In the event of a refusal or neglect to perform the duties of their office of any one nore of said Commissioners, or in the event of a vacancy occurring from any cause, the ard of Supervisors of said city and county, being duly certified thereof by any one or more said Commissioners, shall declare the office of such Commissioner vacant, and shall appoint uitable person to fill such vacancy until the next ensuing general election .- [Amended rch 14, 1870.]

rc. 3. The said Fire Commissioners shall appoint a Clerk, who by virtue of his office shall a member of the Fire Department constituted by this Act, and who shall receive a salary of hundred and thirty dollars per month, but shall not be entitled to any other pay under the visions of this Act. Said Clerk shall also perform the duties of a clerk to the Chief gineer. And the said Fire Commissioners shall be authorized to fit up an office for their use, ich shall be centrally located, the cost of which, together with the rents and necessary staery, shall be paid by the city and county. And said Fire Commissioners, upon their anization, shall immediately have full power, by the vote and concurrence of a majority cost, subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors, to take all the necessary steps and ceedings to prepare the Fire Department constituted by this Act, togo into active operation on first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six. — [First Monday in December, 6, Act April 2, 1866.]

The Fire Department of the City and County of San Francisco shall consist of a ef Engineer, one First Assistant Engineer, one Second Assistant Engineer, one Third As-ant Engineer, one Fourth Assistant Engineer, one Clerk of the Board of Fire Commis-ters and Chief Engineer, who shall give a bond in the sum of ten thousand dollars, h two or more sureties, for the faithful performance of his duties; one Superintendent of im Fire Engines, one Assistant Superintendent of Steam Fire Engines, one Corporation d Keeper, one Corporation Yard Drayman, two Hydrantmen, one Veterinary Surgeon; steam fire engines companies, to consist each of one Foreman, one Engineer, one Drione Fireman and eight Hosemen, one of whom shall act as Assistant Foreman, and one Clerk, which Clerk shall receive five dollars per month extra; three hook and ladder com-ies, to consist each of one Foreman, one Driver, one Tillerman and twelve Hook and der Men, one of whom shall act as Assistant Foreman and one as Clerk, which Clerk I receive five dollars per month strai and six Hosemen, one of whom shall act as Assistant Foreinan and one as Clerk, which Clerk shall receive five dollars per month extra; and ne as Clerk, which Clerk shall receive five dollars per month extra. Each m fire engine company, shall have one steem fire engine, one hose reel, with one thous i feet of hose, and not more than four horses. Each hook and ladder company shall e one truck, with hooks and ladders and necessary appurtenances and two horses. Each 3 company to have one hose reel, with one thousand feet of hose and one horse. But the rd of Fire Commissioners, with the consent of the Board of Supervisors, shall have power to ease or diminish the number of companies as the public safety of the city and county may in r judgment require, such additional companies to have the same number of officers and men hereby allowed to companies of the same class; and they may organize such volunteer comies for outside districts of said city and county as they may see fit : provided, such voler companies shall be subject to the provisions of this Act; but none of the members eof shall receive any salary; and the Board of Supervisors, upon notification by the Board ire Commissioners of any increase of the number of companies, shall purchase the necesr steam engines, apparatus and appurtenances for such additional companies.-[Amendatory

The Chief Engineer and four Assistant Engineers shall be appointed by said Board fire Commissioners, each for the term of two years from and after his appointment, to be ovable at the pleasure of said Board; and all subordinate officers and men shall be apited by said Board of Fire Commissioners, and shall be removable at its pleasure.—[Amendit April 1, 1872.]

The Act of March 30, 1872, authorizes the Board of Supervisors, upon the recommendation of the Board ire Commissioners, to allow a sum not exceeding fifty dollars per month, for three months, to any memof the department disabled in the discharge of his duties.
