339 Kearny Street, sell Houses and Lots & OESTERREICHER,

pipes or mains to be laid down in the streets, highways, public squares and parks of said or and county, and to regulate the pressure and amount of water to be kept flowing in and through said pipes and mains at all times, and to fix and determine the fine to be imposed, not excee ing five hundred dollars, for any violation of the provisions of this section, at the suit of the City and County of San Francisco, to be collected in any court of competent jurisdiction; at every day's failure to maintain a proper supply of water to meet the public requirements she be deemed a new offense, and punished accordingly; and all fines collected for a violation the provisions of this Act, and of the orders passed by the Board of Supervisors to carry of its provisions, shall be paid into the City and County Treasury.

Sec. 8. The Water Commissioners shall be allowed no compensation for their services.

This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage; and all Ac

or parts of Acts conflicting with the provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed

Supplemental XXXII.—An Act to Establish a Municipal Court in the City and County of San Francisco.—A proved March 31, 1870.

Section 1. There shall be and hereby is established, within the City and County of & Francisco, a Municipal Court, to be called and known by the name of the Municipal Crimin

Court of the City and County of San Francisco.

SEC. 2. A Judge of said Court shall be elected by the qualified electors of said city an county, at the next special judicial election, to be held in the year eighteen hundred and se enty-one, who shall hold his office for the term of four years from the first day in January ne after his election: provided, that the Governor shall immediately after the passage of this A appoint and commission some suitable person, who has been a resident of said City and Count of San Francisco for the past five years, as a Judge of said Municipal Court, who shall hol such office until his successor is duly elected, in the manner hereinbefore provided, and wh shall qualify according to law. When any vacancy occurs in the office of Judge of said Cour it shall be filled by the Governor, by the appointment of some suitable person for the uner pired term.

SEC. 3. The said Court shall hold its sessions in the City and County of San Francisco, i such central and convenient place as shall be provided for that purpose by the Board of Super

visors of said City and County of San Francisco.

The said Court shall be a Court of Record and shall have a seal, to be devised b the Judge thereof, a description of which shall be entered on the minutes of the Court and file in the office of the Secretary of State. And the said Court shall have the same power as the District Court to regulate its forms of process and proceedings and to make rules for its ow government.

Sec. 5. All writs and process issued out of said Manicipal Court shall be in the form pro scribed for writs and process issued out of the District Court, and shall be executed and returne in like manner; and said Court shall have power to issue all writs of subpena and other process and the same may be served beyond the limits of the City and County of San Francisco, and shall be considered of the same effect as writs and process issued out of the District Courts and obedience to such subpena, when properly issued and served, may be enforced in like manner as obedience to a subpena may be enforced by the District Courts.

An appeal may be taken to the Supreme Court from any judgment or order of th said Municipal Criminal Court in like manner as from an order or judgment of the District an County Courts, and all laws regulating appeals from District and County Courts shall be deeme

applicable to appeals from the said Municipal Criminal Court.

Sec. 7. All laws regulating proceedings in the District Court shall, so far as they are no inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be deemed applicable to the proceedings of the said Municipal Criminal Court; and said Court shall have power to make rules, not inconsistent with

the laws of the State, for its government and the government of its officers.

SEC. 8. The County Clerk of the City and County of San Francisco shall be ex officio Clerl of said Municipal Criminal Court, and he is hereby authorized to appoint one Deputy to act a Court Room Clerk of said Court, who shall receive a salary of one hundred and seventy-fiv dollars per month, and one Deputy to act as Register Clerk of said Court, who shall receive salary of one hundred and fifty dollars per month, and such salaries shall be paid in the same manner as the salaries of the other Deputies of said County Clerk .-- [Amendment February 5 1872.]

SEC. 9. The Sheriff of the City and County of San Francisco shall be the Sheriff of the said Municipal Criminal Court, and shall execute, either in person or by Deputy, such of the process of said Court as may be required to be executed by a Sheriff, and shall be amenable to said Court by proceedings as for contempt on his failure to execute such process. And said Sheriff is hereby authorized to appoint a Deputy, in addition to those now appointed by him who shall act as Bailiff or Deputy Sheriff of said Court, and who shall receive a salary of one hundred and fifty dollars per month, to be paid in the same manner as the salaries of the other deputies of said Sheriff are paid.
