and corporate, now existing and known as the CITY OF SAN FRANCISCO," shall remain and continue to be a body politic and corporate, in ame and in fact, by the name of the "CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO," and by that ame shall have perpetual succession, may sue and defend in all courts and places, and in all latters and proceedings whatever, and may have and may use a common seal, and the same ay alter at pleasure, and may purchase, receive, hold and enjoy real and personal property, ad sell, convey, mortgage and dispose of the same for the common benefit. The boundaries of e City and County of San Francisco shall be as follows : Beginning in the Pacific Ocean, uree miles from shore, and on the line (extended) of the United States Survey, separating townips two and three south (Mount Diablo Meridian), and thence running northerly and parallel ith the shore so as to be three miles therefrom opposite Seal Rock ; thence in the same general rection to a point three miles from shore, and on the northerly side of the entrance to the Bay San Francisco; thence to low-water mark on the northerly side of the said entrance, at a bint opposite Fort Point; thence following said low-water mark to a point due northwest of olden Rock; thence due southeast to a point within three miles of the natural high-water ark on the eastern shore of the Bay of San Francisco; thence in a southerly direction to a pint three miles from said eastern shore, and on the line first named (considered as extending ross said bay); and thence along said first-named line to the place of beginning.* The islands said bay, known as the "Alcatraces and Yerba Buena," and the islands in said ocean known the "Farallones," shall be attached to and form a part of said city and county : provided, wever, that all rights and liabilities of the corporation heretofore and now known as the City of San Francisco," shall survive to, and continue against, the corporations continued by is Act. The district or districts of said city and county, bordering upon the southern line ereof, as heretofore established, shall be extended to the southern line of said city and county, established in this Act.-[Amendment April 18, 1857.]

SEC. 2. The public buildings, lands and property, all rights of property and rights of action, d all moneys, revenues and income, belonging or appertaining either to the corporation of the ity of San Francisco, or to the County of San Francisco, are hereby declared to be vested in, d to appertain to, the said City and County of San Francisco, and the moneys in the treasury said city, and in the treasury of said County of San Francisco, and the moneys in the treasury come from whatsoever source arising, including delinquent taxes upon persons and property pertaining to the said city or to the said county, shall be handed over, paid and received into the treasury of the City and County of San Francisco as a part of the General Fund; or where e said moneys, revenues and income, or any part thereof, have been heretofore and still remain t apart and dedicated by lawful authority to the use of a Special Fund, the necessity and
