## CONSOLIDATION ACT.

enues within the tracts or districts in said city and county hereinafter described, lying without e corporate limits of the City of San Francisco, as defined in an Act entitled "An Act to corporate the City of San Francisco," passed April fifteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-one, wit:

District, No. 1.-That tract lying east of Potrero Avenue, south of Mission Creek, west of the ter front and north of Precita Creek.

District, No. 2.—That tract west of Potrero Avenue, south of the charter line of eighteen ndred and fifty-one, produced westerly to the westerly line of Douglass Street; casterly of the sterly line of Douglass Street, continued to Figg or Twenty-seventh; northerly of Figg or renty-seventh Street and Precita Creek.

District, No. 3.—That tract west of the charter line of eighteen hundred and fifty-one, easterly Douglass Street, southerly of the northerly boundary of the San Miguel Ranch, and northerly the southerly line of Twenty-second Street, extended to the westerly line of Douglass Street. District, No. 4.—That tract lying southerly of the water front, westerly of Devisadero Street, therly of Geary Street, easterly of Cemetery Avenue and Government Reserve. District, No. 5.—That tract lying westerly of the charter line of eighteen hundred and fifty-

District, No. 5.—That tract lying westerly of the charter line of eighteen hundred and fiftya, northerly of the San Miguel Ranch, easterly of westerly line of West Eighth Street, southy of the Government Reserve and Lone Mountain Cemetery and that part of Geary Street terly of Cemetery Avenue.

inc. 2. For the accomplishment of the purposes set forth in section one of this Act, and providing and placing suitable monuments to perpetuate the work, the said Board of Superors are authorized to appropriate a sum not to exceed twenty thousand dollars. The enditure authorized by this Act, and every item thereof, before it becomes a claim or debt inst said city or county, shall first be allowed and ordered paid by the Board of Supervisors, I audited by the Auditor, when the same shall be paid by the Treasurer out of the General ad of the City and County of San Francisco.

## SUPPLEMENTAL XVII.-An Act to Confer further Powers, etc.-Approved April 1, 1872.

ECTION 1. ## PLEMENTAL XVIII.—An Act to Confer further Powers on the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco.—Approved April 2, 1870.

**ECTION 1.** The Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby authorized and owered, on behalf and in the name of the City and County of San Francisco, to petition the rd of Supervisors of said city and county to order the change of the official grade of any at or streets, where such change may affect any public square or other lot of land belonging aid city and county; and such petition shall have the same effect as if the same were signed *y* in behalf of the owners of any property not belonging to said city and county.\*

## UPPLEMENTAL XIX.—An Act to provide for a Police Contingent Fund.—Approved February 28, 1859.

ECTION 1. The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco shall anilly set apart from the General Fund in the treasury of said city and county, the sum of e thousand six hundred dollars, to constitute a Special Fund, to be called the Police Conent Fund.

cc. 2. The Police Commissioners of the City and County of San Francisco, or a majority iem, are hereby authorized to allow, out of the Police Contingent Fund of said city and ity, any and all orders signed by the Chief of Police of said city and county: *provided*, the aggregate of said orders shall not exceed the sum of three thousand six hundred dollars annum.

c. 3. The Auditor of said city and county is hereby authorized to audit, and the Treasof said city and county to pay, out of the Police Contingent Fund, any and all orders so red by the Police Commissioners, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of three thousand undred dollars per annum.

cc. 4. At the end of each fiscal year, any sum remaining in the Police Contingent Fund, t which no order shall [have] been allowed, shall be returned to the credit of the General d.

The Act of March 13, 1805, provides for the payment of assessments against the property of the Governof the United States in the manner following to wit: The Board of Supervisors of the City and County a Francisco are bereby authorized to allow the Auditor of said city and county to audit, and the Treasto pay, out of the Street Department Fund, all claims not horetofore paid for assessments that have made or that may hereafter be made pursuant to law, against the property of the Government of the d States for street improvements in the said city and county: *provided*, the Government of the United shall by its officers refuses to make such payment.
