

**BOTANICAL CLUB.**—Composed of students interested in botany. Holds monthly meetings for the presentation of reports, and makes frequent excursions.

**CHEMICAL CLUB.**—Meets every alternate week. Programs consist of papers and discussions of interest to chemistry students.
