upervisors of the said City and County of San Francisco shall, when deemed necessary by iem for the purpose in this section provided, levy an annual tax upon all the taxable property the said City and County of San Francisco, and a sufficient sum or sums shall be raised by ich annual levies to pay the principal of said bonds when the same shall become due. And shall be the duty of the Treasurer of said city and county to set apart annually out of the oneys coming into the treasury to the credit of the House of Correction Fund, raised by said anual tax, a sum sufficient to pay the semi-annual interest on said bonds, and also to provide Sinking Fund sufficient for the redemption of the same at maturity.

PPLEMENTAL XXIV.—An Act to transfer to the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco the Management, Control and Direction of the Affairs of the Industrial School Department of said City and County.—Approved March 23, 1872.

The President of the Board of Managers of the Industrial School of the City ad-County of San Francisco is hereby authorized and directed to grant, convey and deliver the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco all and singular the roperty, both real and personal, now in the possession or under the control of said departent, as created under and by virtue of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California. ntitled "An Act to Establish the Industrial School Department of the City and County of an Francisco," approved April fifteenth, eighteen hundred and fifty-eight, and the Acts supementary thereto and amendatory thereof, and he is hereby authorized and directed to make, cecute and deliver to said City and County of San Francisco, all and singular, such deeds and struments in writing, as the act and deed of said department, as may be necessary to carry ne provisions of this section into effect.

SEC. 2. From and after the passage of this Act, all and singular, the powers and duties now ested in the Board of Managers of said Industrial School, shall be vested in the Board of upervisors of the said City and County of San Francisco. Said Board of Supervisors shall vercise all the duties and possess all the rights now vested in the Board of Managers of the idustrial School Department, and all present indebtedness and liabilities of said Industrial shool Department, and future expenditures and disbursements on account of the same, shall presented, audited and paid in the same manner as is now provided by law for the presentent, auditing and payment of other claims against said City and County of San Francisco: ovided, that the current expenses of such Industrial School shall only be audited and paid to

e extent of four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500) per month.

SEC. 3. The purposes and objects of said Industrial School shall hereafter be the same as e now provided by law for the Industrial School Department of the City and County of San rancisco: provided, that persons who may be convicted of offenses mentioned in section ten the Act entitled "An Act to establish the Industrial School Department of the City and ounty of San Francisco," approved April fifteenth, cighteen hundred and fifty-eight, in punties other than San Francisco, may be committed by the proper authorities of such counties the Industrial School of the City and County of San Francisco, on the approval of the upervisors of the county in which such persons are committed to said Industrial School, upon tyment to the City and County of San Francisco by such counties of the sum of fifteen (15) pllars, gold coin, per month for each month that such persons and each of them shall be mates of said Industrial School.

## ARTICLE VI.

## FINANCE-AND REVENUE.\*

All fines, penalties and forfeitures, imposed for offenses committed within the said ty and county shall be received by the Clerk or Magistrate of the respective Court and paid to the treasury thereof, as a part of the Police Fund; forty per cent of all poll taxes (Amend-See Section 76) collected in said city and county, or any other portion of such poll taxes hich may be hereafter assigned to said city and county by law, shall also be paid and reived into the treasury thereof as a part of the Police Fund. All demands payable out of id fund may, in case there be not sufficient money in the treasury arising from the sources ecified in this section, be paid out of the General Fund of said city and county.

The School Fund of said city and county shall consist of all moneys received from e State School Fund; all moneys arising from taxes upon property which shall be levied ch year for that use by the Board of Supervisors, and which shall in no case exceed the te of thirty-five dollars for each pupil who shall have actually attended school during the eceding year [Act April 1, 1872]; also the proceeds of the poll tax.—[Political Code, Article I, Sec. 3,861.] The General Fund consists of all moneys in the treasury not designated and t apart by law to a specified use, and of the overplus of any Special Fund remaining after e satisfaction of all demands upon it. The Surplus Fund consists of any moneys belonging the General Fund remaining in the treasury after the satisfaction of all demands due and yable which are specified in the first fourteen subdivisions in section ninety-five. The fiscal ar shall be the same as that of the State.
