

Intercollegiate Contests.—Two annual debates are held between Stanford and the University of California. The Intercollegiate Debate is held in San Francisco in April of each year, each university being represented by three speakers. In 1894 a silver cup of the value of \$100 was offered by the San Francisco *Examiner*, and becomes the permanent property of the university first winning three debates. Senator Perkins has also offered prizes to the amount of \$200 per annum to be divided among the members of the winning team. The following is the record:

- 1895—U. C. won.
- 1896—U. C. won.
- 1897—Stanford won.

The Carnot medal for individual excellence in public speaking, given by the Baron de Coubertin in honor of the late President Carnot, is competed for annually by three representatives from each university. In 1895 Stanford won, in 1896 and 1897 U. C. won.
