Kutztown Patriot Owner Was 67

Kutztown, Pa., Sept. 24 — Charles H. Esser, publisher and owner of the Kutztown Patriot, weekly newspaper at Kutztown, Berks County, and president of the Kutztown Publishing Co., died today at his home, College Hill.

Mr. Esser, who was 67, was graduated in 1909 from the old Keystone State Normal School, now the Kutztown State Teachers College. In 1913 he was graduated from Muhlenberg College.

He was a former president of the Alumni Association of Muhlenberg and was a member of the board of directors of the college. In 1956, he was honored with a degree of doctor of letters by the college.

Mr. Esser held many committee assignments in the Lutheran Ministerium of Pennsylvania and also held board membership of the United Lutheran Church in America.

He was a past president of the Lutheran Laymen's Movement for Stewardship.

Mr. Esser also served several terms on the board of the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia. He was a Mason, and a member of the Philadelphia Graphic Arts Club.
