monthly, and shall be as follows: Chief Engineer, two hundred and fifty dollars per month First Assistant Engineer, one hundred and forty dollars per month; Second Assistant Engineer, one hundred and forty dollars per month; Second Assistant Engineer, one hundred and forty dollars per month; Fourth Assistant Engineer, one hundred dollars per month; Clerk to th Board of Fire Commissioners and Chief Engineer, one hundred and thirty dollars per month; Superintendent of Steam Fire Engines, one hundred and fifty dollars per month; Assistar Superintendent of Steam Fire Engines, one hundred and fifty dollars per month; Corporatio Yard Keeper, seventy-five dollars per month; Corporation Yard Drayman, seventy-five dollars per month; each Hydrantman, seventy-five dollars per month; Vaterinary Surgeon, sixt dollars per month; each Foreman, forty-five dollars per month; each Engineer, one hundre and forty dollars per month; each Tillerman, seventy-five dollars per month; each Stewar sixty-five dollars per month; each Hose and Hook and Ladderman, thirty-five dollars per month. All the paid members of the Fire Department, except the Foremen, Assistant Formen, Clerks, Hosemen, Hook and Laddermen, and Veterinary Surgeon, shall give their und vided attention to their respective duties; and all the officers and men of the Fire Departmen, shall perform such duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Board of Fire Cormissioners.—[Amendment April 1, 1872.]

SEC. 7. The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco shall have fu power to pass all ordinances, and said Fire Commissioners to adopt rules and regulations, for the government, management, control and discipline of the said Fire Department, as the shall deem expedient for the best interests thereof, and to prescribe the duties of the officers as members thereof; and said Board of Supervisors shall have power to locate all cisterns, hy drants, and engine houses hereafter to be purchased: provided, such ordinances, rules as regulations are not inconsistent with the laws of the State of California, and that such rule and regulations shall be approved by the Board of Supervisors. If the members of the prese Fire Department fail, neglect or refuse to perform their duties in every respect after the passes of this Act, and until the organization of the Paid Department, as in this Act provided, Board of Supervisors are empowered to take possession of all engines, hose, hooks and ladder and other appurtenances belonging to said department, and to pass such ordinances as may loncessary for the protection of property until the organization of the Fire Department, provi

ed for under this Act.

SEC. 8. The Board of Supervisors of said city and county are hereby authorized to appr priate, allow and order paid, annually, out of the General Fund of said city and county, it salaries hereinbefore specified and allowed and salaries at similar rates to the several office and men of any additional companies created as aforesaid; also, the sum of forty thousand delars per annum for running expenses, horse feed, repairs to apparatus, and other expenses said department; also, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars, annually, for it purchase of horses and apparatus; also, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars, annually, in lieu of the amount now allowed by law, for the construction and erection of lydra and cisterns; and the Board of Supervisors shall have power to advertise for proposals at make contracts for the construction of said cisterns and the erection of said hydrants, and the arc hereby empowered to locate the same.—[Amendment April 1, 1872.] The Board of Supervisors of said city and county are hereby authorized and empowered to establish and mainta at the Corporation Yard a workshop, for making repairs and improvements upon the appartus of the Fire Department, such workshop and such repairs and improvements to be und the supervision of the Superintendent of Steam Fire Engines and his assistant; and said Boa of Supervisors shall allow and order paid out of the amount herein appropriated for repairs at apparatus and other expenses of said department, all the expenses of such workshop, repair and improvements: provided, that the Board of Supervisors shall have full power to limit the expenditures under this section to such an amount as they in their discretion, think necessar,—[Supplementary April 1, 1872.]

Sec. 9. The Mayor of said city and county is hereby authorized to sell at private or publisale, from time to time, with the approval of the Board of Supervisors, any or all of the egines, hose carriages, engine houses, lots on which such houses stand, or other property while shall not be required for the use of the department, and to execute, acknowledge, and deliving good and sufficient deeds or bills of sale for the same, paying the proceeds of such sales into the General Fund of said city and county, such proceeds to be appropriated to the purchase of lo

and erection of engine houses thereon, as the same may be required.

SEC. 10. The only engines which shall be purchased by the city and used by the Fire D partment shall be steam fire engines, of the best pattern and manufacture: provided, that it hand fire engines now in possession of the city shall be used in such manner and under au regulations as the Board of Commissioners, with the approval of the Board of Supervisors, shall city, until such steam fire engines shall have been purchased to the number of six.

SEC. 11. Any person who may have been an active fireman in the Fire Department of secity and county for three years and six months immediately preceding the time when this A shall take effect, shall be entitled to enjoy all the privileges and immunities now enjoyed.
