RETAIL TRADE AND SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS

Retail Trade

Retail trade is one of the major activities among the busi-Retail trade is one of the major activities among the business and industry groups in San Francisco, ranking second in number of employees, and third in payroll, Tangible personal property sold at retail through 21,170 outlets in San Francisco during 1963 amounted to \$1,787,800,000; personal service establishments, \$73,460,000; and manufacturing, wholesaling, contracting and miscellaneous outlets, \$646,241,000. Sales of food for offpremise consumption and gasoline are not included in taxable

A market of 4,000,000 people is concentrated in the nine Bay Area counties surrounding San Francisco Bay. Firms located in San Francisco distribute to all northern California's 7,300,000 people, and to the eleven Western States. Employment in retail trade in the metropolitan area averaged 187,000 in 1964, making it one of the largest occupational groups.
